

For Legg had done something that had never been done before at Tech. He had corralled the picture of a transient pleamen. Translated, that means he had been able to photograph the electrical disturbance resulting from the closing and opening of a circuit breaker. From that moment the story of the modern oscillograph is synonymous with the story of Joseph Willard Legg, E. E. '16.

mirror 17/1000 of an inch wide.

But before Legg began his study, the oscillograph, itself, was a chunsy contrivance weighing almost half a ton. He proved that a compact oscillograph, operated with an incandescent lamp, was practicable; first, with a three-element model (one that will record the action of three phenomena at the same time) weighing about 135 pounds. This was in 1917.

More recently a nine-element oscillograph weighing only 100 pounds has been developed. And, aeme of creative genius, Legg has just produced a baby one-element oscillograph, called the OSISO—which weighs but 7½ pounds! For good measure, Legg designed a holder for load-


