

MINUTES OF THE SENATE FEBRUARY 11, 1924

The Senate met in the Little Theatre Monday, February 11, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of December 17 were read and approved.

The petition of the Men's Student Council that honorary professional fraternities be allowed to give dances during the second semester was referred to the Dean of Men and Dean of Women, with a request that they make a recommendation to the Senate.

Senate approved the petition of the Men's Student Council that they be allowed to have a representative in the Discipline Committee and the University Senate.

President McVey reported that a letter had been received from Professor A. M. Miller, expressing his appreciation of the Christmas greetings sent him by the Senate.

The following recommendations from the College of Arts and Sciences were approved:

- ✓ 3. Psychology 111. Tests of Intelligence. 3 credits.
- ✓ 4. Music 13a and 13b. Sight Reading. 2 credits for semester
To replace Music 1a and 1b
- ✓ 5. Botany 2. Science of Plant Life. Primarily for College of Education Students. 3 credits.
- ✓ 6. Geology 4a and 4b. Mineralogy. 2 credits per semester.
To succeed Geology 4.
- ✓ 7. Geology 105. Independent Work in Geology. 3 credits.
- ✓ 8. Romance Languages 112a and 112b. Spanish Literature of the XIXth C. 3 credits per semester. These courses are to alternate with 104a and b. (Recommended subject to approval of Arts and Sciences faculty)
- ✓ 9. Art 10. Teaching of Art in the Public Schools. 3 credits.
- ✓ 10. Bacteriology 115. Individual Work in Bacteriology. 3 credits.
- ✓ 11. Bacteriology 201a and 201b. Research in Bacteriology. 5 credits per semester. (Subject to approval of Arts and Sciences faculty)

The following recommendations from the College of Agriculture were approved:

Courses in Home Economics to be offered in Summer School, 1924.

- > Home Economics 9. Foods. Lectures and recitations three hours a week, laboratory four hours a week. Three credits.
- > Home Economics 10. Clothing. Lectures three hours a week, laboratory four hours a week. Three credits.
- > Home Economics 11. General Nutrition. Lecture three hours a week, laboratory four hours a week. Three credits.
- > Home Economics 12. Teaching of Health and Nutrition in Public Schools. Lectures five hours a week. Three credits.

- ✓ Home Economics 13. Teaching of Methods of Field Work in Nutrition. Lectures eight hours a week. Three credits.
- ✓ Home Economics 14. Advanced Course in Nutrition and the Community. Three credits.
- ✓ Senior Assembly - required of seniors in the College of Agriculture. 5 credits.

The following recommendations from the College of Education were approved:

- Education 71 - Trade Analysis and Course Planning. 3 credits
- Education 72 - The Teaching of the Trade Subjects - 3 credits
- Education 73 - The Teaching of the Related Subjects - 3 credits
- Education 74 - Vocational Guidance - 3 credits.

MINUTES OF THE SENATE MARCH 10, 1924

The University Senate met in the Little Theatre Monday, March 10, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of February 11 were read and approved.

The Senate approved the request of the Women's Administration Council to be allowed representation on the University Senate and the Women's Discipline Committee. This request had been referred to the Senate from the Council.

Permission was granted the class in Public Speaking to organize a University Oratorical Club.

The report of the Women's Discipline Committee on the rule governing cheating was referred to the Rules Committee.

President McVey read a card of appreciation from Mrs. P. K. Holmes, to the Faculty for their expressions of sympathy in her recent bereavement.

The following recommendation of the College of Arts and Sciences was approved:
