But a trip designed for promoting democracy and reaffirming commitments to involvement in Latin America had undertones of the administration's ongoing support for repressive regimes. His meeting with Gen.

Efrain Rios Montt of Quaternala had to take place in Honduras because Costa Rica did not want Montt in San Jose. Reagan report-






