Efforts to postpone presidency fail

Sworn in: Runner up in SGA election says Robinson/Harralson campaign cheated

April 12, 2001

Tim Robinson and Caroline Harralson took the Stu-dent Government oath of office Wednesday night, despite efforts to quell the swearing-in. Alyshia Ochse, the second runner-up in the election, filed Wednesday for an injunction to stop the swearing-in ceremony.

Ochse and Matthew Johnson, the election board of

Solution and matthew Johnson, the election board of supervision chairman, have also appealed rulings made against claims they filed against Robinson last week.

"For the integrity of this University, I don't want them to be represented by someone who cheated," Ochse said.

But Ochse said she is not appealing because she is a

sore loser. "Can take a loss when it is lost fairly," she said. "I don't think any of this was conducted fairly. It was not equal for Steve, Nic or me."

The invoice does not give individual prices for each item, only a total price of \$489.50.
Klusmeirer said the 125 T-shirts, listed as seconds, were \$2 a piece. That price accounts for \$250 of the budget. He has not responded with prices for the other items on the invoice. The posters and banners were made from material left over from Election 2000, the invoice states. Robinson

said that Klusmeirer did not itemize the invoice because the items were bought as a package.

But Johnson disagrees.

From researching his expenditure form and looking at the price that he has provided from Grand Old Printing, it is not economically feasible to receive the services he has for the price he has recorded," Johnson said. That complaint was the basis of a claim Johnson filed with Brian Hopper, the election investigator. Hopper did not send that claim on to the Election Board of Claims.

Hopper could not be reached for comment, but the Election Board of Claims opinion explained why the other claims were not heard.

Johnson has filed a claim with the Supreme Court against Hopper over the matter.

Coming home: UK students glad to hear the 24 American servicemen and women coming back to the U.S. after complicated 11-day dispute

Officials from China agreed on Wednesday to send home the 24 American servicemen and wome being detained for landing a surveillance plane on Chinese soil.

"I am pleased to tell the American people that plans are under way to bring home our 24 American servicemen and women from Hainan island," said President George W. Bush in a statement Wednesday.

Even though the 11-day international dispute has occurred thousands of miles from Kentucky, many UK students have watched the controversy between the two word superpowers unfold.

Matt McCourt, a geography graduate, thinks that bringing the soldiers home is the most pressing aspect of this situation.

"It's important that these folks are coming home," McCourt

said. "It's more important than the other issues that will have to be dealt with in the future."

While some students were happy to hear the soldiers are coming home, others are upset with the way the United States has handled the situation.

"We should stop trying to skirt around issues and mincing our words," said Mandy Cooper, a political science senior. "If we're sorry then say we're sorry."

The announcement concerning the release of the soldiers came after II days of intense negotiations. U.S. Ambassador closely W. Prusher sent a letter containing what he described as a "mutual understanding" to Chinese Minister of Foreign Affairs Tang Jiaxuan. This letter set in motion the action by the Chinese government to release the detained soldiers from Hainan Island, the location where their surveillance plane was forced to land

after colliding with a Chinese fighter plane.

The prolonged dispute has many UK students questioning the United States' and China's roles as "superpowers."

"I think the whole thing is China's such a secluded nation and they look at an apology as a way of controlling the situation," said Anne Richards, a political science freshman. "I think every-one's at fault. We all know that nations spy on each other."

In the letter, Prueher asks Jiaxuan to "convey to the Chinese people and to the family of pilot Wang Wei that we are very sorry for their loss."

The letter also states that both countries have decided to hold a meeting starting April 18 to discuss the cause of the incident, possible recommendations to avoid incidents like this in the future and a plan to return the downed U.S. aircraft.

Israeli tanks enter refugee camp

KHAN YUNIS REFUGEE CAMP, Gaza Strip

In a first foray into Palestinian territory, Israeli tanks and bulldozers rumbled into this refugee camp early Wednesday, razing or heavily damaging 30 homes and triggering an exchange of fire that killed two Palestinians and wounded more than two dozen. The assault — retaliation for Palestinian mortar fire on Jewish settlements in the Gaza Strip — marked the first time since the outbreak of fighting in the fall that Israeli ground troops entered Palestinian-controlled territory.

Plans for U.S. missile defense opposed UNITED NATIONS — Russia, China and North Korea attacked U.S. intentions to build a national missile defense system, warning that it would threaten international security and triger a new arms race. The three countries said in separate speeches to the U.N. Disarmament Commission that a U.S. missile defense system would also undermine the 1972 Anti-Ballistic Missile Treaty, which bans such systems. U.S. officials did not speak at Tuesday's meeting.

Dutch legalize euthanasia

THE HAGUE, Netherlands — Even before the vote on merry killings was announced, a huge crowd of protesters dejectedly melted away from the square outside parliament, taking with them placards saying "Euthanasia is still murder." By a 46-28 vote fuesday evening, the Dutch Senate enacted a law that made the Netherlands the first country to legalize mercy killings and assisted suicides for patients suffering unbearably with no hope of relief. It was the final legislative act in a 30-year public discussion over euthanasia, and brings into the open what has been discreetly practiced and tolerated for years. It becomes law after it is signed by Queen Beatrix and published in legal documents, probably within a few weeks.

Danny Gross, 44, of Smith, was last seen
alive sitting on the bridge on Kentucky 987 at Cawood about 9:30 p.m. EDT Saturday, said Harlan
County Coroner Philip Bianchi. Bianchi said the
body was found about 5 p.m. Monday.
Gross apparently fell backward off the concrete railing of the bridge and into a rocky area
with water about 16 inches deep, Bianchi said.
Gross received head injuries which apparently
incapacitated him, and he drowned, the coroner
said.

Waterfront Park project OK'd

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — City officials have recived a \$4 million gift from the James Graham Brown Foundation to use toward the construction of the second phase of the Waterfront Park.

Including the recent gift, private fund-raising efforts have raised \$6 million for the second phase, nearly half of the projected cost, said officials with the Waterfront Development Corp.

The second phase of the project will add approximately 30 acres to the 55 acres already completed. Among other plans to be developed during phase two include the Big Four pedestrian walkway, the New Children's Play Area, a cafe, an amphitheater and several parking jots.

Construction will begin in August.



Cincinnati protests escalate to lootings, arrests over shooting

CINCINNATI — Police fired bean bags, rubber bullets and tear gas at people who broke windows and looted stores Tuesday during the second day of protests over the police shooting of an unarmed black man.

As night fell, groups of roug youths ran throughout the city's Over-the-Rhine neighborhood, where police reported scattered looting, fires and attacks in which bricks were thrown into cars and the drivers assaulted.

At least 20 people were arrested on charges that included rioting and disorderly conduct, police Lik ang Ruberg said.

Tuesday afternoon, police formed protective cordions around City Hall and nearby police headquarters as roughly 50 people threw rocks and bottles at windows and a sidewalk vendor's stand was ransacked.

The violence increased at night, when parametics took about 25 people to hospitals and treated another 40 at the scene, chuberg said. The injured included people hurt in the attacks and by bean bags or rubber bullets.

Some clergy members said

Some clergy members said they wanted to go out on the streets and urge a stop to the violence, but police said it was too dangerous.

Mayor Charles Luken appealed for calm during a Tuesday evening news conference inside City Hall, where police in riot gear guarded the front door. He called for a public dialogue to replace violence.






