Todd said he's willing to take the extra time to have meetings with groups such as the faculty senate in order to


make his mission clear.

Former football coach files lawsuit against UK

A former UK football coach has filed a lawsuit in U.S.
District Court suing the UK Ahletics Association, the
Southeastern Conference and the National Collegiate Athletic Association for \$50 million.

Claude Bassett, a former UK recruiting coordinator, claims he was denied due process in the investigation of recruiting violations that led to UK's current probation.

According to the lawsuit, filed Friday in Covington, the "accusations and ban were based upon evidence gathered through deecit and never tested through due process." Bassett's part of the country of

UK allows logging of Robinson Forest

Last year, the UIK Board of Trustees wouldn't allow Robinson Forest to be surface mined.

But this year, to help out the cash-strapped Robinson Scholars program and to forge new ground in forestry research, the board unanimously approved a timber harvest management program designed to satisfy the best of both worlds.

"We believe the intention of the E.O. Robinson Trust says to do research like this – provide answers that the forest community really needs," said Chris Barton, assistant professor in the Department of Forestry.

"That's the neat thing about Robinson Forest. We have the perfect research facility to do this thing. It gives us the opportunity to do this on a legitimate scale," said Barton, who helped author a report on the forest given to board members in their members of the state of








Families of abducted South Koreans grieve

SEOUL — Lee Min Kyo, a high school athlete, disaphigh school athlete, disap-peared from a camping trip on the western shores of South Korea in 1977, leading South Korea in 1977, leading his desperate parents to spend their life savings on a decades-long search that turned up no trace of their missing boy. Virtually every sinister scenario went through their minds, said Lee's mother

South Korean officials maintain they have repeatedly brought up the abduction issue with the North—though mostly in low-level talks. Officials admit they oppose making resolution of the abductions issue a prerequisite for better ties with the North.

"As opposed to Japan, we have to deal with this issue in a larger perspective, within the context of inter-Korean relations," said Chong Kyul Ryoo, director of the Social and Cultural Exchange Bureau at South Korea's Ministry of Unification.

"Our situation is different than the Japanese case ... and given the other important is sues involved in North-South relations, this abductee issue may take some time" to re-solve.

A Foreign Ministry offi-cial in Seoul, who spoke on the condition of anonymity because of the sensitivity of the issue, said the govern-ment sympathized with the the issue, said the govern-ment sympathized with the families. "We are doing our best, but I can understand their sense of victimization," he said. "The fact is this ter-rible situation has not been resolved."




