Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, August 25, 1981.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 2 p.m. (Eastern Daylight Time) on Tuesday, August 25, 1981 in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington campus.

A. Meeting Opened and Roll Called

Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 2:10 p.m. and pronounced the invocation.

The following members of the Board of Trustees answered the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, Mr. William R. Black, Mr. Britt Brockman, Governor Albert Benjamin Chandler, Mrs. Betty Pace Clark, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Professor Opal Skaggs Mr. Tracy Farmer, Mrs. Edythe Jones Hayes, Mrs. Sally Conley, Hermansdorfer, Mr. Thomas B. Kessinger, Mr. W. Terry McBrayer, Mr. Robert T. McCowan, Mr. Frank Ramsey, Mr. Homer W. Ramsey, Mr. W. B. Terry, Professor William F. Wagner, and Professor Contance P. Wilson. Mr. A. Stevens Miles was absent from the meeting. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Vice Presidents Jack C. Blanton, Donald B. Clapp, Art Gallaher, Raymond R. Hornback, John T. Smith, Charles Wethington, Jr., and Robert G. Zumwinkle; Dr. Wimberly C. Royster, Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research; Mr. John C. Darsie, General Counsel; and Dr. Howard L. Bost representing Vice President Peter P. Bosomworth. Representatives of the various news media were in attendance. The Secretary, Mrs. Betty Pace Clark, reported a quorum present and the Chairman declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 2:12 p.m.

B. Minutes Approved

The Minutes of the June 23, 1981 meeting of the Board of Trustees were approved without objection.

C. Nominating Committee Appointed

Mr. Sturgill named Mr. Homer Ramsey, Mr. Thomas Kessinger, and Mr. Frank Ramsey, with Mr. Homer Ramsey as Chairman, as a nominating committee to prepare a slate of officers of the Board and members of the Executive Committee to be presented at the September 15, 1981 meeting of the Board of Trustees.

D. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

After calling attention to the million dollar gift to the University from the R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Company, President Singletary recommended that his monthly report, copies of which were distributed to the members, be accepted and filed. Without objection, it was so ordered by the Chairman.

E. Recommendations of the President (PR 2)

Prior to his recommendation that the appointments and staff changes in PR 2 be approved, President Singletary called attention to the following appointments: Professor James P. Chapman as Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs, Professor Donald E. Sands as Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs, and Professor M. O'Neal Weeks as Acting Dean of the College of Home Economics. On motion by Mr. Homer Ramsey, seconded by Mrs. Hermansdorfer and passed, the appointments and staff changes as recommended in PR 2 were approved. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

F. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3)

There were no supplemental recommendations.

G. 1981-82 Budget Revisions (PR 4)

Acting on the recommendation of President Singletary, Mr. Black moved that the revisions in the 1981-82 budget as recommended in PR 4 be approved. His motion was seconded by Mrs. Hayes and passed without dissent. (See PR 4 at the end of the Minutes).

H. Reduction in State Appropriation in 1981-82 Operating Budget (PR 5)

President Singletary stated that the budget revisions in PR 5 were the result of a reduction of \$8.8 million in planned support from state appropriation. With the use of charts he explained that in order for the University to absorb the loss and in order to maintain faculty and staff levels, a freeze on hiring has been instituted and in addition the Administration has had to "literally strip the University of additional dollars in operating expenses, equipment and facilities." These actions, he explained, will result in a balanced budget for the 1981-82 fiscal year but added that the longer term implications of the budget cut are still under review, and that a plan for the longer term reduction will be presented to the Board at a later date.

With President Singletary so recommending, on motion by Governor Chandler, seconded by Mr. McCowan and passed unanimously, the reduction in state appropriation in the 1981-82 Operating Budget as recommended in PR 5 was authorized and approved. (See PR 5 at the end of the Minutes).

I. Biennial Budget Request 1982-84 and Five Year Plan 1981-1986 (PR 6)

With the concurrence of the Chairman, President Singletary said he would present the Biennial Budget Request and Five Year Plan as his last agenda item.

J. Approval of Degree Candidates--University System (PR 7) and Candidates for Degrees--Community College System (PR 8)

President Singletary recommended that PR's 7 and 8, regarding candidates for degrees, be considered together. On motion by Mr. Terry, seconded by Mr. Homer Ramsey and passed, the recommendations for degree candidates in the University System and the Community College System as presented in PR 7 and PR 8 were approved without dissent. (See PR's 7 and 8 at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Report on Gifts and/or Grants (PR 9)

President Singletary recommended that the report on gifts and/or grants covering the period from April 1, 1981 to June 30, 1981 be accepted and made a matter of record. Mr. McCowan so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Black and passed without discussion. (See PR 9 at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Change in Responsibilities for Academic Unit (PR 10)

President Singletary stated that as part of last year's decision regarding the need to eliminate some positions, it was decided not to fill the position of Dean of Undergraduate Studies. He therefore recommended that the duties of the Dean of Undergraduate Studies be assigned to the Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs and that the Dean of Undergraduate Studies' position be discontinued. On motion by Mr. McBrayer, seconded by Mr. Terry and passed, PR 10 was approved. (See PR 10 at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Waiver of Governing Regulations, Part VII-A-(7), (PR 11)

Explaining that normally the director of an interdisciplinary research institute would be a member of the faculty of an academic department, President Singletary requested that the Board of Trustees waive this requirement as set forth in the Governing Regulations VII-A-(7) and appoint Dr. David S. Walls as Acting Director of the Appalachian Center while Dr. John M. Stephenson, the current Director, is on sabbatical leave.

On motion by Professor Wilson, seconded by Mrs. Hermansdorfer and passed, approval was given for a waiver of Part VII-A-(7) of the Governing Regulations as recommended in PR 11. (See PR 11 at the end of the Minutes.)

N. Articles of Incorporation of the University of Kentucky - Business Partnership Foundation, Inc. (PR 12)

President Singletary stated that Dr. Richard Furst, the newly appointed Dean of the College of Business and Economics, had proposed the formation of a non-profit corporation to solicit gifts from businesses. He added that the gifts were to be used for special purposes within the College and for other purposes as specified in the Articles of Incorporation. President Singletary

said he agreed with the concept and recommended that the Board approve the Articles of Incorporation for the University of Kentucky - Business Partnership Foundation, Inc. as recommended in PR 12. On motion by Mr. Terry, seconded by Mrs. Hayes and passed, PR 12 was approved. (See PR 12 at the end of the Minutes.)

O. Biennial Budget Request 1982-1984 and Five Year Plan 1981-1986 (PR 6)

In opening his presentation of the Biennial Budget Request and Five Year Plan, President Singletary said he wished to make three basic points. First, he gave an overview of the 1980-82 budget cuts and what they had meant to the University. Assisted by Dr. Clapp, Vice President for Administration, and Dr. Peter Fitzgerald, Associate Vice President of Administration for Planning and Budget, President Singletary, through the use of charts, explained the \$5.8 million cut in state appropriations from the 1980-81 budget and the cumulative loss of \$23.2 million for the biennium. He also pointed out that the requested increase in state money did not take into account the latest budget cut of \$8.8 million because the Five Year Plan was being completed when the state reductions were announced on July 28.

Second, President Singletary displayed charts which indicated that the Southern Regional Education Board states' average spending per FTE student is \$3,082 compared with UK's average of \$2,627. He added that he was particularly concerned that the University's average spending for each student is less than the \$2,679 average spent for each student at Kentucky's eight public universities and that is without any weighting of the more costly doctoral and professional programs at UK. He also pointed out that UK's state appropriation for 1981-82 is \$34.2 million less than is called for by the Council on Higher Education formula and that it would take an increase of \$91.0 million to catch up to that formula standard by 1983-84. President Singletary said he feels the real issue is whether UK is to survive and remain competitive.

Third, increases in the state appropriation requested for 1982-84 total \$65.4 million, of which \$34.3 million is for salaries. The remainder includes \$7.4 million for current expenses, \$2.1 million for utilities, \$3.6 million for fixed costs, \$3.2 million for debt service, and \$14.8 million for special program emphasis. President Singletary reviewed the program plans along with the major capital construction priority list. (See PR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

P. Adoption of a Resolution Amending Resolution Authorizing Issuance of Series G Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bonds and Revenue Bond Anticipation Notes (FCR 1)

Thereupon, a motion was made by Mr. Clay and seconded by Mr. Homer Ramsey that the following Resolution, which was read in summary form to the Board of Trustees, be passed and adopted; said Resolution was entitled as follows:

A SECOND RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF 17,100,000 CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL BUILDINGS REVENUE BONDS, SERIES G AND 17,100,000 CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL BUILDINGS REVENUE BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES, SERIES G, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY.

Adoption of Resolution Approving the Sale and Issuance of Series G Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bond Anticipation Notes.

Thereupon, a motion was made by Mr. Clay and seconded by Mr. Kessinger that the following Resolution, which was read in full to the Board of Trustees be passed and adopted; said Resolution was entitled as follows:

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY ACCEPTING THE SUCCESSFUL BID(S) FOR THE PURCHASE OF \$17,100,000 OF UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL BUILDINGS REVENUE BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES, SERIES G.

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky (the "Board"); by Resolution passed and adopted on March 10,1981 (the "Original Series G Resolution") authorized First Kentucky Securities Corporation, Fiscal Agent for the Board, to solicit proposals for the purchase of the Board's \$18,600,000 principal amount of "University of Kentucky Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bond Anticipation Notes, Series G" dated June 1, 1981 (the "Notes"), and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the terms of said Original Series G Resolution the Fiscal Agent has prepared an "Official Statement" containing a form of "Invitation to Submit Proposals for Purchase" in regard to said Notes and has distributed same to perspective purchasers of said Notes in accordance with law, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Board that the scope of the Project to be financed from the proceeds of the Notes should be reduced and accordingly the principal amount of Notes to be sold should likewise be reduced, and

WHEREAS, the Board has on this 25th day of August, 1981 passed and adopted a Second Series G Resolution superceding the terms of the Original Series G Resolution in order to reflect the change in the principal amount of Notes to be sold, and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the "Invitation to Submit Proposals for Purchase" it is provided that proposals would be considered by the Board if submitted on or before 11:00 A.M., E.D.T. on August 25, 1981, and

WHEREAS, the hour of 2:00 P.M., E.D.T. has arrived and proposals for the purchase of the Notes having been received by the Vice President for Business Affairs as follows:

WHEREAS, the Board has considered the matter of which bid(s) is (are) the most advantageous to the Board;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

l. That the following bids for the sale of \$17,100,000 of University of Kentucky Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bond Anticipation Notes, Series G, dated September 16, 1981, be accepted and confirmed:

- 2. That said bid(s) identified in Section 1. hereof have been determined to be the highest and best to the Board and the University for said Notes, the interest rates on said Notes are hereby fixed at the rates set out in said successful bid(s).
- 3. That said Notes as identified in the Resolution passed and adopted by the Executive Committee on March 10, 1981, as superceded by Resolution passed and adopted on August 25, 1981, shall be delivered by the officers of the Board in accordance with the terms of said Resolutions as soon as ready.
- 4. That the confirmation of this bid subjects the Board to no liability if it is unable to obtain the final approving Legal Opinion of Henry M. Reed III, Bond Counsel, Louisville, Kentucky, or if said Notes or the interest thereon should be subject to ad valorem or income taxation by the Federal Government or Kentucky prior to delivery of said Notes, but the purchasers shall not be required to take ap said Notes without the final approving Legal Opinion of Bond Counsel accompanying said Notes or if said Notes or the interest thereon should become so subject to taxation.
- 5. That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.

Mrs. Hermansdorfer voiced strong support of this project and seconded Mr. Clay's motion which passed with all present voting aye. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

To meet the demands of this reduction the University has instituted a freeze on hiring has curtailed current expense budgets, and has deferred needed equipment replacement and repair and maintenance projects. These actions will result in a balanced budget for the 1981-82 fiscal year, but the longer term implications of the budget cut are still under review. A plan for the longer term reduction will be presented to the Board at a later date.

WAIVER OF GOVERNING REGULATIONS PART VII-A-(7)

Recommendation: that approval be given for a waiver of VII-A-(7) of the Governing Regulations in the appointment of Dr. David S. Walls, as Acting Director of the Appalachian Center.

Background: Interdisciplinary research institutes are defined in Part VII, Section A-1, of the Governing Regulations as units established for the administration of interdisciplinary programs that are primarily research in nature. The chief administrative officer of an institute is the director. Part VII, Section A-7, of the Governing Regulations states that, "the staff of an interdisciplinary research institute shall consist of: (1) regular faculty members on a joint appointment basis; (2) non-faculty employees appointed for the duration of a specific project; and (3) a director who shall also be a member of an academic department."

The Appalachian Center meets the definition of an interdisciplinary research program, and was in fact so created by the Board of Trustees on 20 September 1977. The current director, Professor John B. Stephenson, is on sabbatical leave, 1 July 1981 through 30 December 1981, and it is desirable to appoint an acting director for that period who is knowledgable about the research and training programs in progress at the Center. Dr. Walls, who is not a member of an academic department is so knowledgeable and has been active in securing grants for the Center programs. He is considered a specialist on the Appalachian region and is well qualified to assume administrative responsibility for the Center in Dr. Stephenson's absence.

Articles of Incorporation of the University of Kentucky Business Partnership Foundation, Inc.

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve the attached Articles of Incorporation of the University of Kentucky - Business Partnership Foundation, Inc.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY

BUSINESS PARTNERSHIP FOUNDATION, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS THAT:

I, <u>RICHARD W. FURST</u>, the undersigned, acting as incorporator of a non-profit corporation under the provisions of Chapter 273 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

 $\begin{tabular}{ll} The name of the corporation shall be the University of \\ Kentucky - Business Partnership Foundation, Inc. \\ \end{tabular}$

ARTICLE II

The period of duration of the corporation shall be perpetual unless terminated pursuant to law.

ARTICLE III

The corporation is organized exclusively for educational purposes, to-wit, to make the College of Business and Economics of the University of Kentucky one of the finest in the nation by establishing a continuing partnership between the University of Kentucky and the business community of the Commonwealth of Kentucky for the enhancement and improvement of the College of Business and Economics. To that end, the purposes of the corporation shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

(1) To solicit and receive gifts, bequests and devises of things of value and accept the same subject to such conditions and trusts as may be imposed thereon for the exclusive benefit of the College of Business and Economics.

- (2) To build an endowment fund and such other funds as may be necessary or desirable and advise as to the creative management of said funds and disburse therefrom, from time to time, such monies as may be determined by the hereinafter named Board of Directors and in accordance with the limitations of any gift, bequests or devises which may come to the corporation.
- (3) To determine, in cooperation with the administration of the College of Business and Economics, appropriate projects and programs of that College to be financed in whole or in part by funds raised or by income from said endowment or other funds.

ARTICLE IV

The University of Kentucky shall serve as fiscal agent for the corporation and, as such, receive and hold in an agency account all monies received by and on behalf of the corporation and expend therefrom such monies as may be authorized by the corporation.

ARTICLE V

The corporation shall have all powers granted by the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky so long as such powers are consistent with the qualifying provisions of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code for such corporations.

ARTICLE VI

In the event of dissolution of the corporation, the assets of the corporation shall be distributed to the University of Kentucky, for the use and benefit of its College of Business and Economics, to be held and administered in accordance with any restrictions, conditions or limitations imposed thereon.

ARTICLE VII

The address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 121 Commerce Building 20341, University of Kentucky, Lexington, Kentucky 40506 and the name of its initial registered agent is Richard W. Furst, D.B.A., 121 Commerce Building 20341, University of Kentucky, Lexington, Kentucky 40506.

ARTICLE VIII

The affairs of the corporation shall be regulated, managed, controlled and conducted by a Board of Directors to be appointed by the President of the University of Kentucky, upon recommendation of the Dean of the College of Business and Economics and with the approval of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky. The Board shall consist of twenty-six (26) members appointed from the following categories:

- (1) Twenty (20) shall be businessmen or businesswomen from the public-at-large.
- (2) Four (4) shall be ex-officio members from the University of Kentucky, to-wit, the President, the Vice President for Academic Affairs, the Vice President for University Relations, and the Dean of the College of Business and Economics.
- (3) At least two (2) shall be members of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky.

Each member of the Board shall be appointed for one (1) term of four (4) years. The members may succeed themselves for staggered terms of one (1) to four (4) years, as determined by the President, but the members may not serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms.

ARTICLE IX

ARTICLE X

The officers of the corporation shall consist of a president, one or more vice presidents, a secretary, a treasurer and such other officers (and assistant officers) as may be deemed necessary by the Board of Directors. The officers shall be elected or appointed at such time and in such manner and for such terms (not exceeding three years) as may be prescribed in the By-Laws. Any two of the offices of vice-president, secretary, and treasurer may be combined in one person. The officers of the corporation may be designated by such additional titles as may be provided in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE XII

No part of the funds or assets of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, officers or directors of the corporation, or other private persons. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions

to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

ARTICLE XIII

These Articles of Incorporation shall be amended by the adoption of an amendment at a meeting of the Board of Directors upon receiving the vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the directors in office and approval of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL BUILDINGS REVENUE BONDS, SERIES G, AND REVENUE BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES, SERIES G

Recommendation: That the Board of Trustees approve the following: A Second Resolution authorizing the issuance of \$17,100,000 Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bonds, Series G and \$17,100,000 Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bond Anticipation Notes, Series G, of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky. Further, that the Board authorize the dissemination of a Notice of Sale of Notes, an Official Statement and Official Bid Form for the solicitation of proposals to purchase said Series G Notes.

Background: On December 9, 1980, the Board adopted a Resolution approving the issuance of both the Series G Bonds and the Series G Notes and, further, authorizing the Executive Committee of the Board to take all actions necessary to the issuance, sale, execution and delivery of the Notes and Bonds. On March 10, 1981, the Executive Committee adopted the Series G Resolution authorizing the issuance of the Notes and Bonds. Subsequently, it became necessary to delay the sale of the Series G Notes on two scheduled sale dates. Although the amount of Notes and Bonds remain the same, the delays require substantive revisions in the Series G Resolution. For this reason it is recommended that the Resolution adopted on March 10, 1981, be repealed in its entirety and the Second Series G Resolution be approved. The primary revisions are: (i) change in the date of the Notes from May 1, 1981, to September 16, 1981; (ii) change in the maturity date of the Notes from May 1, 1982, to May 1, 1983; (iii) change in the maturity schedule of the Series G Bonds with the first maturity on May 1, 1984; (iv) changes in the prior redemption dates for the Bonds.

The proceeds of the Series G Notes will provide funds (to the extent not otherwise provided) for payment of the costs of construction and related costs of additions to the University's Medical Center consisting of a Primary/Ambulatory Care Center with related patient parking structure and completion of the Center for Study of Aging.

A SECOND RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$17,100,000 CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL BUILDINGS REVENUE BONDS, SERIES G AND \$17,100,000 CONSOLIDATED EDUCATIONAL BUILDINGS REVENUE BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES, SERIES G, OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, by Resolution entitled:

"A RESOLUTION creating and establishing a Consolidated Educational Buildings Project of the University of Kentucky; creating and establishing an issue of Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bonds of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky; providing for the issuance from time to time of said bonds; providing for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and repealing all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this resolution,"

adopted September 20, 1960 (hereinafter referred to as the "Resolution"), has created and established an issue of Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bonds of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, the Resolution authorizes the issuance by said Board of said Bonds in one or more series pursuant to a resolution authorizing such series; and

WHEREAS, there have heretofore been issued pursuant to such Resolution Series A Bonds in the original face amount of \$8,000,000 in 1960, of which \$2,275,000 face amount are still outstanding; Series B Bonds in the original face amount of \$7,500,000 in 1963, of which \$2,950,000 face amount are still outstanding; Series C Bonds in the original face amount of \$4,290,000 in 1970, of which \$2,790,000 face amount still remain outstanding; Series D Bonds in the original face amount of \$34,700,000, all of which having been refunded from the proceeds of Series D Refunding Bonds in the original face amount of \$31,000,000, of which all remain outstanding; Series E Bonds in the original face amount of \$4,750,000, of which \$4,690,000 remain outstanding; and Series F Bonds in the original face amount of \$7,500,000, of which \$7,245,000 remain outstanding; and

WHEREAS, the Board through its Executive Committee by Resolution (the "Original Series G Resolution") passed and adopted on March 10, 1981, authorized the issuance of \$18,600,000

"University of Kentucky Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bonds, Series G" (the "Series G Bonds") and \$18,600,000 "University of Kentucky Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bond Anticipation Notes, Series G" (the "Series G Notes") and determined that the conditions of the municipal bond market were then unfavorable to the issuers of municipal obligations in that higher interest rates for long-term financing were then unattractive to the issuers of bonds; provided, however, that it was then determined by the Board that it was necessary that the Board proceed immediately with the construction of the additions to the University's Medical Center facilities (Primary/Ambulatory Care Center and related patient parking structure and completion of the Center for Study of Aging) (the "Series G Project"), but the Board subsequently determined that the conditions of the municipal bond market even for interim loans represented by the Series G Notes were so unfavorable on May 5, 1981 (the date scheduled for the consideration for proposals for the purchase of said Series G Notes) that the Board withdrew said Series G Notes from consideration by prospective purchasers; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the adoption of the Original Series G Resolution the Board has determined that the inclusion of the completion of the Center for the Study of Aging as part of the Series G Project is no longer feasible and desires to delete said Center from the Series G Project to be financed by the Series G Notes and the Series G Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Board has now determined that (which determination has been concurred in by the Division of Investment and Debt Management of the State Department of Finance) the conditions of the municipal bond market with regard to interim construction loans represented by the Series G Notes have improved to some degree and that it is necessary that the Board revise certain of the provisions relating to the authorization of said Series G Notes and said Series G Bonds in order to now proceed to solicit proposals for the purchase of said Series G Notes;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

All provisions of the Original Series G Resolution passed and adopted by the Executive Committee of the Board on March 10, 1981 shall be and are hereby repealed and rescinded and the provisions of this Second Series G Resolution shall govern the issuance of said Series G Notes and said Series G Bonds; it is hereby specifically provided that the "Center for Study of Aging" shall no longer constitute a part of the Series G Project as defined in this Second Resolution and the principal amount of Series G Notes and Series G Bonds shall be adjusted downward accordingly.

ARTICLE I

Definitions and Authority

Section 1.01. This Second Resolution (hereinafter referred to as the "Series G Resolution") is adopted in accordance with Article II, Section 2.03, of the Resolution and supercedes and repeals all provisions of the Original Series G Resolution.

Section 1.02 (A) All terms which are defined in Article I of the Resolution shall have the same meanings, respectively, in this Series G Resolution as such terms are given in said Article of the Resolution.

- (B) In this Series G Resolution, Series G Bonds shall mean the Bonds authorized by Article II of this Series G Resolution.
- (C) In this Series G Resolution, Series G Notes shall mean the Bond Anticipation Notes authorized by Article III of this Series G Resolution.

Section 1.03. This Series G Resolution is adopted pursuant to the provisions of Section 162.340 et seq. of the Kentucky Revised Statutes and the Resolution.

ARTICLE II

Authorization of Series G Bonds

Section 2.01. Pursuant to the provisions of the Resolution there is hereby authorized to be issued by the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, in its corporate capacity, a series of Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of Seventeen Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$17,100,000). Such Bonds shall be designated as "University of Kentucky Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bonds, Series G." Said Series G Bonds are hereby declared to have been authorized under the Resolution and in conformity with the provisions of Section 7.10 of the Resolution.

Section 2.02. Said Series G Bonds are being issued for the purpose of paying the costs (to the extent not otherwise provided) of erecting the Series G Project with necessary appurtenances upon the property of the University in Fayette County, Kentucky.

Section 2.03. The Series G Bonds shall be dated as of a date prior to the maturity date of the Series G Notes to be designated by the Board with the concurrence of the Division of Investment and Debt Management of the Department of Finance of the Commonwealth, and bear interest payable semiannually on November 1 and May 1 of each year at a coupon rate or coupon rates, the exact rate or rates of interest for said Series G

Bonds to be fixed as a result of advertised sale and competitive bidding for said Series G Bonds, as hereinafter provided. Said Series G Bonds shall be numbered and scheduled to become due and payable in numerical order on May 1 of the respective years as follows:

Section 2.04. Said Series G Bonds shall be issued in coupon form, in the denomination of \$5,000 and shall be registrable as to principal only.

Section 2.05. The principal of and interest on said Bonds shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America, which at the time of Series G payment therefor is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts, at the principal office of First Security National Bank & Trust Company of Lexington, in the City of Lexington, Kentucky, Trustee (or successor Trustee appointed pursuant to the provisions of the Resolution), or at the option of the holders of the respective Series G Bonds and coupons at the principal office of Chemical Bank, in the City of New York, New York, which are hereby appointed Paying Agents for the Series G Bonds.

Section 2.06. The Series G Bonds maturing May 1, 1994, and thereafter (being the Bonds numbered 583 and upwards) shall be subject to redemption by the Board in whole or from time to time in part in the inverse order of their maturities (less than all of a single maturity to be selected by lot) on any interest payment date on or after May 1, 1993, at the redemption prices, expressed in percentages of principal amount, with respect to each Bond as set forth below, plus in each case accrued interest to the date of redemption.

Section 2.07. Said Series G Bonds shall be executed on behalf of said Board with the reproduced facsimile signature of the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Board and attested by the manual signature of the Secretary of the Board, and the facsimile of the corporate seal of said Board shall be imprinted thereon. Interest on said Series G Bonds falling due on and prior to maturity shall be represented by appropriate interest coupons to be attached to each of said Series G Bonds, which coupons shall be executed with the facsimile of the official signatures of said Chairman or Vice-Chairman and said Secretary.

Section 2.08. For the purpose of securing the payment of both the principal of and interest on all the Series G Bonds and to secure for the benefit of all the holders of said Series G Bonds the faithful performance of the covenants and provisions contained in the Resolution in the manner and to the extent permitted and provided in the Resolution and in Sections 162.340 et seq. of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, First Security National Bank & Trust Company of Lexington, in the City of Lexington, Kentucky, is hereby designated as Trustee under the Resolution for the holders of all of said Series G Bonds, with the powers and duties set forth in the Resolution and with no liability in connection with any action or omission to act under the Resolution except for its own negligence or willful breach of trust. Execution of the authentication certificate of the Trustee on the back of the respective Series G Bonds shall conclusively establish the acceptance as to such Series G Bonds by the Trustee of the trusts and provisions with respect thereto as set forth in the Resolution.

Section 2.09. The Series G Bonds and coupons and provisions for registration appertaining thereto and the certificate of the Trustee to be endorsed on said Series G Bonds shall be in substantially the following respective forms, to-wit:

This Bond is one of a duly authorized issue of Bonds designated as "Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bonds" (hereinafter referred to as the "Bonds") issued and to be issued under and in full compliance with the Constitution and Statutes of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, including, among others, Sections 162.350 to 162.380, inclusive, of the Kentucky Revised Statutes now in full force and effect, and under and pursuant to the Resolution adopted by the Board of Trustees on September 20, 1960 (hereinafter referred to as the "Resolution") and the Series G Resolution adopted by the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees on August 25, 1981.

As provided in the Resolution, the Bonds may be issued from time to time pursuant to separate resolutions in one or more series, in various principal amounts, may bear interest at different rates and may otherwise vary as in the Resolution

provided. The aggregate principal amount of Bonds which may be issued under the Resolution is not limited except as provided in the Resolution, and all Bonds issued and to be issued under the Resolution are and will be equally secured by the pledges and covenants made therein, except as otherwise expressly provided or permitted in the Resolution.

This Bond is one of a series of Bonds of various maturities designated as "Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bonds, Series G" (herein called the "Series G Bonds"), issued in the aggregate amount of \$17,100,000 under the Resolution for the purpose of financing the costs to the extent not otherwise provided) of erecting educational buildings and necessary appurtenances as parts of the Consolidated Education Buildings Series G Project of said University (hereinafter referred to as the "Project"). Copies of the Resolution and the Series G Resolution are on file at the office of the Trustee. Reference is hereby made to the Resolution pursuant to which First Security National Bank & Trust Company of Lexington, in the City of Lexington, Kentucky, has been designated as Trustee for the holders of the issue of Bonds of which this Bond is one and for the provisions, among others, with respect to the custody and application of the proceeds of the Bonds; the rights, duties and obligations of said Board of Trustees, and of the Trustee, and the rights of the holders of the Bonds; and by the acceptance of this Bond the holder hereof assents to all of the provisions of the Resolutions. Under authority of the statutes pursuant to which this Bond is issued, this Bond shall have all the qualities and incidents of a negotiable instrument, and subject to the provisions for registration endorsed hereon and contained in the Resolution, nothing contained in this Bond or in the Resolution shall affect or impair the negotiabiliity of this Bond.

The holder of this Bond shall have no right to enforce the provisions of the Resolution or to institute action to enforce the covenants therein, or to take any action with respect to any default under the Resolution, or to institute, appear in or defend any suit or other proceedings with respect thereto, except as provided in the Resolution. The Resolution provides for fixing, charging and collecting fees for the services of said Series G Project, which fees will be sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on said Bonds as the same become due and to provide reserves for such purposes and also to pay the costs of operation and maintenance of the Project to the extent the same are not otherwise provided. The Resolution provides for the creation of a special account designated "Consolidated Educational Buildings Project Bond and Interest Sinking Fund* (herein called the "Bond Fund") and for the deposit to the credit of said Bond Fund of a fixed amount of the gross Revenues of said Project to pay interest on the Bonds as the same become due and to pay or retire the principal of the Bonds at or prior to the maturity

thereof, and to provide a reserve for such prupose, which Bond Fund is pledged to and charged with the payment of said principal and interest.

The issue of Series G Bonds of which this Bond is one and all other Bonds as may be outstanding from time to time under the Resolution, are payable only from a fixed amount of the gross Revenues derived from the operation of said Series G Project which will be set aside in said Bond Fund, and this Bond does not constitute any indebtedness of the University of Kentucky or of its Board of Trustees or of the Commonwealth of Kentucky within the meaning of any provisions or limitations of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

The Series G Bonds maturing May 1, 1994, and thereafter (being the Bonds numbered 583 and upwards) shall be subject to redemption at the option of the Board of Trustees in whole or from time to time in part in the inverse order of their maturities (less than all of a single maturity to be selected by lot) on any interest payment date on or after May 1, 1993, at the redemption prices, expressed in percentage of principal amount, with respect to each Bond as set forth below, plus in each case accrued interest to the date of redemption:

In the event the Board of Trustees shall exercise its option to redeem any of the Series G Bonds of which this Bond is a part, notice of such redemption identifying the Bonds to be redeemed will be given to the Trustee at least forty-five (45) days prior to the specified redemption date, and such notice shall be published at least once not less than thirty (30) days prior to the specified redemption date, in a newspaper or financial journal of general circulation published in each of the Cities of Louisville, Kentucky, and New York, New York. Any Bonds called for redemption and for the payment of which funds are deposited with said Trustee on the specified redemption date shall cease to bear interest on said redemption date.

This Bond shall pass by delivery unless registered as to principal on the books of said Board of Trustees at the office

of the Trustee under the Resolution, and such registration noted hereon, after which no valid transfer hereof shall be effective unless made on said books and similarly endorsed hereon at the written request of the registered holder of his duly authorized representative, but this Bond may be discharged from registration by being in like manner registered to bearer, whereupon full negotiability and transferability by delivery shall be restored but may again from time to time be registered as aforesaid. Such registration, however, shall not affect the negotiability of the interest coupons which shall always remain payable to bearer and transferable by delivery merely. The Board of Trustees, the Trustee and the Paying Agents may treat the bearer of this Bond, if not registered as to principal, and the bearer of any coupon hereto appertaining, whether or not this Bond be so registered, or if this Bond be registered as herein authorized, the person in whose name the same is registered, as the absolute owner for the purpose of making payment and for all other purposes.

A statutory mortgage lien, which is hereby recognized as valid and binding on said Project, is created and granted to and in favor of the holder or holders of this Bond and the issue of Bonds of which it is one, and in favor of the holder or holders of the coupons attached hereto, and said Project shall remain subject to such statutory mortgage lien until the payment in full of the principal of and interest on this Bond and the issue of Bonds of which it is one.

This Bond shall not be valid or become obligatory for any purpose, or be entitled to any security or benefit, under the Resolution, until it shall have been authenticated by the execution by the Trustee of the certificate hereon endorsed.

It is hereby certified, recited and declared that all acts, conditions and things required to exist, to happen and to be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this Bond do exist, have happened and have been performed in due time, form and manner as required by law, and the amount of this Bond, together with all other obligations of said Board of Trustees and of said University of Kentucky, does not violate any provision or exceed any limit prescribed by the Constitution or Statutes of Kentucky; that said Project will be continuously operated, and that a sufficient portion of the gross Revenues therefrom has been pledged to and will be set aside into said Bond Fund for the payment of the principal of and interest on this Bond and the issue of which it is one, and all other bonds, which by their terms and the terms of the Resolution are payable from said Bond Fund, as and when the same will respectively become due.

The balance of the Bond proceeds shall be deposited by the Treasurer of the Commonwealth in said Bond Fund and shall be applied by the Treasurer in accordance with the provisions of Section 3.08 of this Series G Resolution to

accomplish the full and complete payment of all issued and outstanding Series G Notes at the maturity date of said Series G Notes, without default. Any proceeds of the Series G Bonds remaining after the required deposits to the Bond Fund shall be deposited in the Construction Account established under Section 3.08 of this Series G Resolution.

ARTICLE III

Authorization of Series G Notes

Section 3.01. That the Board having determined that the conditions of the municipal bond market are presently unfavorable to the issuers of long-term municipal obligations, pending the issuance and delivery of the Series G Bonds there is hereby authorized to be issued by the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, in its corporate capacity, a series of Bond Anticipation Notes in the aggregate principal amount of Seventeen Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$17,100,000). Such Bond Anticipation Notes shall be designated as "University of Kentucky Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bond Anticipation Notes, Series G." Said Series G Notes are hereby declared to have been authorized under the Resolution and in conformity with the provisions of Section 7.10 of the Resolution.

The right is reserved in the Board to issue Renewal Notes upon such terms as it may deem appropriate if it is determined that the issuance of the Seriers G Bonds is not prudent at the time same are now scheduled to be issued. In such case, the Board shall adopt a resolution making appropriate amendments to this Series G Resolution in regard to the Series G Bonds and said Renewal Notes.

Section 3.02. Said Series G Notes are being issued for the purpose of providing interim construction financing for the Series G Project pending the issuance and delivery of the Series G Bonds.

Section 3.03. The Series G Notes shall be dated September 16, 1981 and bear interest from their date payable on May 1, 1982, November 1, 1982 and May 1, 1983, the exact rate or rates of interest for said Series G Notes to be fixed as a result of the solicitation for proposals for the purchase of said Notes made in accordance with Section 56.513 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes. The minimum bid for the purchase of all of said Series G Notes shall be \$16,971,750 (99.25% of par). No bid for less than \$500,000 of said Series G Notes shall be considered.

Section 3.04. Said Series G Notes shall be issued in denominations of multiples of \$5,000 and shall be in bearer or fully registered form.

Section 3.05. Said Series G Notes shall be executed on behalf of said Board with the reproduced facsimile signature of the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Board and attested by the manual signature of the Secretary of the Board, and the facsimile of the corporate seal of said Board shall be imprinted thereon.

Section 3.06. For the purpose of securing the payment of both the principal of and interest on all of the Series G Notes and to secure for the benefit of the holders of said Series G Notes the faithful performance and covenants and provisions contained in the Resolution in the manner and to the extent permitted and provided in the Resolution and in Sections 162.340 et. seq. of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, First Security National Bank & Trust Company of Lexington, in the City of Lexington, Kentucky, is hereby designated as Trustee under the Resolution for the holders of all of said Series G Notes, with the powers and duties set forth in the Resolution and with no liability in connection with any action or omission to act under the Resolution except for its own negligence or willful breach of trust. Execution of the Authentication Certificate of the Trustee on the respective Series G Notes shall conclusively establish the acceptance as to said Series G Notes by the Trustee of the trusts and the provisions with respect thereto as set forth in the Resolution.

Section 3.07. The Series G Notes and the Certificate of the Trustee to be endorsed on said Series G Notes shall be in substantially the following respective forms, to-wit:

This Note is one of a duly authorized issue of Notes designated as "Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bond Anticipation Notes, Series G" (hereinafter referred to as the "Notes"), issued and to be issued under and in full compliance with the Constitution and Statutes of Kentucky, including, among others, Sections 162.350 to 162.380, inclusive, and Section 56.513 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes now in full force and effect, and under and pursuant to the Resolution adopted by the Board of Trustees on September 20, 1960 (hereinafter referred to as the "Resolution"), and the Series G Resolution adopted by the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees on August 25, 1981.

As provided in the Series G Resolution, the Notes are issued in anticipation of the later issuance by the Board of Trustees of Seventeen Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$17,100,000) of "University of Kentucky Consolidated Educational Buildings Revenue Bonds, Series G," (the "Series G Bonds") or Renewal Notes for interim financing purposes in meeting the costs, to the extent not otherwise provided, of erecting educational buildings and necessary appurtenances as parts of the Consolidated Educational Buildings Project of said University (the "Project"). Copies of the Resolution and the Series G Resolution are on file in the office of the Trustee. Reference is hereby made to the Resolution and the Series G Resolution pursuant to which First Security National Bank & Trust Company of Lexington, in the City of Lexington, Kentucky, has been designated as Trustee for the holders of the Series G Bonds and the Notes of which this Note is one for the provisions, among others, with respect to the custody and application of the proceeds of the Notes, the rights, duties and obligations of the Board of Trustees in regard to the issuance of the Series G Bonds and the Notes, and of the Trustee, and the rights of the holders of the Series G Bonds and the Notes; and by the acceptance of this Note, the holder hereof assents to all of the provisions of the Resolution and the Series G Resolution.

Under authority of the Statutes pursuant to which this Note is issued, this Note shall have all of the qualities and incidents of a negotiable instrument, and nothing contained in this Note or in the Resolution or the Series G Resolution shall affect or impair the negotiability of this Note.

Under the Series G Resolution Board of Trustees has covenanted with the holder of the Notes that it has authorized the Series G Bonds and that it will sell the same at public sale and will duly issue the same at such time as funds are required

to pay the principal amount due on this Note; and this Note is payable as to principal solely from (i) the proceeds of said Series G Bonds when such proceeds are received by the Board of Trustees upon the delivery of the Series G Bonds to the purchaser thereof, or (ii) from the proceeds of one or more issues of Renewal Notes, or (iii) the Revenues of the Project, to the extent required.

Interest on this Note is payable solely from the "Consolidated Educational Buildings Project Bond and Interest Sinking Fund" (herein called the "Bond Fund") established under the Resolution into which an amount equal to not less than the interest on all of the Notes from their date to May 1, 1982 has been deposited simultaneously with the delivery of said Notes. Section 3.08. There is hereby established in the State Treasury of the Commonwealth a Construction Account to be designated as "University of Kentucky Consolidated Educational Buildings Project-Series G Note Proceeds Construction Account" (the "Construction Account"). Immediately upon the issuance, sale and delivery of the Series G Notes, all sums received as accrued interest thereon plus an additional amount so that the total deposit shall equal interest to become due on May 1, 1982 on said Series G Notes shall be deposited by the Treasurer of the Commonwealth with the Trustee in the Bond Fund established under the Resolution. The balance of the Series G Note proceeds shall be deposited by the Treasurer of the Commonwealth in the Construction Account and shall be disbursed by such Treasurer according to such inspection, audit and disbursement procedures as may from time to time be provided by law for the purpose of paying the costs (to the extent not otherwise provided) of erecting the Series G Project as identified in the preamble to this Series G Resolution in accordance with the approved plans and specifications therefor, and only upon the certification of the Architect or Engineer having supervision of construction, as

to each disbursement, that the amount thereof has been duly earned by and is payable to the designated party or parties for materials, services and/or labor furnished pursuant to proper contract duly awarded therefor. Any balance remaining in said Construction Account after the erection of said Series G Project and the payment of all costs in connection therewith shall be deposited in the Bond Fund; provided, however, that if proceedings are then pending or imminently contemplated for the construction or completion of one or more additional educational buildings which are or will be financed by the issuance of additional Series Bonds pursuant to the Resolution, and which building or buildings constitute or will constitute a part of the Consolidated Educational Buildings Project, any such unexpended balance may be taken into account in determining the amount of Bonds to be authorized therefor, or may be otherwise applied to the proper costs thereof, in which event such unexpended balance may, upon authority of the Board, be transferred to the particular Series G Construction Account thereof.

Section 3.09. The Board covenants that sums derived from the proceeds of the Series G Notes or the Series G Bonds shall not be invested in any manner which will cause any of the Series G Notes or Series G Bonds to be treated as arbitrage bonds within the meaning of Section 103(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended (the "Code"), and the applicable Income Tax Regulations thereunder (the "Regulations").

On the basis of information furnished to the Board of Trustees, on known facts, circumstances and reasonable expectations on the date this Series G Resolution is adopted, the Board covenants and certifies as follows:

- (A) That it is not expected or contemplated that the proceeds of the Series G Bonds or the Series G Notes will be used or invested in any manner which will cause any of the Bonds or the Notes to be treated as "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 103(c)(2) of the Code and the Regulations.
- (3) That it is not expected or contemplated that the Board will make any use of the proceeds of the Series G Bonds or of the Series G Notes, which, if such use had been reasonably anticipated on the date of issuance of the Series G Bonds, or the Series G Notes, would have caused either to be arbitrage bonds.
- (C) That it is expected and contemplated that the Board will comply with (i) all of the requirements of Section 103(c) of the Code; and (ii) all of the requirements of the Regulations.

Provided, however, that it is intended that the proceeds of

the Series G Notes and the Series G Bonds will be invested to whatever extent and whenever the Code and/or applicable Regulations permit same to be invested without causing same to be treated as arbitrage bonds.

Prior to or at the time of delivery of the Series G Notes, and prior to or at the time of delivery of the Series G Bonds, the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Board, or the University's Vice-President for Business Affairs and Treasurer, or any of them, are authorized to execute the appropriate certification with reference to the matters referred to in this Section 3.08, setting all known and contemplated facts and reasonable expectations concerning such anticipated construction, expenditures and investments, including the execution of necessary and/or desirable certifications of the type contemplated by the Code and the Regulations in order to asssure that the interest on the Series G Notes and the Series G Bonds will be exempt from all federal income taxes and that said Series G Notes and Series G Bonds will not constitute or be treated as arbitrage Bonds.

ARTICLE IV

Effectiveness of Resolution

Section 4.01. A certified copy of this Series G Resolution shall be filed with the Trustee, and this Series G Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and the filing of the certified copy thereof with the Trustee; all subject to the approval of the State Property and Buildings Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

LEASE OF HAMILTON HOUSE
