On motion the whole question of the candidacy of Cadet Leland Moore for graduation was referred to the Classical faculty.

It was moved by Prof. McKenzie that the action of the faculty, at the meeting on Dec 8, relative to the conditions under which those who have received the Bachelor's degree in one course may become candidates for the Master's degree in an other course be rescinded

Motion seconded.

Prof. Anderson moved to amend the former action of Dec 8, by inserting immediately thereafter the following: "Said committee shall within their discretion determine whether one, two, or three years should

he required to make the necessary attainments for the degree in question. Seconded.

Prof. Peice moved to substitute the following for the questions before the house: viz.,

That any one offering himself as a candidate for a Master's degree shall satisfy the above mentioned committee that he has done the work or the equivalent work required for the Corresponding Bachelor's degree.

Voted on motion of Prof. Kettle seconded by Prof. Rowse "that the whole matter now under consideration be adjourned to the next meeting of the faculty."

Prof. McKenzie reported orally that his committee appointed on December 8th to consider some modification in the course in English had determined to recommend two A.B. courses, that the schedules and details would be submitted in writing at the next meeting of the faculty.
