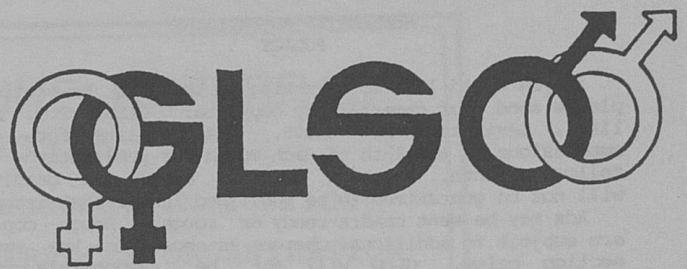

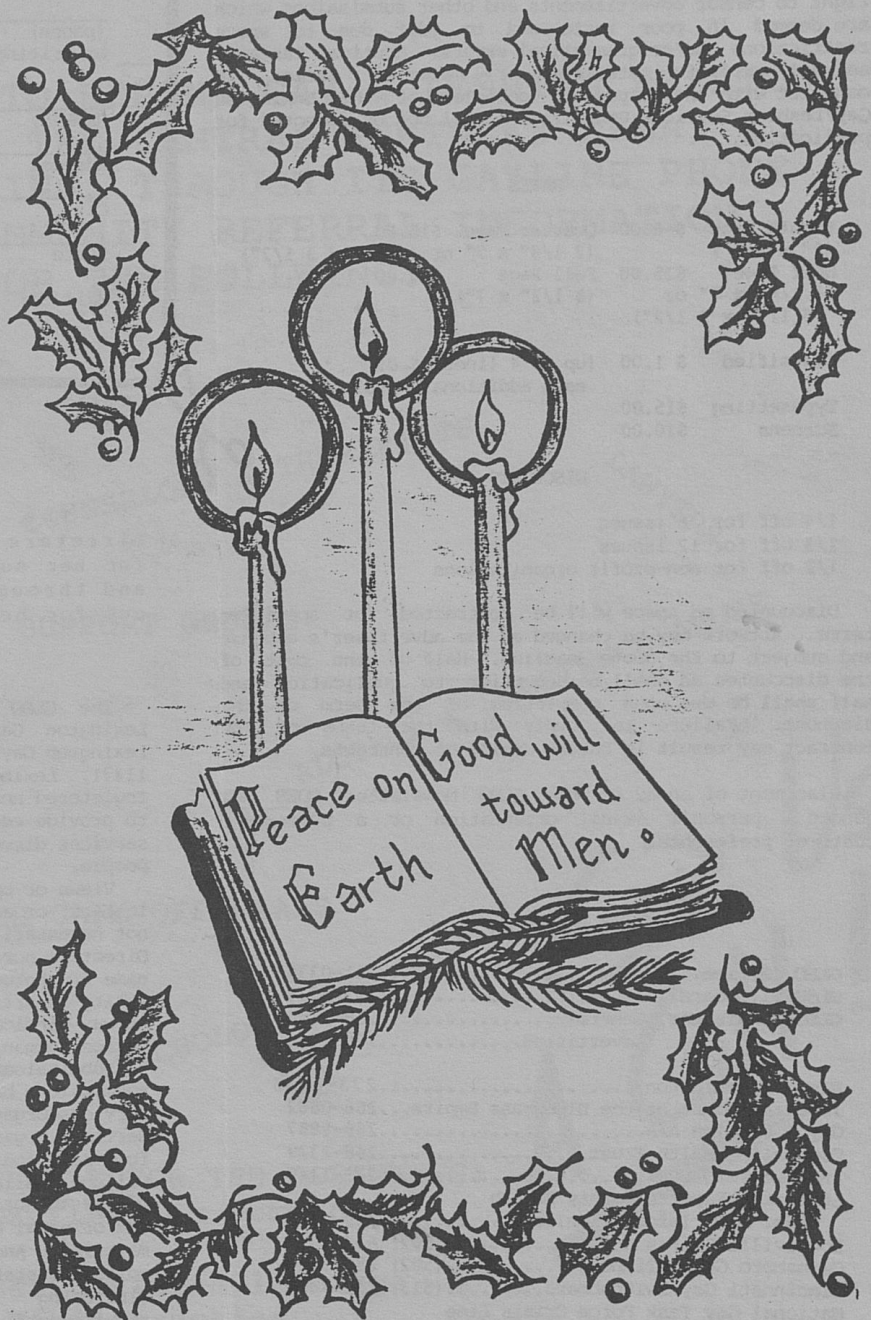

WHY?

They were our colleagues. Like us, they volunteered to come to Nicaragua from West Germany, Switzerland, Spain, France and Belgium to farm, to teach, to provide health care, to help build clinics, houses and schools.

They made a difference in the lives of thousands of people.

That's why they were killed. The people of the United States should realize what supporting the contras really means. Your money goes to fund devastating attacks against the civilian population.

More than 200,000 Nicaraguans have been driven from their land and farms... and our colleagues are among the more than 3,000 civilian casualties. The numbers mount daily.

They have been killed by those who don't want to build, but to destroy. Since 1981, 31 health centers, 58 schools, 11 day-care centers, 291 vehicles, 2,270 houses and 365 other buildings have been destroyed. The contra campaign is an aggression directed against the innocent and defenseless.

This is the end result of "humanitarian" and military aid to the contras: the destruction of the rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

Despite the daily violence, the Nicaraguan people struggle bravely to continue their way of life. They teach us compassion, courage and commitment. We will not abandon them.

On behalf of our murdered colleagues and the thousands of Nicaraguan civilians who have been

killed in the war, we make this appeal to you:

- Speak out against this bloodshed.
- Urge your elected representatives to face these stark human consequences and stop U.S. support of the contras.

We ask you to join with us to support peace and to build projects that will help the victims of war in Nicaragua.

Please contribute now to the emergency fund that we have set up through Oxfam America. Your support is needed to help build health centers, schools, water projects, housing and agricultural projects for the Nicaraguans who have been forced from their homes and land by the war.

Please. Help us. Work for peace in Nicaragua.

LESBIAN OWNED RESTAURANT OPENS

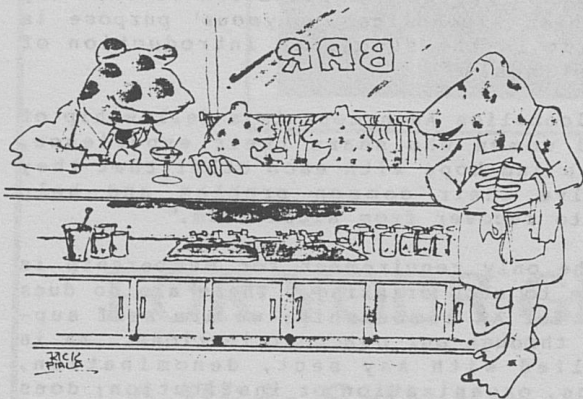
Hey, did ya hear? There's a new place in town! It's a new restaurant called Razzmatazz!

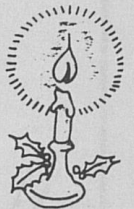
Lesbian Limericks

Perhaps the best explanation of what Gay and Lesbian Alcoholics Anonymous' purpose is all about is the suggested introduction of A.A. meetings.

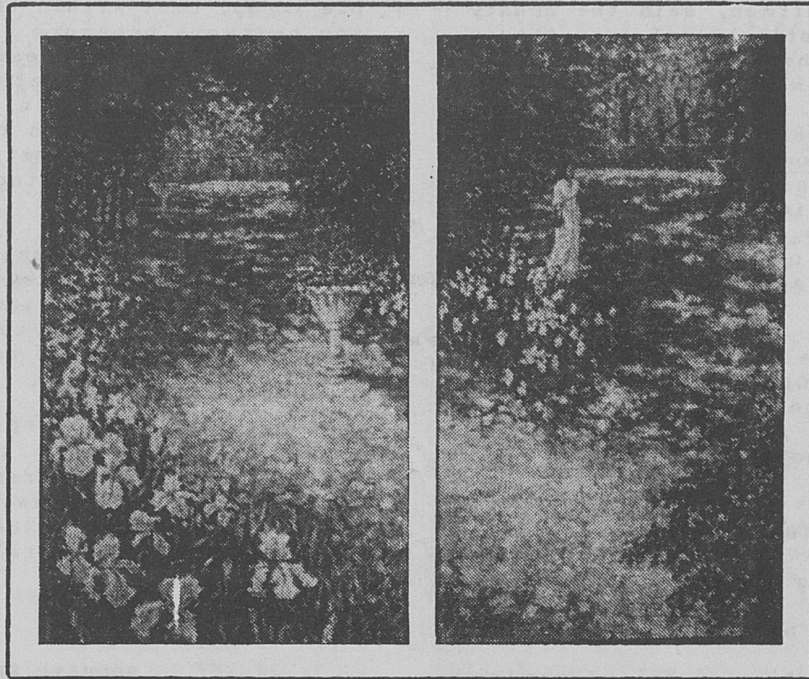
"Alcoholics Anonymous is a fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism."

AA is not allied with any sect, denomination, politics, organization or institution; does not wish to engage in any controversy, neither endorses nor opposes any causes. Our primary purpose is to stay sober and help other alcoholics to achieve sobriety."

LOCAL JUDGE THROWS OUT KENTUCKY SODOMY LAWS

A notice of appeal was filed on November 10th in response to the Fayette District Court ruling that the Kentucky sodomy law was unconstitutional because it violated a person's right to privacy.

Kentucky law makes anal or oral sex illegal for same sex couples, but not for opposite sex couples. District Judge Lewis Paisley said the state may not regulate intimate sexual conduct between consenting adults.

Fayette County Attorney Norrie Wake's assistant, Florence Huffman, said the county thinks the law is constitutional even though it singles out gays because such laws are "necessary to protect morality."

Attorneys for Jeffrey Allen Wasson, who challenged the law's constitutionality on the ground that it discriminated against homosexuals, have indicated that the appeal process may be lengthy, and a final decision may be several years off. Meanwhile, GLSO has set up a special account to hold funds donated to help offset legal costs.

VATICAN GETS BITCHY

Rome - The Vatican reinforced its condemnation of homosexuality in a document that harshly rebuked the homosexual rights movement for trying to change church teachings and civil legislation.

In a letter to all Roman Catholic bishops, the Vatican for the first time explicitly condemned the mere inclination toward homosexuality as an "objective disorder." Previous Vatican statements centered primarily on the sinfulness of homosexual acts.

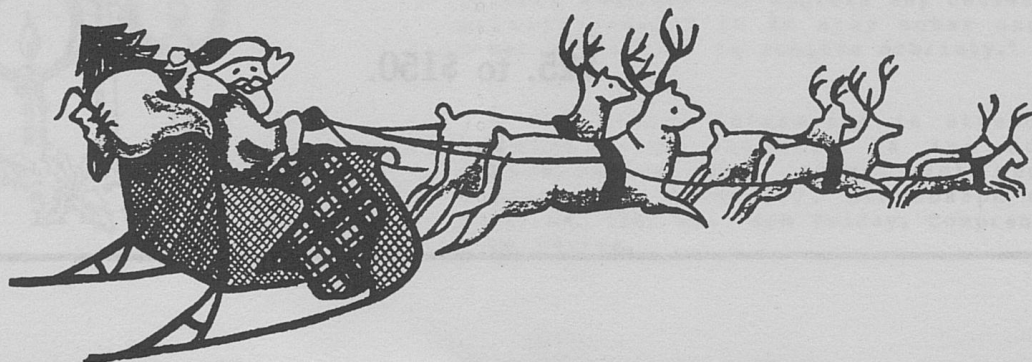
Noting that "increasing numbers of people today, even within the church, are bringing enormous pressure to bear on the church to accept the homosexual condition," the document called on Catholic authorities to resist "an effort in some countries to manipulate the church by gaining the often well-intentioned support of her pastors with a view towards changing civil statutes and laws."

The document, which was made public yesterday, was issued by the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, the Vatican office charged with preserving the orthodoxy of Catholic belief, after receiving the approval of Pope John Paul II.

Senior Vatican officials who asked not to be identified, said the letter was issued partly in response to increasing activity by homosexual groups in Western nations, including the United States. (from the Lexington Herald Leader)

ASK AUNT MARY

Dear Aunt Mary:

I hate it - the holidays, our families, him, myself, all those smiling salespeople with their disgusting little "Merry Christmasses", snow, friends, acquaintances, strangers, parties, all of the known world and probably most of the universe. Everyone is so cheerful and full of love it makes me want to throw up! Who needs it?

After ten years together, don't you think we would have worked out an agreeable arrangement for holiday visits, company, parties, etc.? Well, not even close. He insists on going to all of his family gatherings, office parties, and whatever other events come along, alone - his excuse being that I wasn't invited and it is rude to ask if he can add 'someone' to his invitation. Meanwhile, rather than sit home alone on Christmas, I go out of town to visit my family. We have never been together on Christmas! His family thinks I'm his 'room-mate' (Who are we kidding here? We've been together for over ten years - no one can be as stupid as these people pretend to be!) and my family thinks our relationship is all in my mind since they rarely see us together and never at family gatherings.

Dear Panicked:

Get a grip, dear. You've made it through ten Christmasses, somehow I think you'll pull through one more! As for being a friend for life, at my age that probably won't be a difficult promise to fulfill. And while we're at it, let's take it easy on your friends (not to mention salespeople, acquaintances, strangers, the world, etc.) who avoid you; actually when you get right down to it, they are showing very good judgement, as far as I can determine.

It seems to me that perhaps the problem here goes deeper than how the two of you handle the holidays. If I read between the lines correctly, you are relatively open about your orientation and relationship, while your lover tends to be more closeted. This seems to make you wonder if he places as much value on your relationship as you do. Insecurity is not a pretty thing, but if that is indeed the problem, let's look at it.

First, you cannot drag your lover, kicking and screaming, out of the closet. That is a choice only he can make; you must be able to live with him as he is, not as you want him to be. Now, with this in mind, does the rest of the year with him make the holiday hassles worthwhile? In other words, do the good times outweigh the bad? If not, why are you still with him? If so, why haven't you learned to accept things the way they are? Ten years is a long time to rehash the same issue. What I am suggesting here is that you need to face the reality of your relationship, instead of being angry about the way you feel it should be.

Now, before you come and hunt me down with a gun for being cold and unsympathetic to your problem, let me say that your lover's behavior sounds unreasonable and insensitive. Surely, with an effort on the part of both of you, some compromises can be made to make this less of a problem. And perhaps as a couple you could have a Christmas party for your mutual friends a week or so before Christmas, or on New Year's Eve. Even a little time together just Christmas shopping might go a long way to make you feel less alone during the holidays.

Meanwhile, I suggest you make it a point to develop one new friendship each November. That new friend will be unaware of your holiday disposition and won't know to avoid you until next year. Merry Christmas!
