My Dear Len

You will be surprised to hear
that I have come on with Mr. Major to
spend the summer with his relations
in Virginia and Math. Cochran I did
not want to come I was anxious to remain
with Ma but Mr. M was so unwell and
so low spirited that he would not consent
to come without me I expect to return
to Frankfort in September and remain
there until the last of October and then
we will start for home if all are well
I left them all well in Kentucky
Ma and Cochran were right glad with
me for coming and if I had consulted
my own feelings I am sure I would have
staid with them Pa and Cochran
are busy at work on the house the up
stairs was entirely done and we had been
keeping up there for some time before I
left it will be a very comfortable house
when it is finished tell sister that
