

Murresboro August 24th 1847

My Dear Brother

I received your letter last night, in which I was much gratified and pleased to hear from Texas, for I feared that some one of them was sick, I wrote to Pa immediately on the receipt of Col Morgan's letter, and told him all that would be interesting to you, I also mentioned that Mr Morgan would leave in a day or two for the North, I have received a letter from him since his arrival there, in which he told me, that he had received three letters from his father, the latest dated July 27th, written at home, after he returned from Galveston, I was at home when he got home said all was well at home, -

Mr Morgan's Cousin, Antonio Aug has just returned home, a graduate from Yale College, saw Mr Morgan in New Haven, on his way to see the children, he writes me that Mr Sherman is in Boston, he has not seen him, I wanted to return to Kentucky with him, but Mr Morgan is anxious for me to go on to New York, and spend some time with him, he has advertised for a suit of warm pants and bed warm, and is anxious for me to come on, I have not concluded yet for I do not care anything about it, if I do not go to New York, I will
