

New Orleans Wednesday Dec 15<sup>th</sup> 1847

My Dear Father

We reached this place late Saturday night making eight days from Louisville we were detained on account of foggy or we would have made the trip in six days The Yacht left on Saturday morning for Galveston the day we got here the Planetree however leaves this evening and we go on her the weather is fine quite cool and I expect we shall have a pleasant trip over the Johnston arrived late last evening from Galveston reports the city free from fever I have heard since I came here that the yellow fever is in Houston some think that it is ship fever but no less fatal than the other and cold weather does not stop its progress I think the accounts have been exaggerated for the Johnston brought no news from there and I am sure it can not be very bad.

Mr Morgan heard from his father, he was well and in Galveston no news from Sister, if we have good luck I shall be able to take my dinner with her & her on Sunday

I wrote to Mrs Morgan from Louisville and gave the letter to John Grubbs did she get it tell her I will write a long letter when I get home I mentioned to Mrs to get my cape from Siddle do not forget it and send it to me by carriage tell C M Morgan says dont forget the dog.

It had quite a pleasant trip down the river - not many
