My Dear Len

I wrote to Sister the day after we
arrived in New York, and I believe she gave her a description
of our trip on & which was rather a pleasant one
She must have received the letter long before this
time, and I think has had time to answer it
if you only know how anxious I am to hear from
you all I am certain that you would write my
week, your letters will of course be more in-
teresting to me, than mine would be to you
for you can, tell me about home, - about Cornelius,
the children and in short any thing connected with
Texas California and Kentucky would be read with
the deepest interest by me of which fact I know
you must be well aware of, - then why will you not
write, I have written to Kentucky some four weeks
ago but no answer to my letter yet, I heard from
them however through Mr Furgerson whom I met
in New York, - and I learned from him that they
were all well, this I mentioned in my letter
to Sister, Well, I expect you would like to know our
wherabouts and what we have been doing since
we left home so I will begin with the beginning
