

Harrisburg Feb 9th 1852

My Dear Mother

I wrote home the day after Christmas I believe, and mentioned in my letter that Sister expected to be confined sometime in January knowing that you are all anxious to hear the result I now write to inform you, that Sister has a fine son one week old to day, it was born on the 2th of Feb she is doing better than could be expected indeed you would not know, that she had been sick, to look at her the baby is a large bright looking child, and bids fair to be a spoiled one, Sister says she loves him now, better than all the rest I will not say anything more in his praise now, for if he continues to improve, he will be able to write you a letter himself soon, that will speak for its self.

I have been here a month, but go home tomorrow, the weather is fine for gardening, the peach trees are in blossom, our winter, (with the exception of two severe cold spells,) has been remarkably dry, warm, and pleasant.

A Mr. Yancy, a cousin of Mr. Morgan from North Carolina, is spending the winter with us, they have made several visits to Harrisburg, and are anxiously awaiting my return to New Washington, Col Morgan has not returned home from Philadelphia, but is looked for soon, Sarah is in fine health and if appearances do not deceive, is expecting an addition to her family in the Spring, say about May, she has had a fine
