

Harrisburg, June 11th 1852

My Dear Father & Mother

I have delayed writing for
sometime, on account of our unfixed determination to visit
the North this summer as I wished to tell you positively
whether or not, to look for us. It was agreed upon some
times that we should go, and Fannie and myself would
have spent the summer with you, while Mr Morgan would
have gone further North, but circumstances will prevent
our doing either which I exceedingly regret I had pictured
to myself much happiness in seeing you all again
and then I thought that you would both be able
to return home with us this fall, we think of
boarding this summer with Sister & go home tomorrow
to pack up, and bring a part of the negroes with me,
The balance will be hired out at Lynchburg,
a gentleman by the name of Thur, takes charge of
New Washington, or is to take care of ^{place} ~~the~~ for us,

Mr Morgan's health is very feeble now, for
two weeks we have been in Staunton, for Mr ~~Morgan~~^M
to be under the care of the Doct he has been suffer-
ing with his old complaint Diarrhea which is now
winded, but the pained in his bowels are almost
continual, if it was possible for Mr Morgan to leave
this Country in the summer season he should do
