

Kempville Nov 8th 1852

My Dear Father

I write now, to tell you
that Col Morgan will call to see you on his way
home, he will probably reach there as soon
as this letter and possibly before. He left this
place a week ago to day, intending to go to
the City and from thence direct to Cincinnati
and Kentucky, but the little boy who travels
with him ~~was~~ ^{again} taken sick with chills, and
he concluded to go back to Phil and wait a
few days for William to recover. I received a
letter from Miss Davy written by request of
the Col, and telling me to write to him at
Frankfort. As I have written to you, it will
be unnecessary for me to write to the Col,
and a letter a few days hence would
probably not reach him, before he leaves
for Texas. Mr Morgan's health is about the
same as when the Col left us, at times
complaining a good ^{deal} of pain in his bowels
