New Washington Jan 9th 1837

My Dear Grand Father and Mother

I promised to write you a letter
when I got to Texas and I intend to be as
good as my word, we have been here more
than a month and I have enjoyed myself

staying with me for two weeks and we
have had a good deal of fun trying to
catch Crabs. Carie is going home tonight
and I shall be very lonesome without
her, we had a little dance last night
Grand Pa's Dick, played the fiddle for us
Charlie danced all the time he has
got so fat that his clothes are all too
little for him, he is a great pet with Grand
Pa and he says it will distract him so
much to part from us again that he
is almost bring me earner, I won't
