No Change in Firemen's Squabble  
Trouble on the L & N Railroad Has Not Been Settled  
Engineers Say They Will Take No Part

The trouble existing between the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and the L & N Railroad has not been settled. The company still refuses to take back the eight firemen discharged sometime ago, unless they quit affiliating with the union. Now the engineers on the road are considering the matter, and the outcome may be a general strike. It is said that the eight firemen were discharged simply because they were members of the Brotherhood, but this is denied by the officials. Several conferences have been held of late between the national officers and the members of the local Brotherhood, but no agreement has been reached. Another attempt will be made Monday to settle the differences. Many of the engineers on the road say that the firemen will have to settle their own differences and that they will take no part in the fight.
