

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, December 10, 1985.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 1 p.m. (Eastern Standard Time) on Tuesday, December 10, 1985 in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington Campus.

A. Meeting Opened and Roll Called

Mr. Robert T. McCowan, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 1 p.m., and the invocation was pronounced by Professor James D. Kemp.

The following members of the Board of Trustees answered the call of the roll: Mr. Robert T. McCowan (Chairman), Mr. Thomas P. Bell, Mr. William R. Black, Mr. John S. Cain, Professor Timothy A. Cantrell, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. Tracy Farmer, Mr. George W. Griffin, Mrs. Edythe Jones Hayes, Mr. Henry E. Hershey, Mr. Brereton C. Jones, Mr. R. Larry Jones, Professor James D. Kemp, Mr. T. A. Lassetter, Mr. W. Bruce Lunsford, Mr. Frank Ramsey, Mr. Bobby Watson, and Professor Constance P. Wilson. Absent from the meeting were Governor Albert Benjamin Chandler (Honorary Trustee), Mr. Ronald G. Geary, and Mr. James L. Rose. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Mr. James O. King, Vice President for Administration; Chancellors Peter P. Bosomworth, Art Gallaher, and Charles T. Wethington; Dr. Raymond R. Hornback, Vice President for University Relations; Mr. Edward A. Carter, Associate Vice President for Planning and Budget; Mr. John C. Darsie, General Counsel; Mr. Henry Clay Owen, Controller and Treasurer; and Dr. Paul G. Sears, Special Assistant for Academic Affairs.

Members of the various news media were also in attendance. The Secretary reported a quorum present, and the Chairman declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 1:03 p.m.

B. Minutes Approved

On motion made by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Watson and passed, the Minutes of the October 15, 1985 meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky were approved as written.

C. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

President Singletary reviewed briefly some of the items in PR 1, calling particular attention to the following:

- (1) The naming of Charles T. Wethington, Chancellor of the Community College System, as chairman of the National Council of State Directors of Community/Junior Colleges.
- (2) The Development Council weekend during which Ashland Oil announced a \$1 million gift: \$200,000 for chemical engineering and \$800,000 for an endowed chair in the humanities.

- (3) The establishment of the Thomas D. Clark Fund for History and the Humanities.
- (4) The naming of Professor David T. Kao, Chairman of the Department of Engineering, as one of the nation's top 100 innovators by Science Digest magazine.
- (5) The \$845,000 grant awarded the Appalachian Center by the Mabel Pew Myrin Trust to provide development opportunities for professors of mathematics and sciences in five states.
- (6) The dedication of the W. Hugh Peal Gallery at the Margaret I. King Library.
- (7) The celebration of three anniversaries: a symposium celebrating the 25th anniversary of the founding of the College of Architecture, a seminar celebrating the 20th anniversary of the Center for Developmental Change, and the centennial celebration of the Agriculture Experiment Station.
- (8) The recognition by the American Sociological Association of the Department of Sociology for its emphasis on teaching.
- (9) The dedication of the Lucille Parker Markey Cancer Center on November 18 at which Vice President George Bush delivered the official address.
- (10) The establishment of the first doctoral nursing program in the State in the College of Nursing.

Mr. McCowan announced for those who did not attend the Fellows Dinner that Ashland Oil's gift of \$800,000 for an endowed chair in the humanities was named in honor of President Singletary in recognition of his tremendous contributions to the University through the years.

President Singletary reminded the Board members of the annual University Senate party today from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. at the Alumni House and encouraged the Trustees to attend. He also reminded the Trustees of the meeting of the Executive Committee scheduled on Tuesday, January 21, 1986.

#### D. Personnel Actions (PR 2)

With President Singletary so recommending, on motion made by Mr. Farmer, seconded by Mr. Griffin and passed, the routine personnel actions in PR 2 were approved. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

#### E. Personnel Actions (PR 3A-1)

Acting on the recommendation of President Singletary, Mr. Clay moved approval of the supplemental personnel actions in PR 3A-1. His motion was seconded by Mr. Larry Jones and carried. (See PR 3A-1 at the end of the Minutes.)

F. Appointment of Director, Henderson Community College (PR 3A-2)

Following a brief review of the credentials and experience of Dr. Patrick R. Lake by Chancellor Wethington, Professor Cantrell moved that Dr. Lake be named Director of Henderson Community College. The motion, seconded by Mr. Clay, carried unanimously. (See PR 3A-2 at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Increase in Student Activities Fee (PR 3A-3)

Mr. Cain said he was pleased to recommend an increase in the Student Activities Fee from \$35.25 to \$38.75, effective with the 1986 Fall Semester. He explained that the recommendation follows months of detailed analysis and has the support of the Student Senate and the President of the Student Body. He also explained that the increase was not due to inflationary costs but to provide a tangible increase in programming and services to students.

On motion made by Mr. Cain, seconded by Mr. Black and carried, approval was given to increase the Student Activities Fee from \$35.25 to \$38.75, effective Fall Semester 1986. (See PR 3A-3 at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Report on Gifts and/or Grants (PR 3B)

Without discussion, on motion made by Mr. Larry Jones, seconded by Mr. Ramsey and carried, the report on gifts and/or grants covering the period July 1, 1985 to September 30, 1985 was accepted. (See PR 3B at the end of the Minutes.)

I. 1985-86 Budget Revisions (PR 3C)

With President Singletary so recommending, Mr. Cain moved that the proposed routine revisions in the 1985-86 budget be authorized and approved. His motion was seconded by Professor Cantrell and carried. (See PR 3C at the end of the Minutes.)

J. Proposed Amendment to the Governing Regulations (PR 3D-1)

Mr. Black moved that the proposed amendment to the Governing Regulations in PR 3D-1 be received for preliminary consideration and included on the agenda at the next regular meeting of the Board. The motion, seconded by Mr. Farmer, carried. (See PR 3D-1 at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations (PR 3D-2)

Professor Cantrell moved that the proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations in PR 3D-2 which were received by the Board for preliminary consideration at the October 1985 meeting be approved. His motion was seconded by Professor Kemp and unanimously carried. (See PR 3D-2 at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Candidates for Degrees (PR 3E)

Mr. Brereton Jones moved that the President be authorized to confer upon each individual whose name was listed in PR 3E the correct degree to which he or she is entitled, upon certification by the Registrar and approval by the University Senate that the individual has satisfactorily completed all requirements for the degree for which application has been made. His motion was seconded by Mr. Watson and passed unanimously. (See PR 3E at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Candidates for Degrees--Community College System (PR 4A)

Mr. Black moved that the degrees and certificates specified in PR 4A be awarded to the persons named, upon certification that the requirements for those degrees or certificates have been satisfactorily completed. The motion, seconded by Mr. Farmer, unanimously carried. (See PR 4A at the end of the Minutes.)

N. Change in Division Structure (PR 4B)

On the recommendation of Chancellor Wethington and with the concurrence of President Singletary, Mr. Larry Jones moved that Maysville Community College be reorganized to reflect the creation of three academic divisions: Arts and Humanities, Science and Related Technologies, and Business and Related Technologies. His motion was seconded by Professor Cantrell and unanimously carried. (See PR 4B at the end of the Minutes.)

O. Approval for use of Radio Tower Rental Income for Scholarships at Prestonsburg Community College (PR 4C)

With President Singletary so recommending, Mr. Cain moved that the rental income derived from the lease of the radio tower located at Prestonsburg Community College be placed in a restricted account from which scholarships may be awarded to students attending Prestonsburg Community College. The motion, seconded by Mr. Lunsford, unanimously carried. (See PR 4C at the end of the Minutes.)

P. Naming of University Theatre (PR 5A-1)

President Singletary recommended that the Laboratory Theatre in the Fine Arts Building be named THE BRIGGS THEATRE. Chancellor Gallaher reviewed contributions made by Professor Wallace N. Briggs during his 52 years with the University and said it was a real privilege to concur with President Singletary's recommendation that the building be named in honor of Professor Briggs. Mr. Watson so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Cain and unanimously carried. (See PR 5A-1 at the end of the Minutes.)

Q. Naming of University Center (PR 5A-2)

President Singletary recommended that the Black Cultural Center in the Student Center be named the MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. BLACK CULTURAL CENTER. Chancellor Gallaher concurred with President Singletary's recommendation which he said serves a two-fold purpose: (1) honors Dr. King for his outstanding contributions toward enhancing human relations in society, and (2) serves as an impetus for Black students to achieve high goals and contribute significantly to society. The motion, which was made by Mr. Brereton Jones and seconded by Mr. Black, was voted on and unanimously carried. (See PR 5A-2 at the end of the Minutes.)

R. Doctor of Philosophy Degree Program in Mining Engineering  
(PR 5B)

On the recommendation of Chancellor Gallaher and with the concurrence of President Singletary, Mr. Griffin moved that the Board approve for submission to the Council on Higher Education a new doctor of philosophy degree program in Mining Engineering. His motion was seconded by Professor Cantrell and unanimously carried. (See PR 5B at the end of the Minutes.)

S. Amendment of Bylaws, Rules and Regulations of the Medical Staff, University Hospital (PR 6A)

Following a brief explanation of the proposed amendments in PR 6A by Chancellor Bosomworth, on motion made by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Clay and carried, approval was given to the proposed amendments to the Bylaws, Rules and Regulations of the Medical Staff, University Hospital. (See PR 6A at the end of the Minutes.)

T. Patent Assignment (PR 6B)

On motion made by Mr. Watson, seconded by Mr. Larry Jones and carried, the routine patent assignment as recommended in PR 6B was approved. (See PR 6B at the end of the Minutes.)

U. Interim Financial Reports (FCR 1)

Mr. Clay, Chairman of the Finance Committee, reported that the committee met on the morning of December 10 and reviewed two agenda items to be presented for action. He then moved that the financial report for the four months ended October 31, 1985 and the summary report of revenues and expenditures of the University of Kentucky Research Foundation for the three months ended September 30, 1985 be accepted. Mr. Clay's motion was seconded by Mr. Black and carried. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

V. Capital Construction Report (FCR 2)

After reminding the Board that the Capital Construction Report was in compliance with House Bill 622, Mr. Clay moved that the Board accept the report for the three months ended September 30, 1985. The motion, seconded by Mr. Brereton Jones, passed without dissent. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

W. Report of Investments (ICR 1)

Mr. Lunsford, reporting in the absence of the Chairman of the Investment Committee, said the committee met on the morning of December 10 and reviewed two agenda items, the first of which was the report of changes made in investments for the three months ended September 30, 1985. He then moved that the report be accepted. The motion was seconded by Mr. Larry Jones, and it was so ordered. (See ICR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

X. Investment Policy - Endowment Funds (ICR 2)

On recommendation of the Investment Committee, Mr. Lunsford moved that the University of Kentucky divest all funds invested in any U. S. corporations or banks doing business in South Africa. Mr. Brereton Jones seconded the motion. Mr. Lassetter requested the record show that he abstained from voting. He stated that IBM is totally opposed to apartheid and cited its affirmative action program. He said that IBM operates its business in South Africa in the same manner as in the United States and that IBM takes a neutral position on divestiture which it considers a decision of the individual stockholder. He then said that IBM, by its corporate policy of nondiscrimination, may more effectively oppose apartheid through staying in South Africa than by withdrawing. He added that he is personally confident IBM's program is in the best interest of the people of South Africa. The question was called and carried with Mr. Lassetter abstaining. (See ICR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

Y. University's Role in Economic Development

President Singletary reminded the Board that it is the policy of the University of Kentucky to participate with the State in economic development activities in any way in which it can be helpful. He said that if the Board feels a change in this policy is necessary it should so state. The Board indicated its agreement with the policy. President Singletary then informed the Board that the University is assisting the State with plans for the Toyota Plant, but the specifics could not yet be discussed.

Z. Council on Higher Education Strategic Plan

President Singletary informed the Board that the Strategic Plan for Higher Education adopted by the Council on Higher Education represents a significant development for higher education in Kentucky. He said parts of the plan were very positive relative to the University of Kentucky: (1) For the first time, there is a statement that the Commonwealth needs a statewide comprehensive university nationally recognized for the quality of its scholarship, research and graduates. Moreover, it is stated that the University of Kentucky should be such a renowned institution. (2) The Council's Strategic Plan contains a proposal for full funding of the formula. (3) The Council on Higher Education is accepting a role as an advocate for higher education in Kentucky.

President Singletary explained that statements alone can not achieve these objectives, and he emphasized that it will be necessary to implement them through fiscal and program decisions.

AA. Resolution Adopted

Mr. McCowan then read the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the University of Kentucky Board of Trustees has submitted a request to the Council on Higher Education for adequate state appropriation to help make the University of Kentucky a truly comprehensive institution in Kentucky, which is nationally recognized for the quality of its scholarship, research and graduates, and

WHEREAS, the existence of a high quality undergraduate, graduate, and research institution in Kentucky will greatly enhance economic development and growth in the Commonwealth, and

WHEREAS, the Council on Higher Education has indicated in its Strategic Plan for Higher Education in Kentucky that "The Council is firmly committed to seeing the University of Kentucky emerge as such a nationally renowned statewide institution.", and

WHEREAS, the Council on Higher Education must make program and financial decisions appropriate to making the University of Kentucky such a nationally renowned statewide institution, and

WHEREAS, the Council on Higher Education has recommended to the Governor and the Kentucky General Assembly a level of state appropriation support for the University of Kentucky which should enhance the ability of the University of Kentucky to emerge as an institution nationally recognized for scholarship, research and graduates; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky commends the Council on Higher Education for its Strategic Plan for Higher Education in Kentucky that incorporates several provisions of special significance to the University of Kentucky (commitment to see the University of Kentucky emerge as a nationally renowned statewide institution, support for full formula funding, and its commitment to an advocate's role for higher education), and for its biennial budget recommendations that propose full formula funding during the 1986-88 biennium, plus funding for certain other programs of the University of Kentucky outside the formula, including research equipment, capital projects, desegregation funds, and a new community college at Owensboro, and further

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees urges the Governor and the 1986 regular session of the Kentucky General Assembly to adopt the budget recommendations of the Council on Higher Education.

Mr. Cain so moved. The motion, which was seconded by Professor Wilson, was voted on and unanimously carried.

BB. University of Kentucky-University of Louisville

Mr. Larry Jones asked about the availability of tickets for the members of the University of Louisville Board of Trustees who wished to attend the UK-U of L game on December 28. Mr. Hershey expressed his appreciation for the hospitality extended by the University of Louisville at the game last year and said he hoped that the University of Kentucky could show the same courtesy this year to the members of the University of Louisville Board. Other members expressed the desire that UK Board members having tickets available for the game consider offering them to the U of L Board members. President Singletary said he would discuss the matter with President Swain.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE GOVERNING REGULATIONS

Recommendation: that the following amendment to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky (December 1984) be received at this time for preliminary consideration and, at the next regular meeting of the Board of Trustees, be included on the agenda for action.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined.)

Amendment -- Change Part IV, sixth paragraph, to read:

The ex officio non-voting membership shall include the President, all vice presidents, University Registrar, Director of Undergraduate Admissions, Dean of University Extension, Dean of Students, Professor of Military Science, Professor of Aerospace Studies, and, if they are not already elected members of the Senate, the University System faculty members of the Board of Trustees, the Academic Ombudsman, the Director of the Honors Program, and the chairmen of the University Senate Committees, including University Senate Advisory Committees. All officials mentioned in the preceding paragraph who are not ex officio voting members in any year shall be considered ex officio non-voting members. Other ex officio non-voting members may be added by the University Senate Council for the purpose of supplying information and viewpoints on problems considered by the Senate. Ex officio non-voting members shall enjoy all privileges of the elected membership except the right to vote.

Background: The University Senate often considers matters relating directly and indirectly to both undergraduate admissions and the Honors Program. The presence of the Director of Undergraduate Admissions and the Director of the Honors Program will be of considerable benefit to University Senate discussions. The proposed addition of these two administrators to the ex officio non-voting membership of the University Senate results from recommendations approved by the University Senate on December 10, 1984, and October 14, 1985.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE GOVERNING REGULATIONS

Recommendation: that the following proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky (December 1984), which were received by the Board of Trustees for preliminary consideration at its October 1985 meeting, be approved.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined; proposed deletions are bracketed.)

Amendment #1 -- Change Part X.C.2 to read:

X.C.2. Vacation Leave

All full-time faculty members on a ten-month, eleven-month, or twelve-month assignment basis shall be entitled to [one month] 22 working days of vacation leave with pay [during an] per assignment period. With prior administrative approval, faculty members may take vacation leave at appropriate times during the period in which they are eligible to take such leave; however, each member of the teaching faculty shall be in actual attendance at least until after Commencement and until all reports have been made, and at least three days prior to the first day of registration for the fall semester, unless for special reasons leave is approved. Vacation leave normally cannot be accumulated from one assignment period to another, except [to the extent] that a faculty member on a twelve-month assignment basis may[, with advance approval of the dean or director of the college,] take vacation leave either during the assignment period in which the vacation leave is earned or [within the first two months thereafter] during the subsequent assignment period. Under unusual circumstances, provided it is in the best interest of the University and has advance approval by the appropriate chancellor, a faculty member on a ten-month or an eleven-month assignment basis also may take unused vacation leave during the assignment period following that in which the vacation leave was earned. [All members of the teaching faculty shall be in actual attendance at least until after Commencement and until all reports have been made, and at least three days prior to the first day of registration for the fall semester unless for special reasons special leave is approved.] Pay for unused vacation leave shall be limited to a maximum of 22 days at the end of employment.



[Full-time faculty members employed on an academic year basis shall be on assignment from August 16 through May 15 and are expected to be normally available for participation in appropriate academic activities during this period. To insure opportunities for vacations, faculty members employed on this basis shall be limited to a maximum of two and one-half months of employment in activities funded by the University or its affiliated corporations during the summer period (May 16 through August 15).]

Background for Amendment #1: University of Kentucky policy governing faculty use of vacation leave has been much more restrictive than such policies at most other comparable institutions. The proposed changes in the first paragraph of Part X.C.2 primarily affect faculty on a twelve-month assignment basis and are designed to help eliminate operational problems during summer periods for certain University units, especially the University Hospital. Some of the other changes are intended to provide greater consistency in terminology between the University's Governing Regulations and Administrative Regulations. The deletion of the last sentence in the second paragraph of Part X.C.2 will make it possible for some faculty on regular nine-month assignment basis to be employed for three full months during the period of May 16 through August 15, provided appropriate funding is available from sources such as contracts or grants. This change, which has been recommended by the deans of several colleges, the Vice Chancellor for Research and the Dean of the Graduate School, and the Chancellor for the Lexington Campus, should provide greater incentive for faculty on regular nine-month assignment to obtain contracts and grants which include full funding of faculty positions throughout the period of May 16 through August 15. The remainder (first sentence) of the second paragraph also is deleted since it does not logically fit under the topic of vacation leave.

Amendment #2 -- Change Part VII.A.1, first paragraph, to read:

The basic organization of the educational units of the University System shall be departments, schools, [institutes, and] colleges, graduate centers, and multidisciplinary research centers and institutes.

Amendment #3 -- Change Part VII.A.1, sixth paragraph, to read:

[An] A multidisciplinary research center or institute is an educational unit established for the administration of [interdisciplinary] multidisciplinary programs which are primarily research in nature. [The term "center" may, in some cases, be used as a synonym for research institute.] Such an educational unit is administratively responsible to the Vice Chancellor for Research and Dean of the Graduate School unless the administrative responsibility specifically has been delegated otherwise. The chief administrative officer of [an] a multidisciplinary research center or institute is a director.

Amendment #4 -- Change Part VII.A.6, second paragraph, to read:

The departmental faculty has jurisdiction over matters concerning its internal educational policies, insofar as these do not conflict with those of other departments or with the rules of the University Senate or the faculties of the school or college of which the department is a part. It should hold regularly scheduled meetings and is authorized, with the approval of the dean of the college and the appropriate chancellor, to establish rules for procedure and a committee structure to deal with matters over which it has jurisdiction, copies being filed with the secretary (secretaries) of the school and/or college of which the department is a member. It has primary responsibility for the development of policies on such matters as academic requirements, courses of study, class schedules, graduate and research programs, and service functions. Jointly with the department chairman, it should establish: (1) procedures to be used within the department in making recommendations on the appointment of new members of the department, promotions, reappointments, terminal reappointments, decisions not to reappoint, post-retirement appointments, and the granting of tenure; and (2) the procedures to be used within the department in the faculty performance evaluations and in the preparation of budget requests. The procedures in (1) and (2), except those for the preparation of budget requests, shall include consultation with directors of multidisciplinary research centers and institutes for those faculty who are or will be associated with such centers or institutes.

Amendment #5 -- Change Part VII.A.7, to read:

Staffs of [Interdisciplinary] Multidisciplinary Research Centers and Institutes (University System)

The staff of [an interdisciplinary] a multidisciplinary research center or institute shall consist of: (1) a director who also shall be a faculty member of a department, school, or college; (2) [regular] faculty members on a joint appointment basis; (3) faculty members on a faculty associate basis (each such faculty associate appointed, on recommendations of both the director of the center or institute and the appropriate educational unit administrator, by the Vice Chancellor for Research and Dean of the Graduate School or other administrator who has administrative responsibility for the center or institute); and [2] (4) non-faculty employees appointed for the duration of a specific project [(3) a director who shall also be a member of an academic department].

Academic rank shall not be conferred by an [interdisciplinary] multidisciplinary research center or institute nor tenure acquired solely through service in such a unit.

[An interdisciplinary] A multidisciplinary research center or institute shall be administratively responsible to the Vice Chancellor for Research and Dean of the Graduate School unless specifically designated otherwise. A faculty advisory committee shall be appointed for each research center or institute by the officer to whom the unit is administratively responsible.

Amendment #6 -- Change Part VII.B.5, second paragraph, to read:

The department chairman is responsible for recommendations on the appointment of new members of the department, promotions, reappointments, terminal appointments, decisions not to reappoint, post-retirement appointments, and the granting of tenure. Procedures and criteria used in preparing recommendations shall be those established by the University, the college, and the department faculty. As a minimum, the procedures must include consultation with all tenured members of the department, with the directors of any multidisciplinary research centers or institutes with which the affected individuals are or will be associated, and with all full-time non-tenured faculty members (except those appointed in the research title or visiting series) with the actual or equivalent rank of assistant professor or higher who have been members of the department for two years, except as noted below. All recommendations on matters listed above, excluding reappointments and post-retirement appointments, shall include the written judgment of each consulted member of the department and of each director of pertinent multidisciplinary research centers and institutes, along with the recommendation of the chairman. The following exceptions may be made: (1)

Amendment #7 -- Add as new Part VII.B.6, renumbering present Parts VII.B.6-VII.B.8 as Parts VII.B.7-VII.B.9, respectively:

Directors of Multidisciplinary Research Centers and Institutes (University System)

The administrative officer of a multidisciplinary research center or institute is a director, who also shall be a faculty member in a department, school, or college.

The director of a multidisciplinary research center or institute is charged with the planning, implementation, coordination, and efficient management of the program and activities of the center or institute. The director shall have the same responsibilities as those of a department chairman relative to faculty with joint appointments and non-faculty personnel in the center or institute. The director shall provide recommendations and advice to appropriate educational unit administrators concerning space, financial, and other resources, as well as the identification and appointment of faculty associates in the center or institute. The director shall submit the core budget request for the center or institute and administer this budget after its approval. In addition, the director may have other responsibilities delegated by the Vice Chancellor for Research and Dean of the Graduate School or other specific administrator to whom the center or institute is administratively responsible.

In connection with the above major administrative functions, the director shall seek the advice of the staff of the center or institute,

individually or as a group, or of advisory committees that may be appointed by the director of the center or institute or by the administrator to whom the center or institute is administratively responsible. The director shall speak for the center or institute and be an ex officio member of all of its committees.

Amendment #8 -- Add as Part VIII.A.4.d:

Terms of Chairman and Directors

d. Directors of Multidisciplinary Research Centers and Institutes (University System)

The director of a multidisciplinary research center or institute shall be appointed for a term of six years. A director may be reappointed, however, when an ad hoc committee appointed to review and evaluate the center or institute (AR II-1.0-6) finds that the particular circumstances and needs of the center or institute make such a reappointment desirable.

Amendment #9 -- Change Part IX, footnote, to read:

\* Includes departments, schools, graduate centers, [institutes, interdisciplinary units,] colleges, [and] individual community colleges, interdisciplinary instructional programs, and multidisciplinary research centers and institutes.

Background for Amendments #2 through #9: The University's planning for the future in the Medical Center and Lexington Campus sectors places major emphasis on the creation of several multidisciplinary research centers and institutes, as illustrated by those proposed in the University of Kentucky Five Year Plan 1985-1990. Amendments #2 through #9 are designed to provide modified and new sections in the Governing Regulations which will establish needed policy and procedures relative to multidisciplinary research centers and institutes. The proposed amendments have been reviewed and approved by the Vice Chancellor for Research and Dean of the Graduate School, the Chancellor for the Medical Center, the Chancellor for the Lexington Campus, and the University Senate Council.

APPROVAL FOR USE OF RADIO TOWER RENTAL INCOME FOR  
SCHOLARSHIPS AT PRESTONSBURG COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Recommendation: that rental income derived from the lease of the radio tower located at Prestonsburg Community College be placed in a restricted account from which scholarships may be awarded to students attending Prestonsburg Community College.

Background: When land was purchased by the Big Sandy College Development Corporation, Inc., for the University of Kentucky Prestonsburg Community College, a radio station and tower were located on the property. The sellers and the Big Sandy College Development Corporation, Inc. intended that rental income accrue to the Prestonsburg Community College for scholarship purposes. The deed of conveyance, in part, reads as follows:

This deed is made subject to an outstanding lease on a portion of the within described property to Gordon Collins, Lackey, Floyd County, Kentucky, dated August 1, 1957, and recorded in Deed Book 166, at Page 312; and on and after the date hereof all monies heretofore due to the Parties of the First Part in the form of rentals or royalties shall become the property of, and be due and payable to, the Prestonsburg Community College Scholarship Fund, Prestonsburg, Kentucky.

The original outstanding lease of the radio tower expired of its own terms, and subsequent leases between the University and leasees have been negotiated. The rental income has historically been utilized for scholarships at the Prestonsburg Community College; however, clear authority for this use has been absent. The University's Office of Legal Counsel has advised that authorization by the Board of Trustees for restricted use of the rental income is necessary, since this deed only restricted use of funds derived from leases in existence at the time of conveyance of the property.

NAMING OF UNIVERSITY THEATRE

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve the name THE BRIGGS THEATRE for the Laboratory Theatre in the Fine Arts Building.

Background: Professor Wallace N. Briggs has been with the University of Kentucky since 1933—a total of 52 years. He began his teaching tenure at the University as an instructor in theatre in 1941, became Director of the Guignol Theatre in 1943, and served as the first Chairman of the Department of Theatre Arts from 1966-69. Although he retired from UK in 1981, he continued teaching on a post-retirement basis in the Department of Theatre until the end of the Fall Semester 1984.

In 1971 Professor Briggs received the University of Kentucky's Great Teacher Award and in 1975 was one of the Outstanding Teachers in the United States. He has directed over 200 plays for the University, acted in more than 40 roles, and has taught acting, directing, stage speaking, orientation to the theatre, the teaching of theatre arts, and theatre history.

One of Professor Briggs' goals since reaching retirement age has been to raise money for the Theatre Development Fund. Since 1979-80, he has increased the Theatre Department's Development Fund by over \$9,000.

Because of his contributions to this institution during his years of service as a faculty member, and because of his monetary contributions to the Department of Theatre since his retirement, it is fitting that he be honored by naming the Laboratory Theatre THE BRIGGS THEATRE.

In accordance with University policy, the Committee for Naming University Buildings has made its recommendation to the Chancellor of the Lexington Campus who recommends to the President and Board of Trustees that the laboratory theatre be named THE BRIGGS THEATRE.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY DEGREE PROGRAM IN MINING ENGINEERING

Recommendation: that the Board approve for submission to the Council on Higher Education a new doctor of philosophy degree program in Mining Engineering.

Background: The Mining Engineering Department at the University of Kentucky probably ranks among the three most active Mining Engineering Programs in the United States today. Although the Department is handicapped with a terminal degree limited to the masters level, it is noteworthy that research funding levels currently exceed approximately one quarter of a million dollars. These research funding levels were achieved against additional handicaps involving decreased nationwide research funding, newness of the Mining Engineering Department, and the absence of the stabilizing and enriching scholarly benefits of a Ph.D. program. In view of current levels of performance and future expectations, the proposed doctoral program in Mining Engineering is timely.

The University of Kentucky Department of Mining Engineering is the only one in Kentucky, the leading state in coal production in the nation. After successful introduction of the master's program, a Ph.D. program in Mining Engineering is a logical step to meet existing needs and to achieve full maturity of the mining program at the University of Kentucky

This proposed program, which has been approved by the University's Academic Councils, is consistent with the University's statewide education mission in that it is a unique program not available elsewhere in the Commonwealth. The proposed program is a part of the Lexington Campus Five Year Plan. The current faculty will be able to handle the graduate demands posed by this degree program and adequate space is available. The slight increase needed in the current expense budget is manageable.

AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS  
MEDICAL STAFF, UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL

Recommendation: that the following proposed amendments to the Bylaws, Rules and Regulations of the Medical Staff, University Hospital, be approved (Page 4, Article II, Sections 5 through 9).

(Proposed deletions are in brackets, additions are underlined.)

ARTICLE II CATEGORIES OF MEDICAL STAFF

SECTION 5. Associate Category

The Associate Category shall be comprised of physicians and dentists who are [voluntary and] part-time faculty of the University of Kentucky College of Medicine or Dentistry who hold unlimited Kentucky licenses to practice their profession in the Commonwealth of Kentucky and who have been endorsed by their respective departmental, divisional and sectional chairmen as contributing to the programs of the University. Privileges shall be delineated upon appointment and with each reappointment. In general, admission privileges shall be limited to periods of active involvement in teaching. Members of the Associate Staff do not have voting privileges at meetings of the Medical Staff, but they may attend Medical Staff meetings and serve on standing Medical Staff committees.

SECTION 6. Voluntary Category

The Voluntary Category of staff shall be comprised of physicians and dentists who are volunteer faculty of the University of Kentucky College of Medicine or Dentistry who hold unlimited Kentucky licenses to practice their profession in the Commonwealth of Kentucky and who have been endorsed by their respective departmental, divisional and sectional chairmen as contributing to the programs of the University. Privileges

shall be delineated upon appointment and with each reappointment. Admission privileges to the Markey Cancer Center will be in accordance with the guidelines of that program. Members of the volunteer faculty at the time they request privileges must provide the University Hospital with recommendation of three licensed physicians who can attest to their professional qualification for the privileges they seek, provide evidence of satisfactory staff function from the Hospitals where they concurrently hold or in the recent past have held privileges. They must with each application or reapplication provide evidence of malpractice insurance sufficient to cover the reasonable anticipated risks of their specialty as defined by the University of Kentucky Malpractice Committee. Members of the Volunteer Staff do not have voting privileges at meetings of the Medical Staff, but they may attend Medical Staff meetings and serve on standing Medical Staff committees.

Renumber Sections 6-8 to 7-9.

Background: The proposed changes have been approved, in conformance with the Bylaws, by a two-thirds vote of the Clinical Board and by the Council of Supervisors, University Hospital. They become effective upon approval of the Board of Trustees.

Members, Board of Trustees:

INVESTMENT POLICY - ENDOWMENT FUNDS

Recommendation: that it be the policy of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky to divest any funds invested in any U.S. corporation or bank doing business in South Africa.

Background: The Interim Joint Committee on Education of the General Assembly has adopted a resolution urging the public institutions of higher education in Kentucky to withdraw investments from firms conducting business in South Africa as soon as possible. A copy of that resolution is attached. Divestiture is also a serious concern of the House Higher Education Subcommittee of the Appropriations and Revenue Committee.

Many institutions have chosen to divest, and in fact, the University of Kentucky is presently the only public institution in Kentucky without such policy. The conditions in South Africa have deteriorated substantially in recent months, thereby increasing local and national concern.

First Kentucky Company will be directed to divest any funds invested in U.S. companies doing business in South Africa expeditiously. Divestiture shall be accomplished in a prudent manner considering alternative investments of equal or better potential long-term investment return.

A RESOLUTION urging the public institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth of Kentucky to withdraw investments from firms conducting business in South Africa.

WHEREAS, the government of South Africa has continued apartheid and thereby excludes black citizens from the political and economic processes; and

WHEREAS, the South African economy continues to thrive as a result of investments from United States companies; and

WHEREAS, some Kentucky universities have investments in such companies, although Kentuckians profess to believe in the equal rights of all people to participate in the political and economic system.

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be it resolved by the Interim Joint Committee on Education of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

Section 1. That a copy of this resolution be sent to the president and the chairman of the board of regents or trustees of each public institution in the Commonwealth urging them to divest funds invested in firms conducting business in South Africa as soon as possible.
