Ohio County, I was the Substratum Commission appointed
July 1st 1800 By the Court of said County to take depositions to
perpetuate testimony to establish the title of an Entry made on
the 19th day of July one thousand seven hundred and Eighty of five
hundred Acre of Land on the long falls of Green River in
the name of John Baker to begin at a Sycamore Tree marked
WS at the Mouth of falls Creek &c. Having in pursuance of the
said Entry appointed this day convened at the long falls of Green River
and while there present David Glen Esq. appeared before us and
being first duly sworn on the whole conjured of almighty God
doth depose and saith that in the year one thousand seven
hundred and eighty myself in company with a certain Miller
Stewart was at the aforesaid place mentioned in the depo-
-sition and I saw in the aforesaid Stewart mark the two
first initials of his name WS on a Sycamore
Tree on the upper side of said Creek being in the Mouth of
-fall in said River we then had other sayings to per-
-sue and parted for some short time and by appoint-
ment was to meet again at the same place again
I came there before Stewart and saw in some doubt
some before seen accidents had befallen him I marked
down on a book size D Glen in case if he should come
he would know I had been there this was on the second
or third day of June following but before I left the
aforesaid place Stewart came and informed me that
from our departure he had come and struck Green
River two miles below Panther Creek, is now known
by the name of Rough Creek and the Creek now called
Panther Creek was ^{then} called said Creek and when Stewart
marked his name he called long falls Creek and the
Riffles in the River long falls
Justified by the Oath
did not Stewart Request of You
Should You be called On to show Lees Entry of
three thousand Acre in this Neighborhood that You
would have John Bakers Entry of 500 Acre at the
Mouth of long falls River situated at the same time
wherein he did and desired me to begin at the aforesaid
Sycamore &c. being the Creek and up the River Equal
