

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, September 21, 1976.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met in regular statutory session at 2:00 o'clock (Eastern Daylight Time) on Tuesday, September 21, 1976, in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington campus with the following members answering the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, Professor Michael Adelstein, Mr. William R. Black, Mrs. Robert O. Clark, Mr. John R. Crockett, Mr. L. D. Gorman, Mrs. David Hermansdorfer, Mr. Thomas B. Kessinger, Mr. Michael McLaughlin, Mr. Zirl Palmer, Mr. Frank Ramsey, Mr. Homer Ramsey, Professor Paul G. Sears, Mr. James A. Sutherland, and Dr. John R. Woodyard. Absent from the meeting were Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. Richard E. Cooper, Mr. John R. Gaines, and Mr. George W. Griffin. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Vice Presidents Lewis W. Cochran, Robert Zumwinkle, Stanley Wall, Peter P. Bosomworth, Raymond R. Hornback, John T. Smith, Jack C. Blanton, and Donald B. Clapp; Dr. Robert M. Drake, Special Assistant to the President, and Mr. John Darsie, Legal Counsel. Representatives of the various news media were also present.

A. Meeting Opened

Mr. Sturgill called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. and the invocation was pronounced by Mr. Sutherland. Following the call of the roll, the secretary reported a quorum present, and the meeting was declared officially open for the conduct of business at 2:03 o'clock.

B. Minutes Approved

On motion duly made, seconded, and carried, the reading of the Minutes of the meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees on August 10, 1976, was dispensed with, and the Minutes were approved as published.

C. Report of Nominating Committee

Mr. Sturgill requested Professor Paul Sears to assume the chair to receive the report of the Nominating Committee. Mr. Homer Ramsey, Chairman of the Nominating Committee composed of Mr. Ramsey, Mr. Crockett, and Mr. Kessinger, placed the name of Mr. William B. Sturgill in nomination as Chairman of the Board of Trustees, and he was duly elected. Mr. Sturgill

resumed the chair, and the following names were placed in nomination by Mr. Ramsey and all were duly elected to the offices designated: Albert G. Clay, Vice Chairman; Paul G. Sears, Secretary; Betty Carol Clark, Assistant Secretary.

For members of the Executive Committee the following names were placed in nomination by Mr. Ramsey: Mr. William B. Sturgill, Mr. William R. Black, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. Richard E. Cooper, and Mr. George W. Griffin, and all were duly elected. It was noted that Professor Paul Sears as Secretary of the Board would serve as Ex-Officio Secretary of the Executive Committee.

D. Committee Appointments for 1976-77

Mr. Sturgill announced committee assignments for the 1976-77 year. A list of the committees appears at the end of the Minutes.

E. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

President Singletary did not discuss the items in his monthly report of University activities but did recommend that the members read the report at their leisure. Mr. Sturgill accepted the report, and it was ordered filed.

F. Recommendations of the President (PR 2)

Indicating that the items in PR 2, Recommendations of the President, were routine in nature, President Singletary recommended approval. On motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Palmer, and passed, recommendations in PR 2 were approved and ordered made an official part of the Minutes of the meeting. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Approval of Degree Candidates (PR's 4 and 5)

President Singletary noted that PR's 4 and 5 recommended approval of degree and/or certificate candidates who completed their work at the close of the summer session for both the University System and the Community College System.

On motion by Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mrs. Clark, the individuals recommended for degrees and/or certificates in the two systems were approved contingent upon certification by the proper authorities that all requirements for the degrees and/or certificates had been satisfactorily completed. (See PR's 4 and 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Approval of Capital Construction Projects (PR 6)

President Singletary recommended approval of PR 6, Capital Construction Projects. He added that if there were any questions, Mr. Blanton would be happy to answer them. There being no questions, on motion by Mr. Sutherland, seconded by Mr. Kessinger, and passed, the three capital construction projects recommended in PR 6 were approved for submission to the Council on Public Higher Education. (See PR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

I. Public Safety Division at Jefferson Community College Established (PR 7)

Noting that the 1976 Legislature repealed, effective January 1, 1977, the statute authorizing the security force at Jefferson Community College to operate as "special local police officers", President Singletary recommended that the Board of Trustees in accordance with KRS 164.950-164.990 establish a safety and security department to be known as the Jefferson Community College Public Safety Division effective immediately.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the recommendation in PR 7 establishing the Jefferson Community College Public Safety Division was approved. (See PR 7 at the end of the Minutes.)

J. Budget Revisions for 1976-77 (PR 8)

Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Homer Ramsey, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed, the revisions in the 1976-77 Budget as presented in PR 8 were authorized and approved. (See PR 8 at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations (PR 9)

The next item on the agenda presented certain proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations which President Singletary recommended the Board receive for consideration and action at the next regular meeting of the Board.

Mr. Sturgill recognized Professor Sears, who moved that the first recommended amendment to change Part X-A (Page 31) be amended as follows: 1) delete the suggested addition (physical or mental handicap) from the second sentence, 2) add a third sentence which would read "Additionally, the University shall not discriminate against any applicant for employment because of physical or mental handicap in regard to any position for which the applicant for employment is qualified." 3) start a new paragraph with the next sentence, "Members of the Board of Trustees...."

His motion was duly seconded and the amendment to the first proposed amendment was approved.

The motion was then made that the proposed amendments as amended be accepted by the Board for consideration at the next regular meeting of the Board. Mr. Crockett seconded the motion and it passed without dissent. (See PR 9 at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Audit Reports for 1975-76 Accepted (FCR 1)

Mr. Sutherland, acting for Mr. Griffin, Chairman of the Finance Committee, recommended that FCR 1 be approved as presented. His motion was seconded by Mr. Palmer and passed without dissent. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Revision of Policy Statement on Refunds to Students Upon Withdrawal from Certain Classes (FCR 2)

After a brief explanation, Mr. Sutherland moved that the recommendation in FCR 2 be approved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Gorman and passed without dissent. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

N. Meeting Adjourned

After having determined that there was no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned at 2:15 p.m.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

I. Patent Assignment

Recommendation: that authorization be given to the proper officials of the University of Kentucky Board of Trustees to execute an assignment on behalf of the Board of Trustees to the University of Kentucky Research Foundation of the following application for Letters of Patent of the United States and the invention represented thereby: Sudhakar Neti and Roger Eichhorn, Serial Number 690,838, filed May 28, 1976.

Background: Sudhakar Neti and Roger Eichhorn have invented a Dual Beam Two Component Laser Doppler Velocimeter With Polarized Beams. They have assigned their rights to the invention to the University. In accord with usual practice it is recommended that the University assign the patent to the University of Kentucky Research Foundation.

II. Appointments and/or Other Staff Changes

Recommendations: (1) that approval be given to the appointments and/or other changes which require Board action; and (2) that the report relative to appointments and/or changes already approved by the administration be accepted.

APPROVAL OF CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Recommendation: that the Board approve the following construction projects for submission to the Council on Public Higher Education:

- (1) Alterations to McVey Hall
- (2) Alterations to Taylor Education Building
- (3) Boiler Replacement, Central Campus Steam Heating Plant

Background: (1) McVey Hall was built in 1928 and has been in continuous use since then as a classroom and office facility. With the exception of renovation in the basement area to accommodate the Computing Center, there has been no major alteration to this building since its construction. The purpose of this project is to upgrade the facility to meet current building standards and codes, to provide more adequately equipped classrooms and office space, to provide suitable means of access for the physically handicapped, to meet safety codes, and to upgrade the mechanical and electrical systems. Estimated cost of this project is \$776,000, and it will be funded from the non-recurring renovation dollars in the 1975-76 and 1976-77 operating budgets.

(2) Taylor Education Building was built in 1929 and has been in continuous use since then as a classroom and office facility. The gymnasium and north wing have been renovated, but the remaining area is basically the same as when originally constructed. The purpose of the project is the same as that for McVey Hall indicated above. Estimated cost of the project is \$602,000, and it will be funded from the non-recurring renovation dollars in the 1975-76 and 1976-77 operating budgets.

(3) The purpose of this project is to upgrade the central campus steam heating plant located on Upper Street by replacing two coal-fired boilers (each having capacity of 60,000 pounds of steam per hour) with new coal-fired boilers. The existing boilers were built in 1950 and were not designed to comply with present air pollution regulations. They have not been operated within the last two years as the controlling agency has given permission to operate them only in emergency situations. Since all other boilers in the plant are either gas or oil fired, replacing these boilers will give opportunity to use coal, the least expensive, more available fuel. Estimated cost of the project is \$2,500,000, and it will be funded from non-recurring renovation dollars in the 1975-76, 1976-77 and 1977-78 operating budgets.

ESTABLISHING JEFFERSON COMMUNITY COLLEGE
PUBLIC SAFETY DIVISION

Recommendation: that in accordance with the provisions of KRS 164.950-164.990, the Board hereby establishes a safety and security department to be known as the Jefferson Community College Public Safety Division, effective as of the date of this action: that the Board hereby authorizes the Director of the Jefferson Community College to appoint safety and security officers, to be known as Jefferson Community College Police Officers, and to administer the appropriate oath of office; that officers so appointed shall meet the qualifications attached entitled "Minimum Requirements for the Position of Patrolman"; that all officers so appointed shall be full-time law enforcement officers; that in accordance with KRS 164.955 said officers are empowered to serve process from all Criminal Courts in the Commonwealth; that in accordance with KRS 164.970(2) the Board authorizes said officers to act under KRS 527.020.

Background: At its meeting held on August 8, 1972, the Board authorized the establishment of a public safety division at the University's main campus at Lexington. The security force at Jefferson Community College, which has no formal administrative tie with the main campus security department, continued to operate as "special local peace officers" under KRS 61.360.

The 1976 Legislature repealed KRS 61.360, effective January 1, 1977. Thus, without action by this Board to grant authority pursuant to KRS 164.950 et seq the security force at Jefferson Community College, comprising nine officers at present, will be without authority to operate as of the effective date of the repeal of KRS 61.360.

It is envisioned that the Jefferson Community College Public Safety Division will continue, as in the past, to seek advice and assistance from the University's Public Safety Division when the need arises. However, it is felt that the officers on that campus should continue under the administrative control of the Community College Director.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE GOVERNING REGULATIONS

Recommendation: that the following proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky be received for consideration and, provided at least one month has elapsed, be put on the agenda for action by the Board of Trustees at its next regular meeting.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined; proposed deletions are bracketed.)

First Amendment - Change PART X-A (page 31) to read:

All appointments shall be made strictly on the basis of merit. An applicant for a position shall not be discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, ethnic origin, physical or mental handicap, or political beliefs. Members of the Board of Trustees, except those elected to the Board as faculty representatives or as a student representative, and relatives by blood or marriage of any member of the Board of Trustees, are ineligible for appointment to any position in the University. No relative by blood or marriage of the President or the vice presidents exercising University-wide jurisdiction, shall be employed in a position which carries responsibility for a part of the academic program of the University. Waiver of the above regulations may be permitted by the Board of Trustees on a stated temporary basis, not to exceed two years, when it is otherwise impossible practicably to fill a position with a fully qualified person. The same individual shall not be eligible for reappointment under the terms of this exception unless approval is given by the Board of Trustees. No relative by blood or marriage of any administrative officer of the University, or of any member of the University faculty holding the rank of associate professor or higher, may be appointed to any position in the University over which the related officer or staff member exercises supervisory or line authority. Employment of persons related by blood or marriage within the same department or division must be approved specifically by the President. "Relatives by blood or marriage", as used above, include parents and children, husbands and wives, brothers and sisters, brothers- and sisters-in-law, mothers- and fathers-in-law, uncles, aunts, nieces and nephews, and step-relatives in the same relationships.

Background: This amendment will bring the University of Kentucky regulations or policy statements into compliance with Department of Labor regulations and K.R.S. 207.150 enacted by the 1976 General Assembly.

Second Amendment - Change the first paragraph of PART XII-A (page 45) to read:

Equal opportunities shall be provided for all persons throughout the University in recruitment, appointment, promotion, payment, training and other employment practices without regard to race, ethnic origin, sex, color, creed, religion, age or national origin. Additionally, the University shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of physical or mental handicap in regard to any position for which the employee or applicant for employment is qualified.

Background: This amendment will bring the University of Kentucky regulations or policy statements into compliance with Department of Labor regulations and K.R.S. 207.150 enacted by the 1976 General Assembly.

Third Amendment - Change the first paragraph of PART VII-B-2 (pages 23a and 24) to read:

The Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research is chairman of the Graduate Faculty and the Graduate Council. Under the broad direction of the President and the Vice President for Academic Affairs, he provides general planning, guidance and review for all of the University's endeavors in graduate instruction and research. He bears responsibility for the total research activity of the University, including the University of Kentucky Research Foundation, and for the coordination of research and graduate education. He has direct responsibility for the interdisciplinary research institutes, except for those for which responsibility specifically has been delegated otherwise. He appoints associate members of the Graduate Faculty and recommends the appointment of regular members for the approval of the President. He recommends on the appointment, promotion and granting of tenure to faculty members who may be involved in research and graduate programs of the University. He also recommends on budgets as they may affect research and graduate programs.

Background: This amendment will make the Governing Regulations consistent with University practice since the Board of Trustees previously has approved the delegation of the administrative responsibility for the Tobacco and Health Research Institute and the Institute for Mining and Minerals Research to the Special Assistant to the President.

Fourth Amendment - Change the fifth paragraph of PART VII-A-1 (page 18) to read:

An institute is a unit established for the administration of interdisciplinary programs that are primarily research in nature. It is administratively responsible to the Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research, unless the administrative responsibility specifically has been delegated otherwise. The chief administrative officer of an institute is a director.

Background: This amendment will make the Governing Regulations consistent with University practice since the Board of Trustees previously has approved the delegation of the administrative responsibility for the Tobacco and Health Research Institute and the Institute for Mining and Minerals Research to the Special Assistant to the President.

Fifth Amendment - Change the sixth paragraph of PART VIII-A-3 (page 28) to read:

Search committees for directors of interdisciplinary institutes shall be appointed, after consultation with the Graduate Council, by the Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research or other specific officer to whom administrative responsibility has been delegated [after consultation with the Graduate Council].

Background: This amendment will make the Governing Regulations consistent with University practice since the Board of Trustees previously has approved the delegation of the administrative responsibility for the Tobacco and Health Research Institute and the Institute for Mining and Minerals Research to the Special Assistant to the President.

Sixth Amendment - Change PART X-C-10 (page 42) to read:

[Regular full-time employees of the University are insured under the Basic Life Insurance Program to a minimum of \$4,000 if their salaries are less than \$4,000 and \$5,000 if their salaries are in excess of \$4,000. The premium for this basic coverage is paid by the University. This insurance may be increased optionally to a total of approximately 1 1/2 the annual salary. In addition, all regular full-time employees are encouraged to participate in Basic Medical, Major Medical and accident insurance programs, which programs may also include dependents.]

Regular full-time faculty and staff who were employed by the University prior to their attaining age 60 are insured under the Basic Life Insurance Program for \$5,000. This insurance may be increased optionally to a total of 1 1/2 or 2 times the employee's basic annual salary. The premium for the basic insurance is paid by the University whereas that for the optional increase in insurance is paid by the employee.

Regular full-time faculty and staff who were employed by the University after they had attained age 60 are insured under the Basic Life Insurance Program for \$2,000, with the premium for this basic coverage being paid by the University. No optional increase in this insurance is permitted under the group insurance plan.

In addition, all regular full-time employees are encouraged to participate in the University's basic hospital-medical, major medical, and accident insurance programs which also may include coverage for dependents.

Background: This amendment will make the Governing Regulations consistent with University practice.

Seventh Amendment - Change PART X-C-12 (page 42) to read:

[Faculty and certain administrators are covered by the Total Disability Insurance Program. This program provides income protection through insurance coverage with TIAA and supplemental benefits by the University. Effective July 1, 1970, all regular full-time employees, other than those covered by Civil Service, will be included in this program.]

Regular full-time faculty and staff, other than those covered by Civil Service, are covered by the Total Disability Insurance Program following the completion of one year of employment at the University. This program provides income protection through insurance coverage with TIAA and, in some cases, supplemental benefits by the University. The University pays the full cost of this program.

Background: This amendment will make the Governing Regulations consistent with University practice.

REVISION OF POLICY STATEMENT ON REFUNDS
TO STUDENTS UPON WITHDRAWAL FROM CERTAIN CLASSES

Recommendation: that the following statement be approved for addition to the official policy on refunds of student fees, effective immediately:

A student who withdraws from an off-campus or evening class which is under the auspices of University Extension may receive full refund of all fees paid for such classes provided the withdrawal occurs prior to the end of the second week of the class. A student who withdraws from these classes after the second week but prior to the mid-term date shall be entitled to a refund of one-half the fees paid. If the withdrawal occurs after the mid-term date, no refund will be given.

Background: The present refund policy statement approved by the Board of Trustees on September 18, 1973 is provided for comparison:

A student who officially withdraws from the University after registration but before the middle of the term shall be refunded one-half of the fees paid for that term if by the mid-term date official withdrawal evidence, student records, and identification/activity card are presented to the Registrar's Office. If the withdrawal occurs, or if the withdrawal evidence is presented, after the mid-term date specified in the University Calendar, no refund will be given.

The added statement will provide the part-time, adult students two weeks to determine whether a particular course meets his or her educational needs. The additional time is justified because these students do not have easy access to academic advisors and are sometimes unable to determine early the applicability of the course to their degree requirements. Many of them also encounter unexpected problems related to employment and family commitments.
