Presbyterian synod
Convoocation in
Lexington.

President Patterson referred to the approaching convocation in this city of the Synods of the Northern and Southern divisions of the Presbyterian Church, and expressed his sense of the propriety of inviting these two bodies to become the guests of the faculty and students of the college at a reception upon some afternoon of their stay in Lexington.

He suggested also, that the President and professors of Ky. Universities should be invited to this reception. To determine the feasibility of giving this reception, a subscription paper was circulated, after several members of the faculty had expressed approval of the proposed entertainment.

Musical entertainments proposed.

Prof. Mackenzie addressed the faculty relative to the desirability of introducing as a feature of our college life, a series of musical entertainments which he understood could be provided for at a slight expense, and he moved that Prof. Johnraig be appointed a com. of one

to make preliminary arrangements for such a course. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pryor and carried.

It was suggested by Prof. Mackenzie that President Patterson should bring this matter to the attention of the Executive Com. with a request for a small appropriation to carry out this plan.
