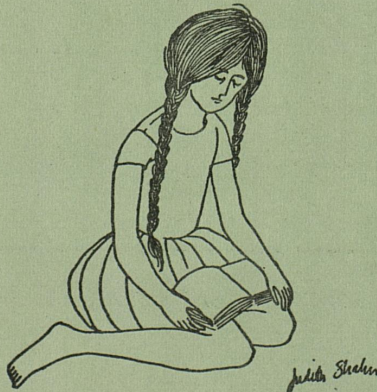
MEDICAL LIBRARY ASSOCIATION CONTINUING EDUCATION COURSE, OCTOBER 27, 1980.

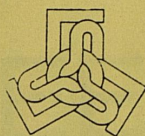
