Every spring it's the same: Student Government candidates litter campus with signs; there's an election; someone gets upset; the losers (mostly) file claims.

Many on this Editorial Board have watched this rigamarole transcend year after year; and this year is no different.

As this set of appeals gets decided, we urge that if someone is found guilty of violating election rules, he or she is held accountable. These appeals, after all, are a good way to show students that SG is serious about accountability.

With that said, though, frivolity doesn't deserve attention. The people who have file claims should ask themselves if those transgressions made any difference in the outcome of the election.

Some of these claims, if true, do garner

Bush departing from orthodox conservatism

Last December, William F. Buckley, aging patriarch of the modern conservative movement, was in Arizona discussing the future of

American conser-



American conservatism.

While Republicans revel in what may be the apex of their political power, Buckley pointed out that President Bush is blurring the philosophical tenets of conservatism by

pursuing particular ends while using an activist federal government as a

When asked by Arizona Republic columnist Robert Robb whether Bush was a conservative. Buckley described Bush as "conservative" But he delineated the difference between conservative and being "a conservative."

Buckley's particular brand of conservatism advocates limited government, personal responsibility, a viable form of federalism, free-market economics and foreign policy concerned solely with self-defense.

Numerous policy enactments of

Numerous policy enactments of
the Bush administration illustrate a
rapid departure from the core principles of conservatism.

Perhaps the most basic maxim of
conservatism is that government
must be limited in size and scope.
Bush, three months into his second
term, has yet to veto a single spending
bill

ernment. The prescription-drug entiernment. The prescription-rug enti-tlement program for senior citizens — which will cost \$500 to \$600 billion over its first 10 years — will be much more expensive than the administra-tion's original projection of \$400 bil-

ore expensive than the administration's original projection of \$400 billion.

Not only is the program prohibitively expensive; it runs counter to the
notion that health care is the personal
responsibility of the individual. It creates yet more dependency on the federal government while encouraging
those who benefit from such an entitlement to use resources less efficiently.

Although it's not feasible that
every form of insurance or service
can be supplied to an individual via
the private sector. the Founding
Fathers intended for states to be the
primary brokers of most communal
efforts undertaken by government.
Bush's No Child Left Behind Act puts
rigid educational policy in the hands
of the federal government while
depriving states and municipalities of
discretionary authority that could be
applied more prudently.

Sometimes, however, states have
mattered too much. In an obvious
effort to curry political favor with
labor in Pennsylvania, Bush imposed
a tariff on steel, driving up costs for
businesses and consumers across the
country from March 2002 until late
2003. Tariffs are a brazen departure
from free-market economics, and a
president who lauds free trade conveniently forgot a most elementary principle to gain political support.

Lastly, the Bush doctrine of promoting freedom around the world—
which supplanted the original ratio-

edom around the world According to the Congressional

Budget Office, federal outlays from the
2001 fiscal year to the 2005 fiscal year
have increased 30.2 percent increase
in total revenues, and it's clear why a
burgeoning federal deficit exists.

Exponential spending increases
in defense, education and health care
have established serious obstacles to
financial solvency of the federal gov-

that would emanate a glimmer of hope were it not for Congressional Republicans — equally culpable in the GOP brand of Big Government. Social Security reform and tax reform are both proposals that would enhance economic freedom and pros-perity in the United States. But, fear-ing the political wrath of the elderly, senators and representatives have dug in.

For the last 10 years, Republicans have controlled both houses of Congress, and for nearly half of that period, the presidency. Citizens wish-ing to see the enactment of more fis-cally responsible government that's less threatening to personal liberty have been forced to choose between strategic damage control and a sym-bolic protest vote for a third-party can-didate.


Are you more the party type?
