

Kentucky State College,  
Lexington, Feb. 13, 1896.

The Faculty convened, pursuant to adjournment, at 3 p.m., to consider the report of the Committee on Entrance Examinations. The Chairman, Prof. Miller, read the report in full. On motion of Prof. Road the report was taken up section by section. There was first some discussion of the relations of the report to existing laws regarding appointments to the State College. This discussion made it plain that no conflict was contemplated.

On motion of Dr. Kastle it was resolved that the report, if adopted, should apply only to the College proper. The report was then considered section by section, and adopted by sections, with amendments as shown in the report. (See p. 112) Prof. Nelson moved that further consideration, and adoption of the report as a whole, be postponed to an adjourned meeting to be held on the second Thursday in March, at 3 p.m.

Prof. Road offered his resignation as Secretary of the Faculty. The resignation was accepted.

The Faculty adjourned.
