Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Thursday, June 28, 1979

The Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 2:00 o'clock (Eastern Daylight Time) on Thursday, June 28, 1979, in the Board Room on the 18th Floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington campus with the following members answering the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, Mr. William R. Black, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. George W. Griffin, Mr. Homer W. Ramsey, and Mrs. Betty Pace Clark, Ex Officio Secretary. Members of the Board of Trustees attending the meeting included Professor Michael Adelstein, Governor Albert B. Chandler, Mr. L. D. Gorman, Mr. Zirl Palmer, and Professor Constance P. Wilson. Mr. Mark Metcalf, the newly elected president of Student Government, who will be sworn in as the Student Trustee at the next meeting of the Board, was a guest at the meeting. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Vice Presidents Lewis W. Cochran, Peter P. Bosomworth, Raymond R. Hornback, John Smith, Jack C. Blanton, and Donald B. Clapp; Dr. Wimberly C. Royster, Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research; Mr. John Darsie, Legal Counsel; and Mr. David Stockham, representing Vice President Robert Zumwinkle. Members of the various news media were also in attendance.

A. Meeting Opened

The meeting was called to order at 2:19 p.m. Following the invocation, pronounced by Mr. Sturgill, the secretary called the roll and reported all members of the Executive Committee were present. The meeting was declared officially open for the conduct of business at 2:21 o'clock.

B. Minutes Approved

On motion duly made, seconded, and carried, the reading of the Minutes of the May 8, 1979, meeting of the Board of Trustees was dispensed with and the Minutes were approved as published.

C. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

President Singletary recommended that his monthly report, copies of which were distributed to the members, be accepted and filed. Without dissent, it was so ordered.

D. Recommendations of the President (PR 2)

After calling particular attention to the appointment of Dr. Herbert Drennon as Acting Dean of the College of Communications, President Singletary recommended approval of the personnel changes recommended in PR 2. Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Ramsey, and passed, PR 2 was approved as a whole. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

E. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (PR 3a)

The appointment of Professor Charles Rowell as Acting Dean of Undergraduate Studies was mentioned by President Singeltary prior to his recommendation that PR 3a be approved. On motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Griffin, and passed, PR 3a was approved as a whole. (See PR 3a at the end of the Minutes.)

F. Appointment of the Dean of the College of Engineering (PR 3b)

President Singletary said it was his pleasure to recommend to the Board of Trustees the appointment of Dr. Roger Eichhorn as Dean of the College of Engineering, effective July 1, 1979. Dr. Eichhorn's name was presented with the unanimous recommendation of the Search Committee appointed to identify and recommend candidates for the deanship. The University is fortunate to have a professor on its faculty of such competence and experience willing to accept this important assignment. President Singletary then introduced Professor Eichhorn and recommended Board approval of his appointment as Dean of the College of Engineering.

On motion by Mr. Ramsey, seconded by Mrs. Clark, and passed without dissent, Dr. Roger Eichhorn was named Dean of the College of Engineering, effective July 1, 1979. (See PR 3b at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Administrative Appointment - Director of the Appalachian Center (PR 4a)

President Singletary indicated that he had urged Dr. John Stephenson, Dean of Undergraduate Studies, to become Director of the Appalachian Center because of his particular interest in and knowledge of Appalchian topics. The recommendation for his appointment came from a Search Committee appointed to screen candidates for the directorship and President Singletary recommended approval. After the introduction of Dr. Stephenson, Mr. Sturgill expressed his deep interest in the Center and pledged his support to Dr. Stephenson.

On motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed, Dr. John B. Stephenson was named Director of the Appalachian Center, effective July 1, 1979. (See PR 4a at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Administrative Appointment - Dean of University Extension and Director of Summer Programs (PR 4b)

The next administrative appointment was that of Dr. Stephen Langston as Dean of University Extension and Director of Summer Programs, effective July 1, 1979. This appointment also comes from a Search Committee appointed to identify and advise on candidates and President Singletary said that it has his complete endorsement. He added that Dr. Langston has served as Acting Dean for the past two years and also been involved in summer programming. It is felt that Dr. Langston is well qualified by experience to handle these programs and President Singletary recommended approval of his appointment.

On motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Griffin, and passed, Dr. Stephen Langston was appointed Dean of University Extension and Director of Summer Programs, effective July 1, 1979. (See PR 4b at the end of the Minutes.)

I. New Academic Degree - Master of Rehabilitation Counseling (PR 5a)

For many years the University has offered a program at the Masters level in Rehabilitation Counseling for which the Master of Arts in Education was awarded. It is felt that it would be more appropriate and more valuable to the students to be awarded a Master of Rehabilitation Counseling. All the individuals and groups involved have given their approval and President Singletary recommended that the Board approve the awarding of the Master of Rehabilitation Counseling to those students who satisfactorily complete the degree program approved by the University Senate. He emphasized that this is a new academic degree and not a new academic program.

Mr. Clay moved approval and his motion was seconded by Mr. Ramsey. Without dissent it was so ordered. (See PR 5a at the end of the Minutes.)

J. New Academic Degree - Bachelor of Fine Arts (PR 5b)

The second degree program for which approval is sought is that of the Bachelor of Fine Arts to be awarded to those students who complete the required course of study approved by the University Senate. Dr. Singletary noted that this was a new academic degree and not a new academic program.

Without discussion, on motion by Mrs. Clark, seconded by Mr. Ramsey and passed, authorization was given to the awarding of the degree of Bachelor of Fine Arts to those students who complete the required course of study approved by the University Senate. (See PR 5b at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Departmental Name Change - Department of Family Studies (PR 6)

President Singletary recommended that the name of the Department of Family Studies: Human Development and Resource Management in the College of Home Economics be changed to the Department of Family Studies in order to reflect more accurately the interest of the faculty and role of the Department. Mr. Clay so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Griffin and passed with all present voting "aye". (See PR 6 at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Budget Revisions for 1978-79 and 1979-80 (PR's 7 and 8)

At President Singletary's suggestion, Mr. Ramsey moved that the revisions in the budgets for 1978-79 and 1979-80 as recommended in PR's 7 and 8 be authorized and approved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Clay and passed without dissent. (See PR's 7 and 8 at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Confirmation of 1979-80 Fee Schedule (PR 9)

Under KRS 164.020, the Council on Higher Education is charged with the duty of determining the amount of entrance and/or registration fees for admission to Kentucky public institutions of higher Education. The fees for 1979-80 were established at meetings of the Council in April and May, 1979. With President Singletary so recommending, on motion by Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Ramsey and passed, the Board of Trustees (1) confirmed changes in the fees charged non-resident students and students in the professional programs in dentistry, medicine, and pharmacy as established by the Council on Higher Education at its meetings on April 11, 1979 and May 24, 1979, and (2) established corresponding part-time and summer school charges under the guidelines of the Council on Higher Education. (See PR 9 at the end of the Minutes.)

N. Capital Construction Project (PR 10)

President Singletary explained the need for providing parking facilities for residents in the apartment type housing complex currently under construction in the area just south of Road "D", and recommended that the Board approve for transmission to the Council on Higher Education a capital construction project for a parking lot associated with the new apartment type housing units scheduled for occupancy in the Fall of 1979 at an estimated cost of \$125,000 with funds coming from the University housing and dining budget. Mr. Clay so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Griffin and passed without dissent. (See PR 10 at the end of the Minutes.)

O. Interim Extension of Employee Benefits (PR 11)

President Singletary said that until such time as the University administration is able to determine a policy relative to the provisions of benefits for employees who elect to continue in employment beyond the normal retirement age (the end of the fiscal year in which age 65 is reached), the Board is requested to extend, on an interim basis, the authorization of normal University TIAA/CREF contributions and/or the accrual of service credit, together with the provision of other normal employee benefits, to the extent available under current contractual arrangements, and in accord with usual University practice, for employees (other than executives and certain academic employees specified in previous action) who choose to continue in employment beyond their normal retirement date, pending the adoption of final regulations pertaining to the employee benefits for such personnel.

Mr. Clay moved approval of the interim extension of employee benefits as recommended in PR 11. His motion was seconded by Mr. Black and passed without dissent. (See PR 11 at the end of the Minutes.)

P. Approval of Agreement Between the University of Kentucky and the Kentucky Medical Services Foundation Inc. (PR 12)

President Singletary recommended approval of the agreement and its addendum between the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky and the Kentucky Medical Services Foundation, Inc. which was negotiated pursuant to the "Board of Trustees Resolution Regarding Medical Practice Plan" adopted June 20, 1978. The terms of the document are essentially the same as those in the agreement approved by the Board on July 7, 1978 for the period July 1, 1978 through June 30, 1979.

Mr. Ramsey moved approval. His motion was seconded by Mr. Black and passed without dissent. (See PR 12 at the end of the Minutes.)

Q. Interim Financial Report (FCR 1)

Mr. Clay, Chairman of the Finance Committee, reported that the Committee had met on the morning of June 28, 1979 and reviewed the items for submission to the Executive Committee for action. The Committee, having found that the income figures and the expenditures and commitments were "on target", recommended acceptance of the financial report for the nine-months period ending March 31, 1979 and for the eleven-months period ending May 31, 1979.

On motion duly made, seconded, and carried. it was so ordered. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

R. Financial Statement of Spindletop Hall, Inc. (FCR 2)

Mr. Clay said the Finance Committee was pleased with the definite improvement in the operation of Spindletop Hall since last year, and moved acceptance of the financial statement of Spindletop Hall, Inc. for the year ending December 31, 1978. His motion was seconded by Mr. Ramsey, and passed without dissent. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

S. Contract with Louisville and Jefferson County Board of Health, et al (FCR 3)

With the concurrence of the Finance Committee, Mr. Clay moved that the Executive Committee authorize the Chairman and Secretary of the Board of Trustees to execute the Fourth Supplemental Contract dated May 1, 1972, permitting the Regional Cancer Center Corporation to become a party to the agreement to use steam and chilled water from the Medical Center Steam and Chilled Water Plant providing steam and chilled water for a number of institutions in the area. His motion was seconded by Mr. Black and passed without dissent. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

T. Contracts with President and Vice Presidents

Mr. Clay indicated that the Finance Committee wished to add a recommendation not included on the agenda. He then moved that the Chairman of the Board of Trustees be authorized to executive contracts with the President and Vice Presidents providing for the terms of their employment for 1979-80. His motion was seconded by Mr. Ramsey and passed without dissent.

U. Designation of Nieman Print Proceeds as a Quasi-Endowment for Alumni Association Awards and Scholarships Fund (ICR 1)

Mr. Griffin, Chairman of the Investment Committee, recommended that a quasi-endowment fund be established from the proceeds of sales of the Leroy Nieman serigraph with a beginning principal of \$35,000 to be invested in the University's Fixed Income Pool, and that income from this endowment be designated for the Alumni Association Awards and Scholarships Fund within the University. His motion was seconded by Mr. Black and, without dissent, it was so ordered. (See ICR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

V. Investment Policies - Current Funds (ICR 2)

Mr. Griffin called attention to the policy statement with respect to investment of available current funds as proposed in ICR 2 and indicated that the committee wished to amend the statement by adding at the end of (4) the following "and/or Capital Collective Temporary Investment Fund of the First Kentucky National Bank." He then moved approval of the policy statement as amended. His motion was seconded by Mr. Clay and passed without dissent. (See ICR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

W. Report on Status of Penn Central Stock

Mr. Griffin reported that through the efforts of the Legal Counsel, certain members of the Board of Trustees, and others, the University has now recovered over \$985,000 of the loss suffered on the investment in Penn Central stock several years ago. The original loss amounted to \$974,000. President Singletary commended the Board, saying that this is an example of what a Board of Trustees can and should do for an institution and expressed his thanks for this latest example of the many and varied contributions which the Board makes to the University.

X. Meeting Adjourned

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made, seconded and carried, the meeting was declared adjourned at $2:50~\rm p.m.$

CONFIRMATION OF 1979-80 FEE SCHEDULE

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees 1) confirm changes in the fees charged non-resident students and students in the professional programs in dentistry, medicine, and pharmacy as established by the Council on Higher Education at its meetings on April 11, 1979 and May 24, 1979, and 2) establish corresponding part-time and Summer School charges under the guidelines of the Council on Higher Education.

Background: Under KRS 164.020, the Council on Higher Education is charged with the duty of determining the amount of entrance and/or registration fees for admission to Kentucky public institutions of Higher Education. Current fees were established by the Council on April 12, 1978 and confirmed by this Board on May 9, 1978. In acting on the current fees structure in April of 1978, CHE indicated that there would be an increase for non-resident students effective Fall, 1979 equal at least to the increase established for Fall, 1978. At its April meeting this year, Council established that minimum increase as the actual increase for Fall, 1979.

In order to compensate for the loss of capitation monies in the fields of medicine, dentistry and pharmacy, the University of Kentucky and the University of Louisville proposed to the Council that fees for professional students in those areas be further increased, and at the Council's May meeting, an additional amount of \$285 per year was approved for each of these programs.

The complete schedule recommended for adoption follows. It should be noted that charges for part-time and Summer School students are derived, as the Council has directed, from the semester rate using this institution's definition of what constitutes a full-time load for each level and program area. Further, all charges reflect the \$3.00 per semester increase in the Activity Fee approved by this Board in May of last year.

INTERIM EXTENSION OF EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

Recommendation:

That the Board extend, on an interim basis, the authorization of normal University TIAA-CREF contributions and/or the accrual of service credit, together with the provision of other normal employee benefits, to the extent available under current contractual arrangements, and in accord with usual University practices, for employees (other than executives and certain academic employees specified in previous action) who choose to continue in employment beyond their normal retirement date, pending the adoption of final regulations pertaining to the employee benefits for such personnel.

Background:

On December 12, 1978, the Board took action to establish a normal retirement date (the end of the fiscal year in which they reach age 65) for University employees; a mandatory retirement age of 70 was established for all employees except those in high policymaking positions and those serving under a contract of unlimited tenure. This action was taken to bring the University into compliance with the 1978 amendments to the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967 which became effective January 1, 1979.

On May 25, 1979, the Department of Labor published final regulations interpreting the law and otherwise dealing with the provision of benefits for employees who elect to continue in employment beyond the normal retirement date.

The University administration is currently in the process of analyzing the final regulations, negotiating with the various providers of employee benefits, and drafting University regulations which will be recommended to the Board for final University action.

The present action simply provides for the extension of all benefits, on an interim or month-to-month basis, pending a formal recommendation as to the provision of benefits for employees between 65 and 70 years of age.

Approval of Agreement Between University of Kentucky and Kentucky Medical Services Foundation, Inc.

Recommendation: that the Board approve the attached agreement between the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky and Kentucky Medical Services Foundation, Inc. which was negotiated pursuant to the "Board of Trustees Resolution Regarding Medical Practice Plan" adopted on June 20, 1978.

Background: The Board action on June 20, 1978 provided that:

"The President is authorized to negotiate and execute a contract subject to approval of the Board of Trustees, with an appropriately qualified organizational entity for carrying out necessary functions and assuming the responsibilities involved in the administration of income for professional services under the plan."

Kentucky Medical Services Foundation, Inc. meets the "criteria" specified under Section III A for the appropriately qualified organization. The attached agreement conforms to the provisions of the June 20 Board resolution and specifically satisfied the "conditions" set forth in Section III B.

The terms of the attached document are essentially the same as those in the agreement approved by the Board on July 7, 1978 for the period July 1, 1978 through June 30, 1979. The document has been updated to reflect dates in the new contract period, eliminate portions related to the transition from the old to new plan, and revise the dollar amounts due the University under Section 5, C and D. The dollar amounts have been revised to reflect the results of a cost study and increased costs for 1979-80. The amount for professional liability insurance has been reduced from \$228,000 to \$180,000 and the amount for expenses attendant to the production of clinical income has been increased from \$700,000 to \$1,140,000.

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this ______day of _________, 1979, by and between the BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY, a statutory body corporate existing pursuant to Section 164.100 et seq of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (hereinafter referred to as the University) and KENTUCKY MEDICAL SERVICES FOUNDATION, INC., a non-stock, non-profit corporation formed pursuant to Chapter 273 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (hereinafter referred to as the Foundation).

WITNESSETH:

Section 1. RECITALS

- A. Foundation is organized for the purposes stated in its Articles of Incorporation as a non-stock, non-profit corporation and will use and apply the whole or any part of its income and principal exclusively for charitable, scientific, or educational purposes at or for the benefit of, the University of Kentucky Medical Center.
- B. A substantial number of University's faculty in its College of Medicine have heretofore executed agreements with Foundation, known as "Practice Agreements and Assignments" whereby said faculty have assigned to Foundation their professionally generated clinical income.
- C. The recruitment and retention of the members of the medical faculty of the University will be improved by permitting the said members to supplement, by income from the practice of medicine, the salaries provided by the University.
- D. The University recognizes that the medical practice activities of its faculty members can be conducted in a more efficient and economical manner if those faculty members who

produce income are permitted, through the medium of the Foundation, to exercise a larger voice in the expenditure of the funds so produced.

- E. The University has heretofore established, in addition to its previously adopted Physicians Service Plan, a "geographic full-time medical service plan", the said geographic full-time plan having been adopted on June 20, 1978; said action is hereby incorporated by reference as if set out in full herein.
- F. The aforementioned action of University's Board of Trustees authorized the University's President to negotiate and execute a contract, subject to the approval of said Board, with an appropriately qualified entity for carrying out necessary functions and assuming the responsibilities involved in the administration of income for professional services under the plan.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows: Section 2. DEFINITIONS

- A. "The Plan" means the geographic full-time medical service plan for the University of Kentucky College of Medicine established by action of the Board of Trustees of said University dated June 20, 1978.
- B. "Clinical income" means (i) all payments for professional services rendered to or with respect to patients whether denominated as diagnosis, treatment, evaluation, or consultation and whether said payments be characterized as fees, retainers, or otherwise, and (ii) all payments whether direct or in kind, (excluding actual travel costs) for oversight or administration of, or consultation with, facilities, programs, or other operations providing care, services or evaluation relating to patients, and (iii) witness fees or other payments relating to depositions or other evaluations in the capacity of an expert witness. Provided, however, that nothing contained herein shall be deemed

to include in the term "clinical income" any item excluded therefrom by paragraph II, B of the plan.

C. "Practice agreements" means those documents, denominated Practice Agreements and Assignments heretofore executed by certain members of University's faculty, the University, The Fund for Advancement of Education in the University of Kentucky Medical Center and the Foundation.

Section 3. NATURE OF THE AGREEMENT

Pursuant to Paragraph III, A. of the aforementioned action of University's Board of Trustees dated June 20, 1978, University hereby recognizes Foundation as an "appropriately qualified organizational entity" as described therein for carrying out necessary functions and assuming the responsibilities involved in the administration of income for professional services under University's "geographic full-time medical services plan". Section 4. BILLING AND COLLECTION

Foundation agrees that it will accept, pursuant to practice agreements, the assignment of all clinical income by participants in the plan and, in accordance with such assignment, agrees to bill the amount of duly established charges for professional services to parties determined to be responsible for payment of such charges, with the exception of the billing and collection of the professional component of combined charges for institutional (hospital and clinical) and professional services. University hereby agrees to bill and collect said professional component of combined charges in accordance with University policies and procedures and to remit monthly to Foundation the amount collected which is attributable to the professional component of said combined charges. The determination of the amount collected which is attributable to professional components of such charges will be in accordance with the existing

basis and method utilized by University for such determination.

Section 5. REIMBURSEMENT OF UNIVERSITY

- A. In accord with paragraph II, D. 2 of the plan, the parties recognize that Foundation must reimburse University for actual expenses incurred by it which are attendant to the production of clinical income.
- B. To provide for said reimbursement, Foundation agrees that it will, on or before the first working day of each month in which reimbursable expenses are due as provided hereinafter, deposit the funds necessary to make such payments in a separate account maintained by it and that funds held in the said account will be invested only in accord with the provisions of Section 16 hereof.
- C. Foundation agrees to pay to University, from said account, as reimbursement for the provision of professional liability insurance, the sum of One Hundred Eighty Thousand (\$180,000.00) Dollars in twelve (12) equal monthly installments, the first said installment being due and payable on July 31, 1979 and monthly thereafter until June 30, 1980.
- D. Foundation agrees to pay to University, from said account, as reimbursement for the remainder of the expenses attendant to the production of clinical income, University's actual annual costs, not to exceed the sum of One Million One Hundred Forty Thousand (\$1,140,000.00) Dollars. Payments hereunder shall be made in twelve (12) monthly installments of ninety-five thousand (\$95,000.00) dollars each on the dates provided in paragraph C. hereinabove.
- E. Foundation and University agree to jointly develop a methodology during the term of this contract to determine the actual cost to University attendant to the production of clinical income.

F. In addition to the above, Foundation agrees that it will reimburse University for all "plan income", as that term is defined in paragraph II, C., 2 of the plan, paid to faculty by University.

Section 6. ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT FUND

- A. Consonant with Section II, D. 3 of the plan adopted by University's Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978. Foundation agrees that it will pay to The Fund for Advancement of Education and Research in the University of Kentucky Medical Center (hereinafter Fund), an amount equal to seven (7%) percent of the actual clinical income collected by said Foundation. The Fund will deposit said payments in an account maintained for the purpose of providing an academic enrichment fund to be used by the Dean of the College of Medicine in support of the programs of said College and for related purposes. Amounts due hereunder will be computed by Foundation on a monthly basis as income is received and remitted to the Fund within ten (10) days after the close of each monthly accounting period.
- B. Foundation further agrees that it will deposit, in an account maintained by Foundation, on the same basis as provided in subsection A. hereinabove, an additional amount equal to three (3%) percent of the actual clinical income collected by said Foundation, said funds to be used by the Dean of the College of Medicine for the enrichment of the programs of the College and for related purposes in his sole discretion.

Section 7. PARTICULAR COVENANTS OF THE FOUNDATION

A. Foundation's Articles of Incorporation, as filed with the Secretary of State of the Commonwealth of Kentucky on

- Jume 19, 1978, have been inspected by the University as a condition precedent to University's entry into this agreement.

 Foundation covenants that it will not, absent the written agreement of the University, amend or otherwise alter said Articles or adopt any by-law or other operating practice which would effectively alter the character of said Foundation.
- B. Foundation covenants that it will not engage in the practice of medicine, nor will it solicit, administer, receive, perform or accept any gift, grant, devise, bequest, contract or other arrangement with or from any governmental unit, entity, or subdivision or any person, corporation, partnership, association or other entity whatsoever except as specifically permitted herein. Provided, however, that nothing contained herein shall be construed to prohibit the Foundation (subject to the approval of the Dean of the College of Medicine) from negotiating and executing contracts providing exclusively for professional services by faculty who have executed practice agreements.
- C. Foundation covenants that it will not merge with any other corporation or convey any substantial portion of its assets to any other corporation, partnership, or other entity except as specifically provided herein and that, in the event of its dissolution its Board of Directors shall cause its assets to be applied and distributed as follows: (a) all liabilities and obligations of the corporation shall be paid, satisfied and discharged, or adequate provisions shall be made therefor; (b) assets held by the corporation upon a condition which occurs by reason of the dissolution, shall be returned, transferred or conveyed in accordance with such requirements; and (c) all of the remaining assets of the corporation shall be transferred or conveyed to the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, or its suc-

cessor, to be used for medical education and research, if said University or its successor, shall qualify as a public corporation and an instrumentality of the State of Kentucky or as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended; and if said University or its successor shall not so qualify, then to some other organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, or scientific purposes in the field of medicine as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended.

Section 8. MEMBERSHIP AND BENEFITS

- A. University agrees that it will assist the Foundation to enforce the terms of the practice agreements entered into by members of University's clinical departments of its College of Medicine by requiring adherence to said agreements as a condition of continued employment as a member of University's faculty.
- B. University agrees that it will require, as a condition of employment as a member of University's faculty in a clinical department in which a majority of the faculty members have executed practice agreements, that new members of its faculty execute said practice agreement in form identical to said agreements heretofore executed or as the form of same may be modified by mutual agreement of the parties hereto from time to time.
- C. Foundation agrees that it will not, absent the written consent of University, bill for, collect or administer any item of income for any person or entity not eligible for membership in the "plan", nor will it permit persons not eligible for such

membership to serve on its Board of Directors, nor will it provide any benefit or other thing of value to any person or entity not eligible for such membership except for (i) termination benefits to formerly eligible members as provided by action of Foundation's Board of Directors or (ii) incidental benefits indirectly accruing to employees of the Medical Center by virtue of Foundation's activicies.

D. Foundation agrees that it will strictly enforce the terms of its practice agreements, report promptly to University in the event any individual fails or refuses to abide thereby and join with University in any appropriate action, in law or equity, necessary to secure compliance therewith.

Section 9. PERSONNEL

The parties recognize the Foundation must employ various individuals to carry out its functions hereunder; however, the parties also recognize, and hereby declare their intention to adhere to, those provisions of the plan adopted by University's Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978, particularly those portions which provide that University must retain responsibility and authority for the appointment of faculty and house staff, the determination of institutional staffing patterns and the maintenance of balance among programs and their component activities.

Accordingly, with respect to employment of personnel by Foundation, the parties agree as follows:

A. Foundation staff

The Foundation may employ an executive director and such assistants, including secretarial and clerical personnel as may be determined by its Board of Directors to be necessary to permit said Foundation to bill and collect professional fee income and to administer its funds in accord with the terms of the geographic full-time plan. Such personnel will not be provided

office space at the University Medical Center.

B. Other personnel

During the term of this contract Foundation agrees that it will not employ persons to perform services in University's patient care or college programs. Provided, however, that this provision shall not be construed to prohibit specific agreements between the parties whereby University will employ personnel for such service and/or research duties with reimbursement of salary, fringe benefits and other direct costs by Foundation. Where such personnel are employed for service in a specific department or unit, employment will not occur unless (i) the department or unit where service is to be performed has consented in writing to said appointment, (ii) the Dean of the College of Medicine has approved the employment and the job description related thereto and (iii) funds for the salary, fringe benefits, and other costs related to said employee are either on hand or reasonably anticipated in the departmental or unit budget.

C. Equal opportunity-affirmative action

Foundation agrees that it will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age or handicap. The Foundation agrees that it will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age or handicap. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising; lay-off or termination; rates of pay or other compensation; and selection for training. The Foundation agrees that it will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin,

age or handicap. The Foundation agrees that it will indemnify and save harmless the University, the Board of Trustees of the University including the individual members thereof, officers, agents and employees of the University by reason of any action at law or equity or by reason of any administrative proceeding initiated by any person arising out of any such employment action or practice of Foundation, including the payment of attorney fees and other costs of such action or proceeding.

Section 10. USE OF UNIVERSITY FACILITIES

The parties recognize that paragraphs III, B. 4, b, d, g and i of the "geographic full-time plan" adopted by University's Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978 require that institutional control be maintained with respect to direction and supervision of institutional activities and programs, assignment and use of space in institutional facilities, determination of goals, objectives and priorities and the maintenance of balance among programs and their component activities.

Accordingly, Foundation and University agree that University will provide Ambulatory Floors 2, 3, 4 and 5 of University Hospital, together with the Ophthalmology Clinic, the Family Practice Clinic and the Emergency Room (exclusive of faculty offices and classroom space contained therein) and other space officially designated for the conduct of the patient care operation.

With respect to any other facilities which University may from time to time provide to Foundation, Foundation shall be deemed a licensee without any property right whatsoever in said premises or facilities and shall, upon demand of University, vacate same.

Section 11. MEDICAL RECORDS

The parties agree that all medical records relating to the care of patients in University facilities or as a part of

University programs, are and shall remain the property of University and that Foundation has no right or property interest therein. Provided, however, that nothing herein shall be construed to limit access to said records by members of University's faculty, staff, and students pursuant to existing University procedures. Provided, further, that University agrees to provide or make available to Foundation such information and data from patient records and program data maintained by University as may be necessary for Foundation to perform its billing and collection functions herein provided, including such information and data as may be necessary to meet the requirements of third-party or other payors as the basis for payment for services.

Section 12. INSPECTION AND AUDIT

Foundation agrees that, in accord with paragraph III, B., 1. of the action of University's Board of Trustees dated June 20, 1978, its books, record and accounts are open at all reasonable times to inspection and audit by appropriately designated University representatives.

The parties agree that the University's Internal Auditors will conduct an audit of Foundation's operations and accounts for the period ending June 30, 1979, and such other audits including audits to determine compliance with this agreement, the terms of the action of University's Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978, and the terms of the departmental agreements referred to in Section 17 hereof, as may be specified by the University of Kentucky Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer, and that Foundation's agents and employees will cooperate to the fullest extent possible with University's auditors designated to conduct same. Further, the parties agree that a firm of Certified Public Accountants mutually agreeable to the parties will be employed by the Foundation to perform an independent audit of

the Foundation's books, records and accounts for the year ended June 30, 1980.

Foundation agrees that it will furnish to University the following reports:

Annually

Audited Financial Statements, to include:

- Opinion of independent Certified Public
 - Accountants Balance Sheet
- Statement of Changes in Fund Balances Statement of Current Revenues and Expenditures
 - Supplementary Schedules

Monthly

Financial Statements, to include:

- Balance Sheet
- Statement of Operations Gross Billings
- Collections
- Financial Allowances
- Bad Debts

Aging Trial Balance of Accounts Receivable, by:

- Patient Liability
- Third party payor

Reports of Delinquent Account Activity, to include:

- Referrals
- Collections
- Close and returns

Section 13. DEFAULT

A. In the event of any failure of Foundation to pay any sum due to University hereunder within thirty (30) days after written notice of such default shall have been mailed to Foundation, or any failure to perform any other of the terms, conditions or covenants of this agreement to be observed or performed by Foundation for more than thirty (30) days after written notice of such default shall have been mailed to Foundation, or if Foundation shall become bankrupt or insolvent, or file any debtor proceedings, or take or have taken against Foundation in

any court pursuant to any statute either of the United States or of any State a petition in bankruptcy or insolvency or for reorganization or for the appointment of a receiver or trustee of all or a portion of Foundation's property, or if Foundation makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or petitions for or enters into an arrangement therewith, then University may terminate this agreement. Provided however, that should any default occur which cannot reasonably be corrected within such thirty (30) day period then Foundation shall have such additional time to correct said default as may be reasonably necessary if Foundation promptly initiates, and expeditiously carries out, appropriate action to correct such default.

B. University may at its election terminate this agreement with respect to any department without termination of the entire agreement for the same reasons and in the same manner as provided hereinabove.

Section 14. PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to provide that any member of University's clinical faculty, house staff or student is acting as an agent of Foundation when providing care to patients in University facilities or as a part of an approved University program. University agrees that, when so acting, said faculty, house staff and students shall be considered agents of said University and that payment of claims or judgments may be made on their behalf from the fund provided pursuant to KRS 164.941, or other University funds or funds provided through any policy or policies of insurance maintained for said purpose.

Section 15. APPLICATION OF INCOME

University agrees that it will not, during the operation of this contract, cause charges for services rendered after July 1, 1978 by members of the faculty who have executed Practice

Agreements and Assignments to be deposited in the accounts of the Fund for Advancement of Education and Research in the University of Kentucky pursuant to the provisions of University of Kentucky Administrative Regulation AR II-4.0-1; deposits of such charges attributable to faculty who have not executed said Practice Agreements and Assignments shall continue pursuant to said regulation. Section 16. MANAGEMENT AND INVESTMENT POLICIES

The parties recognize and agree that the reimbursement of University costs incurred attendant to the production of professional income and the provision of a sum equal to ten (10%) percent of Foundation's gross income for the purpose of providing an academic enrichment fund for University's College of Medicine constitute the second and third charges, respectively, upon Foundation's gross income, the first charge being Foundation's ordinary and necessary expenses incurred in billing and collecting said income and providing for the central administration of Foundation.

Accordingly, Foundation agrees that it will deposit the funds necessary to meet its obligations for reimbursement of the University and the provision of the aforementioned academic enrichment fund in a separate account as received and that the funds in said account shall be invested only in the following:

(1) direct obligations of the United States Treasury: (2) other appropriate securities issued by federal agencies (including the Federal National Mortgage Association, the Export Import Bank, Federal Intermediate Credit Bank, Federal Home Loan Banks, Federal Land Banks); and (3) certificates of deposit collateralized by direct obligations of the federal government, federal agency obligations which qualify for direct investment under this recommendation, general obligations of the Commonwealth of Kentucky or obligations of the University of Kentucky.

Foundation shall be entitled to the investment income derived from

said account.

Section 17. ADMINISTRATION OF DEPARTMENTAL FUNDS

A. Foundation agrees that it will, after making provision for: (i) the costs of its administration and costs relating to billing and collection, (ii) reimbursement of University expenses pursuant to Section 5 hereof and (iii) the College of Medicine Academic Enrichment Fund pursuant to Section 6 hereof, maintain its accounts in such a manner that income attributable to the professional clinical activities of each of the following departments or divisions shall be shown separately on books maintained by the Foundation from any other fund or funds held by said Foundation:

Anesthesiology
Diagnostic Radiology
Emergency Medicine
Family Practice
Medicine
Neurology
OB-GYN
Ophthalmology
Pathology
Pediatrics
Radiation Medicine
Surgery

B. Thereafter, Foundation agrees that it will expend the funds maintained by it in the aforementioned accounts only in accord with the departmental or divisional agreement relating to each department or division. Said departmental agreements are recognized as a material portion of this agreement. Therefore the parties agree that University shall retain custody of all funds accruing to the account of departments for which an approved departmental agreement has not been executed. Said departmental or divisional agreements may be amended from time to time, as provided in said agreements, with the approval of the Dean of the College of Medicine.

Section 18. NOTICES

All notices, demands and requests hereunder shall be in writing and shall be given by United States Registered or Certified Mail or by messenger delivery, in the case of University to:

Each party may from time to time change its address for purposes of notice by giving to the other party notice of such change of address. Any notice, demand or request given by United States Registered or Certified Mail, as provided herein, shall be deemed served on the date it is deposited in the United States mails properly addressed and with postage fully prepaid.

SECTION 19. TERM

The term of this agreement shall begin on July 1, 1979, and end on June 30, 1980.

ADDENDUM

THIS ADDENDUM, made and entered into this _____ day of ________, 1979, by and between the BOARD OF TRUSTEES

OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY, a statutory body corporate existing pursuant to Section 164.100 et seq. of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (hereinafter referred to as the "University") and KENTUCKY MEDICAL SERVICES FOUNDATION, INC., a non-stock, non-profit corporation formed pursuant to Chapter 273 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (hereinafter referred to as the "Foundation").

WITNESSETH:

THAT, WHEREAS, the parties hereto entered into an agreement on or about December 4, 1978, have or are in the process of negotiating an agreement for the period from July 1, 1979 to June 30, 1980, and may hereafter enter into future agreements with respect to the Foundation administering certain income for professional services under the University's "geographic full-time medical services plan" (which agreements are hereinafter collectively referred to as "Agreements");

WHEREAS, the "Agreements" make reference to plans adopted by various departments of the College of Medicine of the University (hereinafter referred to as "Departmental Plans");

AND, WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to clarify and modify the Agreements as herein stated.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and covenants herein contained and in order to clarify and modify the intent and obligations of the parties contained in the Agreements, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- (1) That the departments which have adopted Departmental Plans are part of the University so payments of "plan income" pursuant to all Departmental Plans shall be made by the Foundation directly to the University in the amounts required by the Departmental Plans and the University shall pay such amounts of "plan income" to the recipients in accordance with the Departmental Plans.
- (2) The use of the terms "plan income," "clinical income" and "income" in said Agreements, including references to payments thereof, shall include all income billed, whether or not actually received, less a reasonable allowance for bad debts, for the reason that the use of such terms and the term "payments" in connection therewith refer to the creation of the obligation when the bill is sent rather than the actual receipt of cash.
- (3) That all funds payable to the University, including, but not limited to, funds which must be paid to reimburse the University, and all funds required to be paid or allocated in accordance with the Departmental Plans shall be due and payable to or on behalf of the University upon the sending of the bills to patients or others whereby such funds are generated. Funds so paid or allocated are so payable notwithstanding the existence of provisions in the Departmental Plans providing for disbursing or handling such funds at a later date for the reason that it is recognized that the departments are part of the University and the Departmental Plans merely state the manner in which such funds are to be distributed, subject to approval by the University.
- (4) That notwithstanding anything in any of the Agreements to the contrary, including references to maintaining separate accounts, placing funds in particular account(s), depositing funds into an account maintained for specific or stated purpose(s), transferring

funds, separately maintaining or administrating funds for specific purposes and/or other similar limitations, the Foundation shall not be required to maintain a separate bank account or otherwise segregate any funds held by the Foundation, except for the amounts stated in paragraphs "A", "B", "C" and "D" of Section 5 and Section 6, and all other such limiting references shall be deemed only to require the Foundation to maintain its books and records in such a manner that such funds or amounts are either shown or readily determinable.

- (5) That the term "clinical income" includes investment income except as used in Section six (6) of the existing Agreement wherein investment income is specifically excluded from "clinical income."
- (6) That in the event of any inconsistency between this Addendum and any other document this Addendum shall govern and in the event of any inconsistency between the Agreements and the Departmental Plans the Agreements shall govern.
- (7) This Addendum shall survive the execution of subsequent Agreements and shall control the obligations of the parties hereto from December 14, 1978, until terminated by the parties hereto or such time as the Agreements have been terminated by the University in accordance with numerical paragraph thirteen (13) of the existing Agreement.

CONTRACT WITH LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH, et al

Backgound: Jefferson Community College is a member of the Medical Center Steam and Chilled Water Plant that provides steam and chilled water for the college as well as several other hospitals and institutions in the area.

In order for a new institution to use steam and chilled water from the steam plan, it's necessary for the new institution to become a member of the "co-op". This necessitates the execution of a supplemental contract by all members of the "co-op".

The Regional Cancer Center Corporation has requested membership in the co-op. There is a sufficient capacity of steam and chilled water to serve the Regional Cancer Center Corporation without requiring additional capital expenditures.

DESIGNATION OF NEIMAN PRINT PROCEEDS AS A QUASI-ENDOWMENT FOR ALUMNI ASSOCIATION AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS FUND

Recommendation: that a quasi-endowment fund be established from the proceeds of sales of the LeRoy Neiman serigraph with a beginning principal of \$35,000 to be invested in the University's Fixed Income Pool, and that income from this endowment be designated for the Alumni Association Awards and Scholarships Fund within the University.

Background: During the 1977-78 basketball season, the University, with the assistance of Ashland Oil, secured an athletic print of the University's basketball team from an original painting by famous artist LeRoy Neiman. At that time the hope was expressed that the proceeds from the sales of this serigraph would be used for undergraduate scholarships.

Since that time such sales have produced about \$35,000 for the University. With the approval of the University's Office of Development and the Office of the Vice President for University Relations, these proceeds would endow scholarships through the newly-established Alumni Association Awards and Scholarships Fund. This fund would continue those Alumni Loyalty Scholarships which were begun some two decades ago and for which, unfortunately, all funds were exhausted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1979. For the fiscal year 1979-80 these scholarships will total \$2900 for four (4) undergraduates - one each from the freshman, sophomore, junior, and senior classes. Eventually, these scholarships are scheduled to total \$3200.

The Office of Student Financial Aid selects scholarship recipients in accordance with appropriate guidelines. Upon notice from the Student Financial Aid Office, the Alumni Association shall institute the pertinent transactions so that recipients may receive not only their scholarships, but also recognition of their selection at the Annual Meeting of the Alumni Association and in publications of the Alumni Association

INVESTMENT POLICIES - CURRENT FUNDS

Recommendation: that it be the policy of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky:

With respect to investment of available current funds:

- a. That to the maximum practical extent, such funds be invested.
- b. That such funds be invested in fixed income securities.
- c. That the investment objective be to maximize yield consistent with security, liquidity and the period of investment.
- d. That investments be limited to: (1) direct obligations of the United States Treasury; (2) other appropriate securities issued by federal agencies (including the Federal National Mortgage Association, the Export-Import Bank, Federal Intermediate Credit Bank, Federal Home Loan Banks, Federal Land Banks); (3) repurchase agreements of United States Government obligations as described in (1) and (2); (4) The Common Fund for Short Term Investments; *(5) certificates of deposit collateralized by direct obligations of the federal government, federal agency obligations which qualify for direct investment under this recommendation, general obligations of the University of Kentucky.
- e. That the Investment Committee of the Board be authorized to make investments under this policy and make quarterly reports of such investments to the Board.

Background: This policy is identical to the present policy with the exception that repurchase agreements and The Common Fund for Short Term Investments are added as permissible investments. This change will provide greater flexibility to the Investment Committee in meeting the objective of maximum yield consistent with security, liquidity, and the period of investment.

The Common Fund is a non-profit corporation formed in 1971, and represents a cooperative undertaking of educational institutions designed to improve the productivity of their endowments and other invested assets. A portion of the University's endowment portfolio is presently invested in The Common Fund.
