## Cats offer typical end to predictable postseason



CHICAGO — In the end, we shouldn't be surprised? In fact, when were we ever surprised?

The 2006-07 version of UK basketball gave us a number of emotions, none of them surprising. The optimism of October became the anticipation of November, which preceded the excitement of an II-game winning streak in December and January. That was followed by the February frustration of a three-game losing skid, and finally by the tepid realization in March that this team — which did not win two games in a tow after its victory over South Carolina on Feb. 7 — had no miracle run in it.

And so on Sunday, there was no have

And so on Sunday, there was no bag, and there were no tricks. Kansas controlled the game and dispatched the Cats, providing a fitting ending to a lukewarm season. The Cats' only lead after the opening minutes was a brief 17-15 advantage with just under nine minutes in the first half.

UK rallied briefly in the opening minutes of the second half when Bobby Perry hit two consecutive 3-pointers and UK closed within three of the Jayhawks. But, like the season as a whole, the Cats never gave us much reason to believe in their ability to exceed expectations, and followed a predictable path to demise.

The gate to that path opened when Randolph Morris — who must have a sore back after carrying the Cats on his shoulders for the past month—picked up his third foul with 17-46 left, after UK had narrowed its deficit to three on Perry's shost, With Morris relegated to the bench, Kansas immediately went on a 15-2 mn to push the advantage to an insurmountable 16 points. UK never again threatened.



I am in receipt of your letter dated March 6, 2007 regarding the posting of the University of Kentucky Board of Trustees agenda.

The board acknowledges your concerns and request, however we must disagree that this is some violation of right to information. The change in practice of posting the official agenda the morning of the board meetings is in full compliance of all open meeting laws and the board's governing policies.

The Trustee's committee and board meetings have and will continue to be open for the public to hear discussion and debate. Trustees seek and receive input from their constituents and the public throughout the discussion of any issue. Russ Williams, for example, holds a public meeting the Friday before each board meeting where he discusses issues. The input process occurs long before a proposal is put before the board.

The Trustees believe the agenda posting process provides sufficient notice of the actions of the board.

## Former FBI 'Most Wanted' to speak at women's conference

English professor Nikky Finney remembers the day she tried to take Angela Davis's picture in Nairobi, Kenya.

Instead of getting the picture, she helped Davis duck behind a building to escape a crowd of people who wanted her autograph, Finney said. Davis, a professor at the University of California Santa Cruz, will be the featured speaker at the Mary McLeod Bethune Luncheon at noon on March 22 in the Grand Ballroom at the Student Center.

Davis came under national attention in 1969 after she was removed from a teaching position at UCLA because of her social activism and membership in the Communist Party, according to the UC Santa Cruz Web site.

In 1970, Davis was placed on the FBI's 10 Most Wanted List on false murder charges, resulting in a police search that sent her underground. She was incarcerated for 16 months during which time a "Free Angela Davis" (campaign was organized that led to her acquittal in 1972, according to the Web site.

The Bethune Luncheon is part of the 13th Annual Black Women's Conference sponsored by UK's African American Studies and Research Program. The conference kicks off with a pottle, dinner tonight at 6 at the Bingham Davis House on E. Maxwell Street and continues with events on Wednesday and Thursday.

This year's theme is "The Camonflage: Black Women on America's Front Lines."

## **Locking tuition** won't work for undergrads at UK

Annual tuition increases at UK ave taken their toll on students — tot just undergraduates, but also hose attending UK's medical

In keeping with UK's 9 percent tution increase for next school year, undergraduate tutilion and fees will go up by about \$500 per semester, and the school year, undergraduate tution and fees will go up by about \$500 per semester, students in the College of Medicine—where tution is already more than six times that of the undergraduate college — will translate to about \$25,400 per semester.

In order to alleviate some of the strain on med students, UK is implementing a pilot program to control medical-school tution. Beginning in the fall of 2007, tution for students in the College of Medicine will be locked. Students who start at the medical school this fall will pay the same amount per semester, with no increases, until they graduate. Collaborative of Medicine. Sub-baswammy said one reason it was implemented was to make it easier for Kentuckians to go to med school. "Our country and our commonwealth need more doctors.
