Mr. L. Lingar, Foreman Sec. 7., Reports no first aid cabinet, no stretchers, no blanket, on his section. He also has complaint of Shop Department against the way slate wedges are sharpened and that there should be pick points on wedges instead of flat points.

Marshal Johnson suggests that some splints be made at Carpenter Shop and all sections be supplied with same. Also he reports no first aid supplies at No. 1. Mine Office.

Mr. Scott reports no first aid supplies on Sec. 8.

Mr. Cole reports no first aid supplies on Sec. 9.

Mr. Green reports all first aid kits should be refilled.

Two accidents today: Claud Denny, burned hand; no first aid supplies to dress his hand; Arthur Richardson, broken legs; very poor first aid given on account of shortage of supplies.

Mr. Luke Reports first aid supplies at No. 2. Mine in bad shape and that they need attention badly.

Mr. Lester reports No. 20 motor was reported to have reel fixed evening of the 7th. inst. and was not fixed. Tuesday only nine cars were gathered with said motor. This motor was in shop five hours. Motorman, Bill Carpenter, told the repairman while working on the reel that the guards of the reel needed attention and repairman invited Carpenter to go back and sit down. Carpenter brought motor back in mine at 1 o'clock and went in to place cars and the cage, due to the poor guards, caught the cable and cut it to pieces. Motorman returned to shop until late that day.

Mr. Scott reports No. 7. motor for repairs Tuesday night; grounded cylinder. It was in shop Wednesday for same trouble once, Thursday twice, and still giving trouble Thursday evening. Approximately 32 cars lost due to this motor.

Mr. Wallace, Foreman Sec. 1, reports that he has had lots of trouble due to the breakage of track gauges.
