REPORT OF ACCIDENT (Form IA-26-1)


Effective today, the only copies of reports of accidents we will require at this office are on the following cases:

- All fatal cases
- " permanent total disability cases
- " amputation cases
- " serious eye cases
- " serious crushing injuries to any part of the body
- " cases involving lost time of 28 days or more
- " cases where there may be no actual lost time but where it is expected that the penalty involved will be equal to or greater than 28 days.

In addition, I shall appreciate receiving reports of any unusual happenings either to equipment or personnel regardless of whether lost time or penalty is involved.

You will recognize immediately from the above that we do not want reports on simple injuries where only a few days lost time are involved, such as "man bumped elbow," "dropped casting on toe," "complained of sore back," etc.

As in the past, we are still interested in receiving reports on all eye saved cases. To date there have been 214 eye saved cases reported for 1949.
