Gentlemen:

By authority of Article VIII, Section I of the Mining laws of Kentucky, relative to distances of breakthroughs between pillars, etc., you are hereby notified that in your mine C (the lower one you are now working) you must not exceed the distance of eighty feet (i. e., 80 foot block between breakthroughs) on double, triple, or quadruple entry pillars, but the barrier pillar of your quadruple entries may be out only when necessary to conform to your haulage system.

The first breakthrough in each room ~~must~~ be cut not exceeding sixty feet (i. e. 60- foot block between breakthrough and entry), the balance not exceeding eighty feet (i. e. 80-foot block between breakthroughs).

All entries and rooms must not be driven beyond the above limits without breakthroughs being completed.
