Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, December 13, 1988.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 4 p.m. Lexington time on Tuesday, December 13, 1988 in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington Campus.

A. Meeting Opened and Oath of Office Administered

Mr. Robert T. McCowan, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 4 p.m. and the invocation was pronounced by Mr. Ted Bates.

At the request of the Chairman, Mr. John Darsie, General Counsel, administered the oath of office to Mr. William E. Burnett, Jr., to replace Albert G. Clay for a term expiring December 31, 1990.

B. Roll Call

The following members of the Board of Trustees answered the call of the roll: Mr. Robert T. McCowan (Chairman), Mr. Ted Bates, Professor Raymond F. Betts, Mr. William E. Burnett, Jr., Governor Albert B. Chandler, Professor Mary Sue Coleman, Professor David R. Driscoll, Jr., Mr. Tracy Farmer, Mr. Lawrence E. Forgy, Jr., Mrs. Edythe Jones Hayes, Mr. Henry E. Hershey, Senator Walter D. Huddleston, Dr. Nicholas J. Pisacano, Mr. James A. Rose (James), Mr. James L. Rose (Jim), Judge Robert F. Stephens, Mr. Jerome A. Stricker, Judge Julia K. Tackett, Mr. Billy B. Wilcoxson, and Judge Henry R. Wilhoit, Jr. The University administration was represented by President David P. Roselle; Mr. Edward A. Carter, Vice President for Administration; Chancellors Peter P. Bosomworth, Art Gallaher and Charles T. Wethington; Dr. Wimberly C. Royster, Vice President for Research and Graduate Studies; Mr. Eugene R. Williams, Vice President for Information Systems; and Mr. John C. Darsie, General Counsel.

C. Minutes Approved

On motion by Mr. Forgy, seconded by Mr. Farmer and passed, the Minutes of the October 25, 1988 meeting of the Board of Trustees were approved as written.

D. <u>President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)</u>

Before beginning PR 1, President Roselle reviewed the events to follow the Board meeting for Trustees and their spouses: Faculty Senate reception at the Alumni House, reception at Maxwell Place and dinner at the Hilary J. Boone Faculty Club. He also called attention to a memorandum regarding the basketball game with the University of Louisville and stated that he hoped the Trustees could attend.

President Roselle informed the members that the Board of Directors of the Athletics Association had met earlier in the afternoon and approved a contract extension for Coach Jerry Claiborne. He read some of the rationale in back of the contract and stated that the contract extension will take Coach Claiborne through the 1993 season. Following a review of some highlights of the football program and Coach Claiborne's career, he noted that this information is to keep the Board apprised.

President Roselle informed the members that a new University license plate is available, and an order form was given to each Board member.

He spoke briefly about the following information items included in the Board packet:

1. A newspaper article about Dr. Pisacano.

2. 1988 Awards for Sponsored Projects.

3. University of Kentucky Computing and Communications
Annual Report 1987-88

4. VMX Publication

President Roselle then referred to the items in PR 1 calling particular attention to (1) the groundbreaking ceremony on Spindletop Farm for the new building to house the Asphalt Institute, (2) the athletics programs winning recognition, (3) the University Press of Kentucky's new headquarters on Limestone, (4) the recipient of the Nestor Award, William T. Reasor, Manager of Utilities in Physical Plant, and (5) the Charles R. Sachatello Medical Center Library Endowment Fund surpassing \$25,000.

Mr. McCowan mentioned that he had been associated with the Asphalt Institute over the years, and it is a fine institute. The Institute is doing some great research and is pleased to be in Lexington. The move from Maryland to Kentucky will be good for the Institute, the University and the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

E. Introduction of Mr. William R. Bagby

President Roselle introduced Mr. William R. Bagby, President, Ephraim McDowell Cancer Research Foundation. Mr. Bagby expressed his pleasure in being in attendance to present the deed to the Dorothy Enslow Combs Cancer Research Building to President Roselle. Mr. Bagby stated that the Combs building was built with private funds at a cost of \$10 million. He requested that the McDowell Foundation have permission to use the atrium and certain conference rooms as indicated in an agreement to be presented for Board action.

President Roselle expressed his appreciation of the deed transfer of the Combs building located at the Markey Cancer Center. He indicated that Mr. Bagby's request for use of certain areas for the purpose of raising funds was on the agenda. He thanked Mr. Bagby for his assistance and noted that the McDowell Foundation led by Dr. Ben Roach, with the assistance of Linda Mauk, is raising money for the next part of the facility. Dr. Roach and Linda Mauk were asked to stand and be recognized.

F. Personnel Actions (PR 2)

With President Roselle so recommending, on motion made by Mr. Stricker, seconded by Mr. Hershey and passed, the routine personnel actions in PR 2 were approved. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Associate Degree Program - Henderson and Owensboro Community Colleges (PR 4A)

On recommendation of President Roselle, Mr.Hershey moved that the Board authorize for submission to the Council on Higher Education a new degree program, Associate Degree in Applied Science, Engineering Technology, Electrical Option, for the Henderson and Owensboro Community Colleges. The motion was seconded by Professor Coleman and carried. (See PR 4A at the end of the Minutes.)

H. Associate Degree Program - Henderson and Owensboro Community Colleges (PR 4B)

With President Roselle so recommending, Mr. Wilcoxson moved that the Board also authorize for submission to the Council on Higher Education a new degree program, Associate Degree in Applied Science, Mechanical Option, for the Henderson and Owensboro Community Colleges. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Hayes and carried. (See PR 4B at the end of the Minutes.)

I. Appointment of President, Somerset Community College (PR 4C)

President Roselle recommended that the Board approve the appointment of Rollin J. Watson as President of Somerset Community College, effective January 1, 1989. Professor Driscoll so moved. His motion was seconded by Governor Chandler and carried. (See PR 4C at the end of the Minutes.)

J. <u>Candidates for Degrees - Community College System (PR</u>

Mr. Stricker moved that the degrees specified in PR 4D be awarded to the persons named, upon certification that the requirements for those degrees have been satisfactorily completed. The motion, seconded by Mrs. Hayes, carried. (See PR 4D at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Candidates for Degrees - Lexington Campus and Medical Center (PR 5A)

Dr. Pisacano moved that the President be authorized to confer upon each individual whose name appears on the lists attached to PR 5A the degree to which he or she is entitled, upon certification by the Registrar and approved by the University Senate that the individual has satisfactorily completed all requirements for the degree for which application has been made. His motion was seconded by Professor Betts and unanimously carried. (See PR 5A at the end of the Minutes.)

L. Appointment to University of Kentucky/Business Partnership Foundation (PR 5B)

President Roselle recommended that approval be given to the appointment of Johann Th. Pavenstedt to membership on the Board of Directors of the University of Kentucky/Business Partnership

Foundation for a term beginning with the spring 1989 meeting and ending with the spring 1993 meeting. Mr. Wilcoxson so moved; his motion was seconded by Mr. Burnett and carried. (See PR 5B at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Appointment to University of Kentucky Humanities Foundation (PR $\overline{5C}$)

President Roselle recommended that approval be given to the appointment of Robert K. Massie to membership on the Board of Directors of the University of Kentucky Humanities Foundation for a four-year term beginning with the spring 1989 meeting. Dr. Pisacano so moved. His motion was seconded by Professor Betts and carried. (See PR 5C at the end of the Minutes.)

Dr. Betts mentioned that Mr. Massie is a very well-known author whose book on Nicholas and Alexandria was a best seller. He informed the members that Mr. Massie is head of the American Writers Conference and brings a talent of personality and writing skill that will be beneficial to the Foundation.

N. Agreement Between University of Kentucky and Kentucky Medical Services Foundation (PR 6A)

President Roselle recommended that the Board approve the agreement attached to PR 6A between the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky and Kentucky Medical Services Foundation, Inc., which was negotiated pursuant to the "Board of Trustees Resolution Regarding Medical Practice Plan" adopted on June 20, 1978. Mr. Hershey so moved. The motion was seconded by Governor Chandler and carried. (See PR 6A at the end of the Minutes.)

0. Agreement Between the University of Kentucky and the McDowell Cancer Research Foundation, Inc. (PR 6B)

President Roselle recommended that the Board approve the agreement between the University and the McDowell Cancer Research Foundation, Inc. relative to the use of certain rooms in the Dorothy Enslow Combs Cancer Research Building of the Lucille Parker Markey Cancer Center and authorize the President to execute the agreement with the McDowell Cancer Research Foundation, Inc. Mr. Bagby had earlier recommended this agreement be approved. Mr. Wilhoit so moved. The motion was seconded by Judge Stephens and carried.

President Roselle expressed his appreciation again to the McDowell Foundation. He stated that the University will soon have a Cancer Center whose physical plant value will be in excess of \$30,000,000. He explained that all of the dollars have been raised privately and by Mr. Bagby and members of the McDowell Foundation with the assistance of Dr. Roach and Linda Mauk. He praised them for their remarkable performance for the University of Kentucky and for health care for Kentuckians. (See PR 6B at the end of the Minutes.)

P. 1988-89 Budget Revisions (FCR 1)

Mr. Forgy, Chairman of the Finance Committee, reported that FCR 1 is a budget revision. The principal part of the revision is to reflect a change in the Community College System's revenue estimate for the fiscal year brought about by the registration fee change that the Board previously approved for the Community College System. He then moved the adoption of FCR 1. The motion was seconded by Mr. Wilcoxson and carried. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

Q. Acceptance of Interim Financial Report for the University of Kentucky for the Four Months Ended October 31, 1988 (FCR 2)

Mr. Forgy stated that FCR 2 is the acceptance of the consolidated financial report for the four months ended October 31, 1988 and moved its adoption. His motion was seconded by Mr. Jim Rose, and it was so ordered. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

R. Disposal of Personal Property (FCR 3)

On motion made by Mr. Forgy, seconded by Senator Huddleston and carried, the Board approved the disposition of surplus and obsolete equipment as recommended in FCR 3. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

S. Disposition of Surplus Property (FCR 4)

Mr. Forgy explained that Kentucky Law requires that when property is declared surplus two appraisals are made of the property before it may be sold by an institution either at public auction or through sealed bids. Mr. Forgy then moved that the property located at 308-312 East Vine Street, Lexington, Kentucky be declared surplus and that the Vice Chancellor for Administration, Lexington Campus, be authorized to sell the property by sealed bid or public auction. Mr. Bates seconded the motion and it carried. (See FCR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

T. Report of Lease (FCR 5)

On motion made by Mr. Forgy, seconded by Mr. Hershey, and carried, approval was given for the lease agreement as recommended in FCR 5. (See FCR 5 at the end of the Minutes.)

U. Establishment of Quasi-Endowment for the Ashland Oil Gift to the College of Business and Economics (FCR 6)

Mr. Forgy moved that the Board of Trustees authorize the establishment of a quasi-endowment fund in the amount of \$950,000. The quasi-endowment will be entitled "College of Business and Economics Ashland Oil Gift." The motion was seconded by Mr. Hershey and passed. Mr. Forgy noted that this is the first million dollar gift given by anyone to the University of Kentucky.

V. Laramie L. Leatherman Professorship of Law (FCR 7)

Mr. Forgy moved that the Board of Trustees establish in the College of Law the Laramie L. Leatherman Professorship of Law at a sum of no less than \$150,000 which shall be funded from multiple gifts to the College specifically for the professorship or from gifts designated for general use by the College which the resolution authorizes the dean to quasi-endow as funds are received. His motion was seconded by Judge Wilhoit and carried unanimously. (See FCR 7 at the end of the Minutes.)

W. Coopers & Lybrand Professorship of Accountancy (FCR 8)

Mr. Forgy moved that the Board of Trustees establish in the School of Accountancy, College of Business and Economics, the Coopers & Lybrand Professorship of Accountancy. The firm has pledged \$140,000 to be contributed over the next five years from partners, employees, and matching gifts from the company. The motion was seconded by Mr. Jim Rose and passed. (See FCR 8 at the end of the Minutes.)

X. Report of Investments (ICR 1)

Mr. Stricker, Chairman of the Investment Committee, moved that the report of changes made in investments for the University of Kentucky and its Affiliated Corporations for the three months ended September 30, 1988 be accepted. Mr. Wilcoxson seconded the motion and it carried.

Y. Update on Coldstream Farm

President Roselle reminded the members that in December, 1987 the Board of Trustees authorized the University administration to explore alternative uses of Coldstream Farm and cited the following:

- (1) The Board stipulated that none of the property was to be sold. Coldstream Farm was to function as the University's endowment and ownership was to be held by the University.
- (2) The administration began the process for competition to identify land use planners and MPC and Associates, Inc. was identified as the group to assist the University.
- (3) With the assistance of MPC and Associates, a land use plan for Coldstream Farm was prepared. The Board adopted the land use plan in concept and directed the administration to evaluate proposals from mall developers for lease of the designated site for a mall at Coldstream.
- (4) Following the June 1988 decision of the Board, the University entered into negotiation for an option agreement on a mall with a joint venture team of Homart Development Corporation and Crown America Corporation.

President Roselle stated that a key part of the development of the mall in the northwest quadrant of Coldstream Farm is a highway interchange. He reported that discussions about the highway interchange have been held with the Highway Department, and Mr. Milo Bryant, Secretary of the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, has directed the transportation engineers to look into the proposal and report their findings. President Roselle stated that the cooperation from the State with the development plans for Coldstream Farm has been exceptionally good.

President Roselle explained that another key issue in the development of Coldstream Farm is that land now being used for research by the University's Department of Animal Sciences may be lost to that purpose. He stated that the University's intention is to replace such land at Coldstream Farm with land and modern research facilities in another location. He stated that the University is committed to its animal research program, one of the very finest in the nation, and the planning for new uses at Coldstream Farm will be coordinated with the University's animal sciences area. President Roselle emphasized that the purpose in the development of Coldstream Farm is not development but to make a lasting contribution to the economic development of the Commonwealth and the City, and to enhance the University's role as a leader in research, instruction and service.

President Roselle provided an update on specifics of the plan. He pointed out that the University of Kentucky is a land-grant institution and has a special responsibility to meet the research, higher education and outreach needs of the Commonwealth. The use made of the land will allow the University to further achieve the missions through a better educated citizenry, the promotion of economic development and closer ties with business and industry. He introduced Mike Curzan, President of MPC and Associates, Inc. and asked him to present some of the concepts his firm has developed.

Using a series of slides, Mr. Curzan gave an overview of the plan for the Coldstream property showing some of the quality of what can be produced and elaborated on some of the types of uses of the property.

President Roselle stated that the University does not plan to do the project alone but believes it can be an important project for the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the City. He introduced Mayor Scotty Baesler, who is accepting of the idea, and asked him to speak about the city view of the land.

Mayor Baesler expressed his approval of the outstanding plan for Coldstream Farm. He emphasized the city's desire to maintain the quality and appearance of the property as an entrance to the Lexington/Fayette County area. He stated that to maintain these qualities both the city and the University would share in the cost of improvements. He complimented President Roselle and the Board for taking the leadership of the development of the plan.

Mr. Forgy, chairman of the committee to study Coldstream Farm development, thanked Mayor Baesler for his comments and his kind offer to the Board.

Dr. Pisacano suggested a committee be formed to serve as an oversight committee to protect the beauty of the buildings and land.

President Roselle assured Dr. Pisacano that there would be quality development for the property.

Z. Meeting Adjourned

There being no further business to come before the Board, the Chairman adjourned the meeting at 5:16 p.m.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY AND KENTUCKY MEDICAL SERVICES FOUNDATION

<u>Recommendation:</u> that the Board approve the attached agreement between the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky and Kentucky Medical Services Foundation, Inc. which was negotiated pursuant to the "Board of Trustees Resolution Regarding Medical Practice Plan" adopted on June 20, 1978.

Background: The Board action on June 20, 1978 provided that:

"The President is authorized to negotiate and execute a contract subject to approval of the Board of Trustees, with an appropriately qualified organizational entity for carrying out necessary functions and assuming the responsibilities involved in the administration of income for professional services under the plan."

Kentucky Medical Services Foundation, Inc. meets the "criteria" specified under Section 3, A for the appropriately qualified organization. The attached agreement conforms to the provisions of the June 20 Board resolution and specifically satisfied the "conditions" set forth in Section 3, B. Section 19 on Professional Liability Insurance has been modified to coincide with the findings of an actuarial study prepared by Coopers and Lybrand. The actuarial study found that the Kentucky Medical Services Foundation should bear 43.77% of the total cost of professional liability insurance program. This is a decrease from 48.45% in the currently approved contract.

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 21th day of June, 1988 by and between the BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY, a statutory body corporate existing pursuant to Section 164.100 et seq of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (hereinafter referred to as the University) and KENTUCKY MEDICAL SERVICES FOUNDATION, INC., a non-stock, non-profit corporation formed pursuant to Chapter 273 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (hereinafter referred to as the Foundation).

WITNESSETH:

Section 1. RECITALS

- A. Foundation is organized for the purposes stated in its Articles of Incorporation as a non-stock, non-profit corporation and will use and apply the whole or any part of its income and principal exclusively for charitable, scientific, or educational purposes at or for the benefit of, the University of Kentucky Medical Center.
- B. A substantial number of University's faculty in its College of Medicine have heretofore executed agreements with Foundation, known as 'Practice Agreements and Assignments' whereby said faculty have assigned to Foundation their professionally generated clinical income.
- C. The recruitment and retention of the members of the medical faculty of the University will be improved by permitting the said members to supplement, by income from the practice of medicine, the salaries provided by the University.

D. The University recognizes that the medical practice activities of its faculty members can be conducted in a more efficient and economical manner if those faculty members who produce income are permitted, through the medium of the Foundation, to exercise a larger voice in the expenditure of the funds so produced. E. The University has heretofore established, in addition to its previously adopted Physicians Service Plan, a "geographic full-time medical service plan", the said geographic full-time plan having been adopted on June 20, 1978, as amended on June 19, 1984; said action is hereby incorporated by reference as is set out in full herein. F. The aforementioned action of University's Board of Trustees authorized the University's President to negotiate and execute a contract, subject to the approval of said Board, with an appropriately qualified entity for carrying out necessary functions and assuming the responsibilities involved in the administration of income for professional services under the plan. NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows: Section 2. DEFINITIONS A. "The Plan" means the geographic full-time medical service plan for the University of Kentucky College of Medicine established by action of the Board of Trustees of said University dated June 20, 1978, as amended on June 19, 1984. B. "Clinical Income" means (1) all compensation, income and payments (direct or in kind and whether characterized as fees, retainers, or otherwise) for professional services rendered or to be rendered, including, but not limited to those relating to the diagnosis, treatment or evaluation of - 2 -

patients or others and consultation, and (2) all payments whether direct or in kind (excluding actual travel costs) for providing advice, consultation, serving on boards or committees, overseeing, supervising or other participation with any person or entity involved with (a) health or medical care, (b) evaluation or care of patients, (c) drugs, (d) therapy of any kind, (e) accident or disease prevention, (f) health or medical care facilities, (g) programs involving health or medical care or (h) health or medical care of any other type, and (3) witness fees and payments relating to depositions, testimony or other evaluations in the capacity of a witness, and (4) all other income which relates to or would not exist but for the professional education, experience, or training. The Dean has the authority to approve exceptions to clinical income and is required to document the nature of the exception and the reason. Provided, however, that nothing contained herein shall be deemed to include in the term "clinical income" any item excluded therefrom by paragraph II, B of the plan.

C. 'Practice Agreements' means those documents, denominated Practice Agreements and Assignments heretofore executed by certain members of University's faculty, the University, The Fund for Advancement of Education and Research in the University of Kentucky Medical Center and the Foundation.

Section 3. NATURE OF THE AGREEMENT

Pursuant to Paragraph III, A. of the aforementioned action of University's Board of Trustees dated June 20, 1978, as amended on June 19, 1984, University hereby recognizes Foundation as an "appropriately qualified organizational entity" as described therein for carrying out necessary functions and assuming the responsibilities involved in the administration of income for professional services under University's "geographic full-time medical services plan".

Section 4. BILLING AND COLLECTION

Foundation agrees that it will accept, pursuant to practice agreements, the assignment of all clinical income by participants in the plan and, in accordance with such assignment, agrees to bill the amount of duly established charges for professional services to parties determined to be responsible for payment of such charges.

Section 5. REIMBURSEMENT OF UNIVERSITY

- A. In accord with paragraph II, D. 2 of the plan, the parties recognize that Foundation must reimburse University for actual expenses incurred by it which are attendant to the production of clinical income.
- B. To provide for said reimbursement, Foundation agrees that it will, on or before the first working day of each month in which reimbursable expenses are due as provided hereinafter, deposit the funds necessary to make such payments in a separate account maintained by it and that funds held in the said account will be invested only in accord with the provisions of Section 18 hereof.
- C. Foundation agrees to pay to University, from said account, as reimbursement for the remainder of the expenses attendant to the production of clinical income, University's actual annual costs, as determined by joint evaluation of Foundation and University, a sum estimated at Three Million Eighteen Thousand Four Hundred Forty-Five (\$3,018,445) Dollars, composed of as reimbursement of personnel expenses and other current expenses, in direct support of the operation of the AMS Clinic.

Payments hereunder shall be in the following manner:

- 1. The University will submit statements of actual expenditures for each month by the 15th day of the succeeding month. KMSF will reimburse the University of Kentucky by the 22nd day of that month. KMSF will be required to pay any costs over the \$3,018,445 and likewise accrue any savings that may occur.
- D. In addition to the above, Foundation agrees that it will reimburse University for all "plan income", as that term is defined in paragraph II, C., 2 of the plan, paid to faculty by University.

Section 6. REIMBURSEMENT OF FOUNDATION

- A. The parties recognized that University receives certain services from Foundation, for which it is due reimbursement as specified hereinbelow.
- B. University agrees to pay to Foundation on behalf of members of the Department of Diagnostic Radiology for the provision of x-ray interpretation services to the University Student Health Service during the period July 1, 1988 June 30, 1989 a sum not to exceed Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars.
- C. University agrees to pay to Foundation on behalf of members of the Department of Neurology, for provision of EEG interpretation services to the University Student Health Service, the usual and customary fee for each such service rendered.
- D. University agrees to pay to Foundation on behalf of the clinical faculty members of the College of Medicine, for provision of specified physical examinations to certain University employees, a fee for each examination.

E. University will make payment to Foundation monthly, on the last calendar day of each month beginning July 31, 1988, for services as described in paragraphs B, C, and D hereinabove.

Section 7. COST SETTLEMENTS

- A. The parties recognize that the provision of medical services in the current competitive environment may at times require a joint effort on the part of the University and University Hospital and the Foundation in the formation of new delivery systems. These efforts may at times require the sharing of cost between the parties. Formulas for the sharing will be developed and mutually agreed to by the parties, which may result in payment by the University to the Foundation, or by the Foundation to the University. Examples of such joint efforts include but are not limited to:
- 1.Discounts to University of Kentucky employees and their dependents as part of the University of Kentucky Health Plan.
 - 2. The operation of the UK-HMO.
- B. The parties also agree that data exchanges between the computer systems, regardless of mode, of the University and the Foundation will be payable at cost by the receiving party, or offset by an exchange of data deemed by both parties to be payment-in-kind.

Section 8. ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT FUND

A. Consonant with Section II, D. 3 of the plan adopted by University's Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978, as amended on June 19, 1984, Foundation agrees that it will pay to The Fund for Advancement of Education and Research

in the University of Kentucky Medical Center (hereinafter Fund), an amount equal to three (3%) percent of the actual clinical income collected by said Foundation. The Fund will deposit said payments in an account maintained for the purpose of providing an academic enrichment fund to be used by the Dean of the College of Medicine in support of the programs of said College and for related purposes. Amounts due hereunder will be computed by Foundation on a monthly basis as income is received and remitted to the Fund within twenty-five (25) days after the close of each monthly accounting period.

B. Foundation further agrees that it will deposit, in an account maintained by Foundation, on the same basis as provided in subsection A. hereinabove, an additional amount equal to six (6%) percent of the actual clinical income collected by said Foundation, said funds to be used by the Dean of the College of Medicine for the enrichment of the programs of the College and for related purposes in his sole discretion.

Section 9. PARTICULAR COVENANTS OF THE FOUNDATION

A. Foundation's Articles of Incorporation, as filed with the Secretary of State of the Commonwealth of Kentucky on June 19, 1978, have been inspected by the University as a condition precedent to University's entry into this agreement. Foundation covenants that it will not, absent the written agreement of the University, amend or otherwise alter said Articles or adopt any by-law or other operating practice which would effectively alter the character of said Foundation.

B. Foundation covenants that it will not engage in the practice of medicine, nor will it solicit, administer, receive, perform or accept any gift,

grant, devise, bequest, contract or other arrangement with or from any governmental unit, entity, or subdivision or any person, corporation, partnership, association or other entity whatsoever except as specifically permitted herein. Provided, however, that nothing contained herein shall be construed to prohibit the Foundation (subject to the approval of the Dean of the College of Medicine) from negotiating and executing contracts providing exclusively for professional services by faculty who have executed practice agreements.

C. Foundation covenants that it will not merge with any other corporation or convey any substantial portion of its assets to any other corporation, partnership, or other entity except as specifically provided herein and that, in the event of its dissolution its Board of Directors shall cause its assets to be applied and distributed as follows: (a) all liabilities and obligations of the corporation shall be paid, satisfied and discharged, or adequate provisions shall be made therefore; (b) assets held by the corporation upon a condition which occurs by reason of the dissolution, shall be returned, transferred or conveyed in accordance with such requirements; and (c) all of the remaining assets of the corporation shall be transferred or conveyed to the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, or its successor, to be used for medical education and research, if said University or its successor, shall qualify as a public corporation and an instrumentality of the State of Kentucky or as an exempt organization under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended; and if said University or its successor shall not so qualify, then to some other organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, or scientific purposes in the field of medicine as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended.

Section 10. MEMBERSHIP AND BENEFITS

- A. University agrees that it will assist the Foundation to enforce the terms of the practice agreements entered into by members of University's clinical departments of its College of Medicine by requiring adherence to said agreements as a condition of continued employment as a member of University's faculty.
- B. University agrees that it will require, as a condition of employment as a member of University's faculty in a clinical department in which a majority of the faculty members have executed practice agreements, that new members of its faculty execute said practice agreement in form identical to said agreements heretofore executed or as the form of same may be modified by mutual agreement of the parties hereto from time to time.
- C. Foundation agrees that it will not, absent the written consent of University, bill for, collect or administer any item of income for any person or entity not holding membership in the plan, nor will it permit persons not members to serve on its Board of Directors, nor will it provide any benefit or other thing of value to any person or entity not a member of the plan except for (1) termination benefits to former members as provided by action of Foundation's Board of Directors, (2) incidental benefits indirectly accruing to employees of the Medical Center by virtue of Foundation's activities, (3) students and House Staff of University, (4) payment to nurses incident to their recruitment to the University Medical Center, (5) education and technical training costs of persons involved in patient care activities or (6) education and technical training costs of persons indirectly involved in patient care activities if approved on a case by case basis by the Dean of the College of Medicine or the Chancellor for the Medical Center.

- D. In order to provide University of Kentucky Health Plan patients with a unified bill, Foundation is authorized to bill and collect the following items: clinic Pharmacy charges, patient deductible and non-covered items, nutrition/dietetic fees and Oral Surgery fees. The collection and billing shall be in accord with that certain contract entered into between the University and the Foundation.
- E. Foundation shall assume responsibility for the costs of drugs and supplies to be used in the patient care programs in the clinics and is hereby authorized to bill, collect, and deposit in foundation accounts revenue from these non ancillary items.
- F. Foundation agrees that it will strictly enforce the terms of its practice agreements, report promptly to University in the event any individual fails or refuses to abide thereby and join with University in any appropriate action, in law or equity, necessary to secure compliance therewith.

Section 11. PERSONNEL

The parties recognize that the Foundation must employ various individuals to carry out its functions hereunder; however, the parties also recognize, and hereby declare their intention to adhere to, those provisions of the plan adopted by University's Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978, as amended on June 19, 1984, particularly those portions which provide that University must retain responsibility and authority for the appointment of faculty and house staff, the determination of institutional staffing patterns and the maintenance of balance among programs and their component activities.

Accordingly, with respect to employment of personnel by Foundation, the parties agree as follows:

A. Foundation staff

The Foundation may employ an executive director and such assistants, including secretarial and clerical personnel as may be determined by its Board of Directors to be necessary to permit said Foundation to bill and collect professional fee income and to administer its funds in accord with the terms of the geographic full-time plan.

The Foundation is authorized to house computer equipment as may be required to communicate with its central computer and house sufficient employees in the University Medical Plaza building for the purpose of providing billing and financial information to patients of University physicians who are members of KMSF.

B. Other personnel

During the term of this contract Foundation agrees that it will not employ persons other than the employees authorized in Section 11. A. to perform services in University's patient care or college programs. Provided, however, that this provision shall not be construed to prohibit specific agreements between the parties whereby University will employ personnel for such service and/or research duties with reimbursement of salary, fringe benefits and other direct costs by Foundation. Where such personnel are employed for service in a specific department or unit, employment will not occur unless (1) the department or unit where service is to be performed has consented in writing to said appointment, (2) the Dean of the College of Medicine has approved the employment and the job description related thereto and (3) funds for the salary, fringe benefits, and other costs related to said employee are either on hand or reasonably anticipated in the departmental or unit budget.

C. Equal opportunity-affirmative action

Foundation agrees that it will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age or handicap. The Foundation agrees that it will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age or handicap. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other compensation; and selection for training. The Foundation agrees that it will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age or handicap. The Foundation agrees that it will indemnify and save harmless the University, the Board of Trustees of the University including the individual members thereof, officers, agents and employees of the University by reason of any action at law or equity or by reason of any administrative proceeding initiated by any person arising out of any such employment action or practice of Foundation, including the payment of attorney fees and other costs of such action or proceeding.

Section 12. USE OF UNIVERSITY FACILITIES

The parties recognize that paragraphs III, B. 4, b, d, g and i of the "geographic full-time plan" adopted by University's Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978, as amended on June 19, 1984, require that institutional control be maintained with respect to direction and supervision of institutional activities and programs, assignment and use of space in institutional facilities, determination of goals, objectives and priorities and the maintenance of balance among programs and their component activities.

Accordingly, Foundation and University agree that University will provide space for the Ophthalmology Clinic, the Chambers Building, appropriate assigned space in the University Medical Plaza and the Emergency Room (exclusive of faculty offices and classroom space contained therein) and other space officially designated for the conduct of the patient care operation.

With respect to any other facilities which University may from time to time provide to Foundation, Foundation shall be deemed a licensee without any property right whatsoever in said premises or facilities and shall, upon demand of University, vacate same.

Section 13. MEDICAL RECORDS

The parties agree that all medical records relating to the care of patients in University facilities or as a part of University programs, are and shall remain the property of University and that Foundation has no right or property interest therein. Provided, however, that nothing herein shall be construed to limit access to said records by members of University's faculty, staff, and students pursuant to existing University procedures. Provided, further, that University agrees to provide or make available to Foundation such information and data from patient records and program data maintained by University as may be necessary for Foundation to perform its billing and collection functions herein provided, including such information and data as may be necessary to meet the requirements of third-party or other payors as the basis for payment for services.

Section 14. INSPECTION AND AUDIT

- A. Foundation agrees that, in accord with paragraph II, B. 1, of the action of University's Board of Trustees dated June 20, 1978, as amended on June 19, 1984, its books, records and accounts are open at all reasonable times to inspection and audit by appropriately designated University representatives.
- B. The parties agree that the University's Internal Auditors may conduct an audit of Foundation's operations and accounts for the period ending June 30, 1988 and such other audits, including audits to determine compliance with this agreement, the terms of the action of University's Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978, as amended on June 19, 1984, and the terms of the departmental agreements referred to in Section 20 hereof, as may be deemed necessary or advisable by the University of Kentucky Controller and Treasurer, and that Foundation's agents and employees will cooperate to the fullest extent possible with University's auditors designated to conduct same. Further, the parties agree that a firm of Certified Public Accountants, mutually agreeable to the parties, will be employed by the Foundation to perform an independent audit of the Foundation's books, records and accounts for the year ended June 30, 1988.
- C. The Parties agree that Foundation will be furnished information by University sufficient for Foundation to verify the nature and detail of expenditure of funds paid to University under the provisions of Section 5.c.1. hereinabove.

Section 15. DEFAULT

A. In the event of any failure of Foundation to pay any sum due to University hereunder within thirty (30) days after written notice of such default shall have been mailed to Foundation, or any failure to perform any other of the terms, conditions or covenants of this agreement to be observed or performed by Foundation for more than thirty (30) days after written notice of such default shall have been mailed to Foundation, or if Foundation shall become bankrupt or insolvent, or file any debtor proceedings, or take or have taken against Foundation in any court pursuant to any statute either of the United States or of any State a petition in bankruptcy or insolvency or for

reorganization or for the appointment of a receiver or trustee of all or a portion of Foundation's property, or if Foundation makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or petitions for or enters into an arrangement therewith, then University may terminate this agreement. Provided however, that should any default occur which cannot reasonably be corrected within such thirty (30) day period then Foundation shall have such additional time to correct said default as may be reasonably necessary if Foundation promptly initiates, and expeditiously carries out, appropriate action to correct such default.

B. University may at its election terminate this agreement with respect to any department without termination of the entire agreement for the same reasons and in the same manner as provided hereinabove.

Section 16. PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to provide that any member of University's clinical faculty, house staff or student is acting as an agent of Foundation when providing care to patients in University facilities or as a part of an approved University program. University agrees that, when so acting, said faculty, house staff and students shall beconsidered agents of said University and that payment of claims or judgments may be made on their behalf from the fund provided pursuant to KRS 164.941 or other University funds.

Section 17. APPLICATION OF INCOME

University agrees that it will not, during the operation of this contract, cause charges for services rendered after July 1, 1978 by members of

the faculty who have executed Practice Agreements and Assignments to be deposited in the accounts of the Fund for Advancement of Education and Research in the University of Kentucky pursuant to the provisions of University of Kentucky Administrative Regulation AR II-7.0; deposits of such charges attributable to faculty who have not executed said Practice Agreements and Assignments shall continue pursuant to said regulation.

Section 18. MANAGEMENT AND INVESTMENT POLICIES

- A. The parties recognize and agree that the reimbursement of
 University costs incurred attendant to the production of professional income
 and the provision of a sum equal to nine (9%) percent of Foundation's gross
 income for the purpose of providing an academic enrichment fund for
 University's College of Medicine constitute the second and third charges,
 respectively, upon Foundation's gross income, the first charge being
 Foundation's ordinary and necessary expenses incurred in billing and collecting
 said income and providing for the central administration of Foundation.
- B. Accordingly, Foundation agrees that it will deposit the funds necessary to meet its obligations for reimbursement of the University and the provision of the aforementioned academic enrichment fund in a separate account as received and that the funds in said account shall be invested only in the following: (1) direct obligations of the United States Treasury; (2) other appropriate securities issued by federal agencies (including the Federal National Mortgage Association, the Export Import Bank, Federal Intermediate Credit Bank, Federal Home Loan Banks, Federal Land Banks); and (3) certificates of deposit collateralized by direct obligations of the federal government, federal agency obligations which qualify for direct investment

under this recommendation, general obligations of the Commonwealth of Kentucky or obligations of the University of Kentucky.

Foundation shall be entitled to the investment income derived from said account, provided however investment income derived from balances attributed to the academic enrichment fund identified in subparagraph A. and Section 8, paragraph B. hereinabove shall be credited to said account.

Section 19. PROVISION OF PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE

A. Under the restructured professional liability insurance program of total self insurance, Foundation agrees that it will pay the University, as reimbursement, for its portion (43.77%) of the costs of the following: (i) payments required pursuant to KRS 164.941 in one (1) lump sum payment by July 15, 1988, and (ii) costs of claims administration in twelve (12) equal installments the first said installment being due and payable on July 31, 1988 and monthly thereafter until June 30, 1989.

B. In addition, Foundation has agreed that between July 1, 1988 and June 30, 1989, it will cause to be deposited in a separate account within the Foundation the sum of 43.77% of the additional contributions for self insurance, said account together with interest accruing thereto to be held solely for the purpose of payment of legal fees, settlements, and judgments arising for liabilities defined in KRS 164.941 (3). No monies in said account shall be expended for any other purpose than as provided in this Section without the written agreement of University, nor shall such monies be encumbered, pledged or otherwise hypothecated. The monies in said account shall be invested only as provided in Section 18 hereof. Payment to the separate account may be in equal installments, provided that the full 43.77% shall be deposited by June 30, 1989.

C. In sum, Foundation agrees to pay in both assessments and contributions 43.77% of the total program costs of 1988-89 as determined by KRS 164.941 and the Malpractice Risk Management Committee.

Section 20. ADMINISTRATION OF DEPARTMENTAL FUNDS

A. Foundation agrees that it will, after making provision for: (1) the costs of its administration and costs relating to billing and collection, (2) reimbursement of University expenses pursuant to Section 5 hereof, (3) the College of Medicine Academic Enrichment Fund pursuant to Section 8 hereof and (4) provision of professional liability insurance pursuant to Section 19 hereof, maintain its accounts in such a manner that income attributable to the professional clinical activities of each of the following departments or divisions shall be shown separately on books maintained by the Foundation from any other fund or funds held by said Foundation:

Ob/Gyn
Ophthalmology
Pathology
Pediatrics
Preventive Medicine & Environmental Health
Psychiatry
Radiation Medicine

B. Thereafter, Foundation agrees that it will expend the funds maintained by it in the aforementioned accounts only in accord with the departmental or divisional agreement relating to each department or division. Said departmental agreements are recognized as a material portion of this agreement. Therefore the parties agree that University shall retain custody of all funds accruing to the account of departments for which an approved departmental agreement has not been executed. Said departmental or divisional agreements may be amended from time to time, as provided in said agreements, with the approval of the Dean of the College of Medicine.

Section 21. NOTICES

All notices, demands and requests hereunder shall be in writing and shall be given by United States Registered or Certified Mail or by messenger delivery, in the case of University to:

Each party may from time to time change its address for purposes of notice by giving to the other party notice of such change of address. Any notice, demand or request given by United States Registered or Certified Mail, as provided herein, shall be deemed served on the date it is deposited in the United States mails properly addressed and with postage fully prepaid.

Section 22. RECORDS ACCESS

Pursuant to Public Law 96-499, Section 952, the Foundation agrees to make available upon written request from the Secretary of Health and Human Resources, the Comptroller General, or the Department of Human Services of the State of Kentucky or any of their duly authorized representatives, access to this contract and all other service agreements written or oral entered into or renewed since December 5, 1980, and access to books, documents, and records necessary to verify costs of services provided by such arrangements exceeding \$10,000 in a 12-month period. Access will be permitted until four years have expired after completion of services furnished, and in accordance with the applicable federal regulations.

If the Foundation carries out any of the duties under this contract through a sub-contract with a related organization, with a value or cost of \$10,000 or more over a 12-month period, such sub-contract shall contain a clause to the effect that until the expiration of four years after the furnishing of such services pursuant to the sub-contract, the related organization shall make available, upon written request from the Secretary or Comptroller General, or any of their duly authorized representatives, the sub-contract, books, documents and records of such organization that are necessary to verify the nature and extent of such costs.

Section 23. TERM

The term of this agreement shall begin on July 1, 1988 and end on June 30, 1989.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY

REGARDING THE USE OF CERTAIN ROOMS IN THE

In consideration of the establishment and construction of the Dorothy Enslow Combs Building of the Lucille Parker Markey Cancer Center, the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky hereby authorizes the McDowell Cancer Research Foundation, Inc., to use the atrium and the conference rooms in the Dorothy Enslow Combs Building so long as the McDowell Cancer Research Foundation, Inc., continues its substantial aid and assistance to the Lucille Parker Markey Cancer Center of the Albert B. Chandler Medical Center and the Albert B. Chandler Medical Center of the University of Kentucky; the use to be as follows:

For any reasonable use of the atrium in the Dorothy Enslow Combs Building for the purpose of promoting the welfare and success of the Lucille Parker Markey Cancer Center in particular and the Chandler Medical Center in general, primarily with reference to raising funds for buildings, equipment, furnishings, and funds for medical research for the Markey Cancer Center in particular and the Chandler Medical Center in general; the use to be similar to the functions heretofore held in the Combs atrium and the Roach Cancer Care Facility and for the additional purposes of showing and displaying the Combs Building to donors who have made the Dorothy Enslow Combs Building possible and for prospective donors; plus the use of the first floor conference room for the meetings by the McDowell Foundation trustees and staff at such time as is mutually convenient with the Director of the Markey Cancer Center, the Chancellor of the Chandler Medical Center, and the McDowell Foundation Trustees; and make access to the Combs Building available to fulfull the above purposes.

County appropriations for fiscal year 1988-89 will support the county extension program. The increase in Federal gifts and grants will support programs in Agricultural Economics, Occupational Medical Residency, and Vocational Education. The increase in other gifts and grants will support programs in Agricultural Economics, Surgery, McDowell Cancer, College of Pharmacy and the Community College System. The net increase in departmental sales and services will support programs in Communications, Education, Engineering, Counseling and Testing, Resource Management, Employee Benefits and Risk Management, Medicine, Surgery, McDowell Cancer, Center on Aging, Hazard, Madisonville, Paducah Community Colleges, Computing Center, and Research and Graduate Studies.

Leatherman Professorship of Law at a sum of no less than \$150,000 which shall be funded from multiple gifts to the College specifically for this professorship, or from gifts designated for general use by the College which this resolution authorizes the dean to quasi-endow as funds are received.

Background: The principal of the Laramie L. Leatherman Professorship of Law shall initially consist of \$90,000, of which \$75,000 shall be furnished by the College of Law of the University and \$15,000 shall be furnished by Mr. Leatherman. It is the intention of Mr. Leatherman to add \$15,000 to the professorship in each of the succeeding four years, which will result in a total final amount of \$150,000. The amount may be increased later by Mr. Leatherman or others. The principal is to be preserved by the University and invested to produce an annual dividend/interest income.

Laramie L. Leatherman, a 1953 graduate of the University of Kentucky College of Law, has distinguished himself as a University of Kentucky Fellow and an Emeritus Member of the College of Law Visiting Committee. Mr. Leatherman is a partner in the Louisville law firm of Greenebaum Doll & McDonald.

Mr. Leatherman has a deep and continuing commitment to quality legal education in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. He believes the College of Law cannot afford to lose its best and brightest scholars. He hopes his support will help the College of Law continue on its path toward excellence and that his gift will encourage other alumni and friends of the law school decide to fund professorships.
