JULIAN M. CARROLL

Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

JULIAN MORTON CARROLL became Kentucky's 58th governor on December 28, 1974, succeeding Wendell H. Ford, who was elected to the U. S. Senate. Carroll then won a full four-year term in the 1975 general election. Born in McCracken County in 1931, he attended Paducah Junior College after graduating from Heath High School. He was graduated from the University of Kentucky in 1954 and received his law degree from UK in 1956. Before becoming governor, Carroll served three years as lieutenant governor and ten years as a member of the Kentucky House of Representatives. He is an active member of the Optimist Club and a former Jaycee. He attained the highest office in Kentucky for laymen of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in 1966-77 when he was named moderator of the Kentucky Synod. The Governor and his wife, Charlann, have four children.

H. FOSTER PETTIT

Mayor Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government

H. FOSTER PETTIT served two years as mayor of the City of Lexington and was a leader in the consolidation of the city and county governments. He was elected mayor of the Urban County Government in November 1973.

President of the Kentucky Municipal League for 1976, Mayor Pettit is also active with the U. S. Conference of Mayors and the National League of Cities. He was awarded the Optimist Cup in 1976 and the Chamber of Commerce Citizen-of-the-year citation for 1975.

As chief executive of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the mayor is authorized to supervise, administer and control all departments of government.


The mayor is elected on a non-partisan basis every four years. He is responsible for the proper administration of all services of the government. He is assisted principally by the Chief Administrative Officer and commissioners of the six departments.

A native of Lexington, he is an attorney who served three terms as a state representative. He resides on Richmond Road with his wife, Marion, and four sons.



Dr. Otis A. Singletary University of Kentucky President



Now in his ninth year as president of the University of Kentucky, DR. OTIS A. SINGLETARY is a Mississippian whose route to the Bluegrass State curled through Louisiana, Texas, North Carolina and Washington, D. C.

He came to Lexington from a position as University of Texas vice-chancellor for academic affairs. Previously, in Washington, he had been director of the U. S. Job Corps in the early stages of its development before moving to the American Council on Education as vice-president. He had gone to the capital in 1964 after three years as chancellor of the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

The UNC appointment terminated Dr. Singletary's first association with the University of Texas, this a seven-year stay that saw him, as a young historian, rise rapidly in rank from instructor to full professor and begin the shift to administrative work, first as associate dean and later as assistant to the president.

The Kentucky president, and his wife—the former Gloria Walton, met when both were students at Millsaps College. He later earned master's and doctoral degrees at Louisiana State. The Singletarys have two daughters, Bonnie and Kendall, and a son, Scott.

Cliff Hagan Director of Athletics

"I've been preparing for this all my life," CLIFF HAGAN said before taking over as athletics director at the University of Kentucky in 1975. Hagan succeeded Harry Lancaster as director after serving as assistant director for three years.

Hagan's path to the athletics directorship began in Owensboro, Kentucky, where he established a then state high school tournament record of 41 points in leading Owensboro to victory over Lafayette in the championship game of the 1949 state high school tournament.

At UK, he played on teams that won 86 of 91 games and an NCAA championship (1951). The 1954 team, undefeated in 25 games, elected not to participate in the national tournament.



FRANK HAM **Assistant Director** of Athletics

FRANK HAM became Assistant Director of Athletics in July 1975 soon after Cliff Hagan succeeded Harry C. Lancaster as Director of Athletics.

A native of Scranton, Pa., Ham came to the University in 1969 as Administrative Assistant to football coach John Ray, and was reassigned to the Athletic Director's staff in 1972 when Ray resigned.

Ham graduated from high school at Niles, Michigan, and completed his undergraduate work at Olivet College. He did graduate work at Indiana University and coached high school football and track at John Adams High in South Bend in 1944-46 and then returned to Olivet as athletic director and head football and basketball coach.

In 1962, he became assistant to the president at Olivet, with responsibilities in public and alumni relations. He was in private business from 1954 until 1968.

He is married to the former Rosemary Woods of Niles, Michigan. They have two sons, Michael, of Raleigh, N. C., and Craig, a U. S. Army Captain, and two daughters, Mrs. Andy Hunsberger of Cassopolis, Michigan and Jennifer, a senior at UK. Ham is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Albert B. Ham of Edwardsburg, Michigan.

LARRY IVY Assistant Director of Athletics For Finance


Adding a new dimension to UK athletics was the appointment last year of LARRY IVY as Assistant Director of Athletics for Finance.

University of Kentucky Wildcats Head Basketball Coach

JOE B. HALL'S record as Wildcat head coach for the past five years stands at 105-40. Hall became No. 1 varsity assistant and head freshman coach to Adolph Rupp after Harry C. Lancaster was named permanent athletic director on February 1, 1969. His record with the freshmen was 60-15, including an undefeated (22-0) season (1971-72) which resulted in the Kittens being crowned National Freshman Champions by the Basketball News.

During his first season as head coach, the Wildcats won their last nine conference games to sew up the SEC title.

His eleven-year coaching record is 181-96. Broken down, it shows a 57-50 five year mark at Regis, a 19-6 record at Central Missouri, and a 105-40 five year record at Kentucky.

A popular personality on the clinic and convention circuits, Hall also has had much international exposure. In addition to the Globetrotters tour in 1951, and the "Down Under" tour in 1974, he has helped conduct basketball clinics for the U.S. Army in Anchorage and Fairbanks, Alaska (1968) and at Ramstein Air Base in Frankfurt, Germany and the RAF Base at Mildenhall, England in 1975. He also was Olympic Trials coach under Hank Iba at the Air Force Academy in July 1972 and was a member of the 1976 Olympic Basketball Committee.

Coaching Assistants

DICK PARSONS

DICK PARSONS, in his sixth year as Joe B. Hall's No. 1 assistant, returned to the University as baseball coach in 1969. Before giving up his position to join basketball on a full time basis, he molded a baseball team (1971) which established or tied 15 school records.

LEONARD HAMILTON

Much of Kentucky's defensive prowess on the court can be credited to the talent of LEONARD HAMILTON, a fourth year assistant, who came to UK after three years as an assistant at Austin Peay State University.

JOE DEAN, JR.

The newest addition to the Wildcat coaching staff is parttime assistant coach JOE DEAN, JR. Dean, who will be working primarily with the Wildcat guards, is a 1976 graduate of Mississippi State University where he played guard for the Bulldogs and then joined the coaching staff while completing requirements for a masters degree in physical education.











ROY DON WILSON **Trainer**

Entering his eighth year at UK is Roy Don Wilson, who came to the University after serving two years as trainer at The Citadel. A native of Texas, he is a graduate of Amon Carter Riverside High School in Fort Worth. He received his B. S. degree from Texas A & M with a major in physical education and a minor in business. He is married to the former Patricia Jane Cotter of Houston. They have a son and a daughter.

WALT McCOMBS **Trainer**

Returning to UK last year after a three-year absence during which he served in a similar capacity at Clemson University is Walt McCombs. Assigned primarily to basketball, McCombs also works with Wilson on the football filed. A native of Belton, S. C., McCombs is a graduate of Parker High School and a 1971 graduate of The Citadel, where he was student trainer for four years. He was assistant trainer at UK in 1972 and '73. He is married to the former Shelby Burris of Belton.


What Are They Doing When They're Not Playing Ball?

A Memorial Coliseum crowd of 11,350 watched Billy Lickert (a graduate of Lexington Lafayette) score 23 points to lead Adolph Rupp's "Fledgling Five" to a 72-60 victory over the Mustangs from Southern Methodist University.

The victory was the fourth straight season win for the Wildcats despite a hot shooting performance by the Mustangs' Max Williams. Williams totaled 21 points.

Kentucky trailed only twice in the contest at 4-2 after two minutes of play and 6-4 a couple of minutes later. The score was deadlocked four times in the first half of action.

With the exception of the last minute and 34 seconds of the first half, Kentucky's five starters (Johnny Cox, Billy Ray Lickert, Dickie Parsons, Don Mills and Sid Cohen) went the route.

COACH WILLIAM "SONNY" ALLEN



William "Sonny" Allen, who has compiled winning seasons in 10 of his last 11 seasons, is in his third year as head basketball coach at SMU.

Under Allen's guidance, SMU has brought a fast break atmosphere to Moody Coliseum and to the city of Dallas, and Mustang basketball fans are packing the arena in record fashion.

Allen's 12 year coaching record stands at 205-124 and before coming to SMU, he directed Old Dominion University to a division II national championship. During his 10-year stay at the Norfolk, Va., school, Allen's teams compiled a 181-94 record and reached the finals of the national tournament twice.

In 1975, Old Dominion beat New Orleans in the finals

76-74. His team posted a 25-6 record and Allen was named the National Division II Coach of the Year by both the Associated Press and the National Association of Basketball Coaches. Indiana's Bobby Knight won the award as Division I Coach of the Year. The NCBC also named Allen as the District II Coach of the Year in 1970 and 1974.

Under his direction, Old Dominion also finished second in the 1971 NCAA Division II national tourney. Before coming to ODU in 1965, Allen coached five Marshall University freshman teams to 68 wins, including 26 in a row.


During his first year at SMU, Allen directed the Mustangs to a 16-12 record and he was named the Southwest Conference Coach of the Year by United Press International, and the SMU basketball team was named by Basketball Weekly as the most improved team in the nation.

Fast break basketball has been Allen's game since his high school days at Moundsville, W. Va. Later as a 5-11 wingman on the 1958 Marshall team that led the nation in scoring, Sonny played the game he is now coaching. His "Run to Score" offense incorporates all players into a consistently patterned fast break system that takes advantage of the strengths of each man and phases naturally into a controlled offense. Allen is one of the most popular coaches in the country and speaks frequently at coaching clinics throughout the nation.

He is a 1959 graduate of Marshall and earned his Masters there in 1962.

He has served as manager of the NCAA Mid-East Basketball Tournament (1968), president of the Southeastern Conference Sports Information Directors Association and chairman of the Basketball Hall of Fame Committee of the College Sports Information Directors Association and was recipient of the 1971 Churchmen's "Sportswriters of the Year" award.

JACK PERRY joined the Sports Information staff in March, 1970, after 15 years with the Lexington Herald-Leader, where he was Librarian for 10 years. A native Lexingtonian, Jack attended the University in 1949-50 before entering the United States Air Force. He is married to the former Miss Barbara Sanders of Lexington. They have four children—Mrs. Greg Moore, of Owensboro, Ky., Mrs. Deborah Case, Jack David and Todd, of Lexington.







Arena Information

FIRST AID

The University of Kentucky and the Lexington Center provide for your convenience and weltare, a First Aid Station on the Purple Concourse. Persons with any type of chronic medical problem are requested to leave their name and seat location with the nurse on duty at the First Aid Station. A person in need of assistance with a health emergency should report the situation immediately to an usher. Doctors on call and other individuals who might expect an emergency call are requested to leave their name and seat location at the will call window of the box office prior to entering Rupp Arena. In the event of an emergency, you will be notified at your seat. In order that the activities and program in Rupp Arena not be disrupted, paging over the public address system is not possible.

CARDIAC CARE

In cooperation with the University Medical Service, the University of Kentucky provides a cardiac resuscitation program at all UK basketball games.

LOST AND FOUND

Lost and found articles should be reported or turned in to an usher or a security officer. You may wish to write to the director of arena security and describe lost articles which will be returned if found.

NO HORNS

Horns are not permitted in Rupp Arena and will be picked up at the entrances. Be considerate and allow your neighbor to enjoy the game. Keep portable radios at a low volume.

GATE INFORMATION

Rupp Arena will normally open one hour prior to any scheduled event. Please do not leave the arena until the conclusion of an event or game or at half-time if you plan to re-enter. No "Pass-out" tickets will be issued and you will not be permitted to re-enter.

COURT REGULATIONS

Spectators must keep off the court at all times. Spectators must use the arena stairs and vomities. There are no public facilities located on the arena floor level. Public facilities in Rupp Arena are located on the entry concourse level. You will find all refreshment stands, drinking fountains, public telephones, restrooms, vending machines and first aid on the concourse level.

LIQUORS

Alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited within the arena as are all food and drink containers including hard surfaced materials of any type, bottles, cans, thermos bottles, ice bags, ice chest, and any object related to above. Arena personnel are instructed to enforce this rule in the interest of safety.

PUBLIC ADDRESS

Messages for the public address announcer are acceptable only in emergencies and must be approved by the Sports Information Director at University of Kentucky basketball events.

SIGNS

Signs and barriers are restricted in Rupp Arena in accordance with policies established by arena management and public safety officials.
