OIR BRINGS HOME THE BRONZE

The Office of Instructional Resources has been awarded a Bronze medal in the 1990 International Film & TV Festival of New York for its series "Mind Over Math." A co-production of OIR and The Learning Channel, the five-program series, produced and directed by Carol Spence, with executive producers Andy Spears, Paul LeVeque and Tod Porter, took third place in the Educational/Instructional Series category of the competition.

"Mind Over Math" is targeted toward high school students preparing to take the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT). It airs nationally on The Learning Channel, as well as being available for purchase by individuals. To date, over 500 copies of the series have been sold.

UK LIBRARIES TO SPONSOR SOLINET **PRESERVATION** WORKSHOP

On May 22 and 23, 1991, the UK Libraries will host a SOLINET Preservation Program Workshop on the fundamental techniques of book repair. SOLINET trainers will be Sand Nyberg and former UK Librarian Libby Potts Pollard. Atendance will be limited to 25 people and the registration fee for the two-day workshop will be \$125 for SOLINET members registering at least three weeks in advance, \$135 late registration for members, and \$185 for non-members. Partial funding for this workshop has been provided by a grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities.

Due to the high registration fee and attendance limits, the Preservation Department intends to offer in-house training in the months following the workshop for those staff members involved in book repair.
