

A. and M. College of Kentucky.
November 2, 1900

The faculty met in regular monthly session in the President's room in the college building at 4 pm.

Present President Patterson, Prof. White, H. A. Patterson, Kastle, Roark, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Peuce, Wernicke, Brooks, Carpenter.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

J. S. Johnson. Prof. Wernicke stated that he had received a communication from J. S. Johnson expressing a desire to do work leading to a masters degree with German as a major study.

Ordered on motion of Prof. Miller that the request of Mr. Johnson be referred to the Classical faculty.

The committee appointed to consider and report upon the relation which the Kentuckian bears to the college was given more time in which to prepare its report.

There was some discussion relative to the meaning of rule No 6, page 88 Volume II of the minutes of the Board of Trustees

Practice Games. Prof. Wernicke seconded by Prof. Anderson moved "that the term 'practice games' in section 6 be interpreted to mean 'games played for practice, under the form of matched games'".

Prof. Kastle seconded by Prof. Roark moved that Prof. Wernicke's motion be laid on the table, Motion lost

Aye - White, Kastle, Roark, Brooks - 4
No - Patterson, Anderson, Mathews, Miller, Peuce, Wernicke - 4

Prof. Wernicke's motion was then put upon its passage and carried as follows.

Aye - Prof. White, Patterson, Anderson, Matthews, Wernicke, and Brooks,

No - Prof. Kastle, Roark, Peuce.

Prof. Miller was excused from voting.

Prof. Kastle explained his vote by saying that he did not like to vote for any resolution which provides for an interpretation of an action of the Board of Trustees.

Prof. Peuce explained his vote in nearly the same manner.
