Elsewhere on this page there appears a column by John Ed Pearce, the iconoclast within our bids, which for the most part is a defense of the prevailing student philosophy on the subject of classroom cheating. Much of this article we think well-founded, but a goodly portion of it we believe to be erroneous because the fundamental factor has been overlooked.

When Mr. Pearce says for example, that many students cheat because dull pre-requisite courses are forced down their throats, he touches upon what is perhaps the most vulnerable spot in the entire University curriculum—and recent campus cribbing investigations support his contention. According to one of these surveys, the most frequently repeated reason for cheating given by undergraduates was that they "regarded the course just as a requirement," and consequently had no qualums.

There was likewise indicated a high correlation between cribbing on the part of students and the over-emphasizing of grades on the part of instructors. And widely offered was the explanation: "in a number of cases students find the course very difficult, and since the professor does not clarify it, you have to get it some way."

These points, together with a few minor ex-

These points, together with a few minor explanations, build up what appears on the surface to be a pretty sound defense for classroom cheating, and were the problem itself only a surface one, this newspaper would be perfectly content to accept Mr. Pearce's arguments as comprising a convincing case. However, we must point out that the above reasons, well-dounded though they may be, merely explain why cribbing at UK is so prevailent; they cannot excuse the practice of the practice of the tise. It is a fine at itself. And between the two situations there is we think, a great deal of difference. Futhermore, we believe there is an even more significant item involved; one which, because it has not as yet been vigorously attacked—much less routed—we can only conclude still applies to the matter in question.

We are rather reluctant to refer to this issue We are rather reductant to refer to this issue as being a "moral" one, for members of our generation tend to think of morality in terms of convention—a thing for which they rightly have a contempt. Besides, we have our doubts as to whether the question actually is a case involving morality; morality, that is, in the so-called "real" sense. It is more, it seems to us, a question of

is a new code and supposedly original with them, and it is based on a fundamental loathing for hypocrisy. In brief, it goes something like this: it does not matter so much what you are 'or what you say or what you do, so long as you are consistent with the pattern which you have cut out for yourself. The collegian practices this seldom that one finds it violated.

That is why we think it strange that students are inconsistent with it on the question of cheating ber se. We know any number of undergraduates who see nothing wrong with cribbing because they regard it as a non-moral issue, as simply a case in which the end justifies the means. And yet we have watched these very same persons sit at thespridge and poker table, and they all frown darkly on anyone even suspected of reneging or telegraphing or having aces utcked away in his clothing.

We have seen these same individuals hand a couple of dollars to friends who are going to the races, with instructions to bet it for them, never dreaming, apparently, that it would be possible for those friends to pull fast ones on them to their own profit. And in a game of ping pong they will not hesitate a whit to concede the point if they know their opponent's shot has grazed the edge of the table—even if they are the only ones in the room who know positively that the ball actually touched.

Yet these are the very same persons who walk into exams fully armed with 'ponics' and pre-

they are the only ones in the room who know positively that the ball actually touched. Yet these are the very same persons who walk into exams fully armed with "ponies" and pre-filled out quiz pads, and who use them freely and think nothing of it. Nor do they pause even for a second or smile a bit before they write and sign their "I have neither given nor received..." pledges at the end of the papers.

We have no especial condemnation or approval to place upon this philosophy; we only have doubts concerning its logic. If cheating in one set of circumstances is to be condoned, then why is it not condoned in all cases' And, on the other hand, if dishonesty be frowned upon in one instance, why is it not looked down upon in all instances. Consistency is the watchword, you know.

know.

Thus, if we have stated our premises correctly—and we believe from the facts available that we have, and if our logic is correct—and here we are using the same logic that students use to guard against hypocrisy—then we can only conclude that the members of our generation are a race of hypocrites.

It's a strange creed, this new streamlined morality: it embraces that which it purports to despise—and thinks no less of itself for doing so.

Michigan Case May Prove Beginning Of End For U.S. Academic Freedom

In this Michigan case there appear to be some ominous goings on which won't be aired at all and which may in time prove fatal to academic freedom in the United States.

Most of the publicity given the case has been in reference to the unprecedented dismissal of some thirteen students, and their reinstatement ... if they be reinstated... will very likely close the case completely. However, it does appear that those dismissals were only the product, and the overt result of an intricate, veiled movement on the Michigan campus not too dissimilar from the tactics of the Silver Shirts or the Christian Front.

And if the present investigation that is brew-ing in Ann Arbor wants to be recognized as a successful one, it better pry deeply into the whole mess there and not stop at reinstatement of the students, or even at a fair hearing. It should attempt to smash part of the iron ring that surrounds the University, according to a repu-table source like The Nation.

Dr. Ruthven is only a part of that ring, but his history so contradicts his present manife-tations that one can't help suspecting ominious doings by a clan which gives him orders. He is tolerating today a group of reactionary aides who devote half their time to harrassing students with unorthodox views. This group questions applicants for admission as to political views and has interfered time and again with student expression in student publications. It has denied the use of lecture halls to a wide variety
