Patterson called attention to the observations he had made of increasing laxity on the part of our students, in attendance upon classes, and in general demoralization of college work due to dances, dramatic performances, athletics etc. and urged the importance of devising some means by which these amusements could be kept within reasonable limits.

An informal discussion of the situation followed in which most of the members present took part.

Upon motion of Prof. Anderson seconded by Prof. Brooks it was ordered that a permanent committee of three on absences be appointed, with power to deal with all questions pertaining to absences from class exercises. The president appointed Messrs. Burr, Prof. Mackenzie, and Wernicke.

drawn up

The importance of the committee upon Athletics having more definite instructions from the faculty relative to its authority and duties, was urged by several members of the committee and upon motion of Prof. Anderson seconded by Prof. J. G. White



it was ordered that the Committee on Athletics should draw up a set of rules for its guidance and submit these rules to the faculty for its approval.

German as  
an Entrance  
requirement

Upon motion of Prof. Kerrick seconded by Prof. Anderson it was ordered "that henceforth German, as far as it may be taught in the Academy, shall form an entrance condition to all courses in the College proper".
