include the President, all Vice Presidents, all Deans, the Director of the Libraries, the Director of the Community College System, the Professor of Military Science, the Professor of Air Science, the President of the Student Congress and two other students named by the Congress, and the Chairmen of the several Senate Committees, if not already members of the Senate. Other ex-officio members may be added with the approval of the Senate Council. Ex-officio members shall enjoy all the privileges of the elected membership except the right to vote.

Chairman Sears resumed the chair and expressed thanks to Dr. Butwell and the members of the Committee on behalf of the University Senate for their diligent work and for the carrying through of this assignment.

The Chairman announced that the Secretary, University Senate, had mailed the Rules of the University Faculty, 1964 to the entire membership of the Senate and that full circularization would be given to the revised and updated University Senate Rules which, hopefully, will be completed before next September.

The Chairman reminded the Senate that no meeting would be held in January, 1968.

The Senate adjourned at 4:15 p.m.

Dr. Robert Rudd presented a Resolution on the death of Dr. Aubrey J. Brown with the recommendation that it be spread upon the minutes of the Senate and a copy be sent to the family. The Resolution was accepted and the Senate stood for a moment of silent tribute in memory of Dr. Brown.

DR. AUBREY J. BROWN

Dr. Aubrey J. Brown, Chairman of the Department of Agricultural Economics for 21 years, died January 8, 1968 at the age of 54 after an illness of about six months. By his death the University of Kentucky lost one of its well-known leaders and persons who really knew him lost a warm and devoted friend.

Three words which may exemplify the life of Dr. Brown are friendliness, optimism and energy. His optimism inspired confidence. There was no element of defeatism in his makeup. Even during his painful illness, his physicians, nurses and visitors were impressed by his unflinching spirit of cheer and hope. His emotions always were under control.

In his professional life Dr. Brown made many friends. To him, no man was a stranger. A new acquaintance, after a brief contact, became to him a personal friend. It mattered little whether the caller was a student seeking advice or the president of a bank or large corporation; in half an hour the acquaintanceship was on a "first name" basis.

Throughout much of his professional career he carried burdens to which many would have succumbed yet even those who worked closely with him were

hardly aware of his load.

As a teacher, Dr. Brown was well liked by his students. Many sought his advice on personal as well as academic matters. As an administrator he was free with praise and light on criticism. He encouraged his staff in professional advancement and gave recognition to achievement. While serving on the Board of Directors of the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland, after each meeting he shared with his staff the nonconfidential information presented to that board. His contacts with farm leaders in the state were widespread. He was in frequent demand for talks on economic subjects and was free in sharing his insight with his audiences. In recognition of his ability he was invited to serve on numerous boards and committees in such organizations as the Kentucky Farm Bureau Federation, the Burley and Dark Leaf Export Association, the Kentucky Cooperative Council and the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce.

He was the father of two daughters and a son, of whom he was justly proud. His example and counsel are reflected in their characters and achievements. Margaret Ann, now Mrs. Roger L. Huston, was graduated from the University of Kentucky with a major in child development. Aubrey Charles now is a first year law student at the University, having graduated in Commerce in 1967. Paula Louise is a freshman at the University of Kentucky.

His favorite personal diversion was golf. He appreciated its physical benefits, played the game with enthusiasm and valued the friendly associations made with other golf enthusiasts.

His academic accomplishments are a matter of record. They include an undergraduate degree in Civil Engineering and his slide rule still was at a convenient location in his desk at the time of his death. While an undergraduate at the University of Illinois, he became interested in Agricultural Economics and pursued graduate study in that discipline. He joined the University of Kentucky in 1938 and completed requirements for the Ph.D. in 1946. In 1947 he was promoted to Professor and Head of his department. He served on numerous College, Senate, and University Committees during his academic career.

Dr. Brown served on the Board of Directors of the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland for six years, 1958 through 1963, and was one of the first members of the faculty elected to the University of Kentucky Board of Trustees. He served on the Board of Directors of the University Athletic Association from 1951 until his death. He was vice-president of the American Farm Economics Association in 1959, and at his death was a member of the National Tobacco Industry Advisory Committee and an advisory member of the Agricultural Committee of the American Bankers Association.

Dr. Brown was the author of several Experiment Station bulletins and of numerous articles in the farm press. His real contributions, however, are written in the hearts and minds of his students, of the persons who listened to his informative and timely talks, and of those who received counsel and encouragement through personal conversations with the man himself.

As Secretary of the University Senate Council Dr. Rudd reported that following the President's statement to the joint Houses of the Legislature on February 1st the President conferred with the Senate Council on matters relating to that statement about inviting speakers on the campus; that the Senate Council is now considering the issues raised and expects to have a statement for consideration of the Senate by the end of February at a called meeting.

PROFESSOR JOHN RAY

John Ray died on February 22, 1968 at the age of 28; with his surprising death came the end of the ability and promise he had demonstrated to the University of Kentucky and its School of Architecture in which he served as an Assistant Professor.

John Ray came to UK in 1966 as a design instructor from the Cranbrook Academy of Art where he obtained his master's degree. While there he held the Eliel Saarinen Memorial Scholarship.
