MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE  
 February 10, 1930

The University Senate met in the lecture room of McVey Hall Monday, February 10, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of January 20 were approved as read.

The Senate considered the recommendation of the Committee on Duplication of Courses concerning prerequisites which was held over from the last meeting for consideration. After an amendment, the recommendation was approved as follows:

1. That prerequisites be considered under two headings:
  - a. Classification
  - b. Prescribed
2. That the University Senate define prerequisites as to classification, and that the departments concerned specify the courses.
3. If the above view is accepted, the Committee recommends:
  - a. That junior classification be required for admission to all courses that may be counted for graduate work. Exceptions to this rule in particular cases may be made by the Dean and the Head of the Department concerned.
  - b. That the departments concerned prescribe the courses required, and transmit them to the Registrar for publication in the University catalog.



The following courses and changes in courses recommended by the Committee on Duplication of Courses, were approved:

- ✓ Chemistry 102, Elementary Electro-Analysis, 10 hours a week, 5 credits per semester. Prerequisites, Chemistry 101, or 131b, 109, 127b.
- ✓ Physical Education 21a and 21b. Calisthenics and Gymnastic Stunts. Each runs one-half a semester, ten hours a week, 2 credits each. (To replace Education 21, 4 credits)
- ✓ Drop: Animal Industry 122, Advanced Poultry Breeding, 2 credits.  
Substitute: Animal Industry 127, Advanced Poultry Breeding, three credits. Prerequisites Animal Industry 22 and 119.
- ✓ Drop: Entomology 3, Economic Entomology, 3 credits.  
Substitute: Entomology 10, Agricultural Entomology, three credits.
- ✓ Add: Entomology 102, Advanced Agricultural Entomology, three credits. Prerequisites Entomology 10.
- ✓ Drop: Entomology 4, Horticultural Entomology, three credits.  
Substitute: Entomology 104, Economic Entomology, Farm Crop insects and Animal Parasites, three credits. Prerequisites Entomology 10.
- ✓ Change the number of Entomology 6, Apiculture, three credits, to Entomology 11, Apiculture, three credits.
- ✓ Add: Entomology 106a-b, Systematic and Technical Agricultural Entomology, three credits each semester. Prerequisites Entomology 10, and either 102, 103 or 104.
- ✓ Drop: Entomology 101a-b, Special Problems, three credits each semester.  
Substitute: Entomology 201a-b, Entomological Problems, three credits each semester. Prerequisites Entomology 10 and either 102 or 103.
- ✓ Commerce 140, Advertising Campaigns, 3 hours a week, 3 credits. Prerequisite Commerce 114 or Psych 5.

The report of the special committee on examinations was considered, and after some discussion was referred to the committee to be presented at a called meeting of the Senate.
