

Finish line holds big things for UK sprinter

Tim Harden doesn't even like to run. But that doesn't matter — because the UK sprint-considers himself more of a competitor than a

runner anyway.

Not that sprinting down the track isn't enjoyable, but for Harden the pleasure comes in the kill, the victory. What's fun is leaving opposing runners in his dust.

"I don't go out and run for the fun of it," Harden said. "I'm a sprinter. I go out there for the competi-

Actually, Harden has done a little bit more than just compete in his college career. He has dominated.

After winning the 55-meter dash at the NCAA Indoor Championships last month in Indianapolis, Harden was selected USA Track and Field Athlete of the Year. Earlier this year, Harden won the 00-meter dash at the USA/Mobil Indoor Championships in Atlanta.

The junior from Kansas City also has won two Southeastern Conference crowns in the 55 meters and another in the 100.

But as Harden racks up the hardware in the collegiate ranks, talk of moving on to the next level runs rampant.

giate ranks, talk of moving on to the mass running on the rampant. In track, the next level means running on the international circuit in Europe. After all in America, prominent track athletes often are overshadowed by what Harden called the "big three"— basketball, baseball and football. In Europe, however, people

take their track seriously.

"I'm looking forward to going to Europe," Harden said. "I've never been there, and I think it would be a good experience for me and something to tell the grandkids about."

As for the Olympics, Harden said the 1996 games in Atlanta and future Olympiads are not out of the question.

"Eventually, I will make one of the world teams," he said. "It's just a matter of when."

And as a track athlete, Harden has the luxury of taking things at his own pace. After all, track stars, such as Carl Lewis and Edwin Moses, have competed well into their 30s.

The Virginia Avenue incident was the third of three assaults that occurred on within a half an hour of each other in the early morning hours of Feb 10. McComas said yesterday that O'Connor also is a suspect in the two other incidents. According to UK and and Lexington police reports, the first incident occurred just after 2 a.m. in startway No. 191 of Greg Page Apartments. A female student was walking up the stairs when a man tried to steal her purse, police said. The strap broke, and the suspect fled.

At 215 a.m., a female student was chased by two men, less then a mile away from the location of the first assault.

Reports said the suspects matched the description given by the first victim.

O'Connor is scheduled to appear in Fayette County District Court on Thursday in Courtroom Five for a preliminary hearing.

NATION Faulkner to take part in military training

CHARLESTON, S.C. — A federal appeals court opened the way yesterday for Shannon Faulkner to become the first woman to take part in military training at The Citadel.

A panel of the 4th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals panel agreed that South Carolina's all-male military college violated her rights under the equal protection clause of the 14th Amendment in refusing to admit her.

The 2-1 decision upheld an order last July by U.S. District Judge C. Weston Houck, who ended 151 years of all-male military education at the Charleston school.

Faulkner has been attending classes at The Citadel since January 1994 under an order from Houck but had not been allowed to take part in military training or wear a uniform while the case was being appealed.

The appeals court ordered the school to admit Faulkner to the corps of cades in August unless it can come up with an alternative plan to give women military-style education by then.

But the panel also said it was unlikely the school could have such a plan ready by the fall, when Faulkner will be a junior. Cadets cannot begin the program after their junior year.

GOP congressman running for president

Bob Dornan became the seventh GOP presidential contender yesterday, injecting his no-holds-barred style into the race as he railed against the entertainment world's "filth" and society's "moral decay." "I believe that America is poisoning itself, that we are destroying this God-blessed nation of ours," the California congressman told a band of supporters at the national memorial to slain police officers. Dornan kicked off his dark-horse campaign with a rambling, flamboyant speech that showcased two of his favorite themes — admiration for the nation's military and police officers and devotion to moral issues.

He spoke candidly when asked how he has tried talking with editors of local newspapers in the past but now does not care.

"A resume is extremely important, because that's going to be a student's marketing tool," UK Career Adviser Sharon Childs said. "It's important that it be neat and the spelling is cor-

Childs recommends a seven category format for students that want to create a resumé that outlines the past employment and special activities of

The first section is a heading that should include the person's name centered in bold type at the top of

the page.
In this section, a student should also include a permanent address, telephone number and any temporary addresses.

The second section is an objective — what position the person is applying for. Childs said an objective is an optional but positive addition to most resumés.

"For a while we were telling students that they followed by references.

didn't need an objective," she said. "But now it seems many people are asking for objectives

The third part of a complete resumé is the per-

spective employee's education.

This section should include the name and location of the college or university, degree name and date of graduation.

Childs said a GPA should be

Childs said a GPA should be included if it is above a 3.0.
Following education, a person should list their job experience including the name and location of the company, job description and dates of employment.
"It would be better if you could list experience in the area you are

It would be better in you could list experience in the area you are applying for," Childs said. "But if you don't have any, you'll have to go with what you have."

The fifth section should include any special skills which might be benefitied to an ample."

beneficial to an employer. Such skills would include com puter knowledge and language and communication skills. Job seekers should try and list any special activi-

ties, like fraternity or sorority involvement next

Dress is important in job hunt

The job interview is, for hun-The job interview is, for hungry job-seekers, slightly lower than "Being jabbed in the eye with a harpoon" on the Fun Scale. You worry about saying the wrong thing. You worry about having a single hair out of place. You worry about doing everything right, but being rejected anyway because the interviewer was having a really bad day.

bad day.

Don't worry so much.

"People think of interviews as "People think of interviews as one-sided, and it really shouldn't be like that at all," said Bill Felty, assistant director of the UK Career Center.
"It should be viewed as a conversation between two professionals. Let

resauon between two professionals. It's a two-way street. You're trying to learn things from them; they're trying to learn things from you. It's not one person begging the other for a job."

Employer research and selfassessment are the two most important things you can do before you go. You need to know what skills

someone needs to do this particular job. You need to be able to articulate exactly why you are qualified. You need to find out some things about that company, so you'll know what you're

getting into "I think people have written really elongated books about interviewing techniques, but the important thing is to convince the interviewer that you can do

the job," he said.
You can tell the interviewer that you can do this and do that,

that you can do this and do that, Felty said, and leave the interview thinking you looked really good, but if you can't do what they're looking for, you aren't going to be hired no matter how what else you can do.

Getting dressed up, the bane of col-lege students used to slumming around in sweats and T-shirts, is nonetheless a very important compo-

important component of interviews.

"A lot of people say to me 'I'm going to be wearing jeans' or whatever, but appearance and making a professional presentation is important," he said.

No interviewer thinks that the way you're dressed for the interview is how you dress all the time.

the time.

"An employer is going to assume in an interview that this is the most professional presen-tation that you're going to make," he said.

The image you present when you walk in, Felty said, is: When

ever reason, this is how I'll look. If you walk in and don't look best, the interviewer will your best, the interviewer will think, "What's he going to look like when he dresses down?" Dressing up may not be your style, but for something as important as this,

you need to make it your style, at least for

one day.

Some individuality is acceptable, but it still needs to be a professional presentation. "Don't let the way

by being prepared.

tant. If you're not comfortable speaking, work on that. Try to anticipate what questions might be asked and how you would

respond to them.
"I think a lot of people ignore the human side of interviewing. They forget you have to make a human connection with the interviewer," Felty said.

"You can sit there and answer all the right questions and look right, but it you become sort of an interviewing robot, you're going to miss out."



employers.

Drema Howard, associate director of the UK Career Center, said the jobline is a quick, effective way for students to find employment without having to wrestle classified ads or flyers off the Whitehall classroom build-

the Whitehall classroom build-ing bulletin board.

"Potential jobs are just a call away." Howard said.
The Wildcat jobline is a 24-a-hour a day UK call-in phone system that lists job information on-line and lists job descriptions

on-line and insis for descriptions and contact names.

"It is nice because if you want to call at one o'clock in the morning you can," Howard said.

Local, state and national

employers call with information about part-time, full-time and summertime jobs.

In addition, with each job

description is a guided search that lists specific jobs of of interest which remain on-line for

on-line for two weeks.
Also, with the generic list of job occupan-cies there is guided search th lists specific jobs of interest.
The jobline

iobline offers an advantage for its users in that jobs listed are not seen by large

groups.
"We are the only service like

this available in the state," Howard said.

Figures on the success of the jobline will not be released until next fall, but if the number of students that have already utilized the system is any indication, it has been a fledgling suc-

cess.

"Since the debut in October, we have had 4,450 calls," Howard said.

To use the system, a student calls the jobline number a 257-3841

> enters the pass code W-O-R-K (9675), which list of infor-mation on

available jobs.

The system will list all information necessary to contact the employer for inter-

"It is quick, accessible and helps the person get all the information they need because it is all on the messages," Howard said.

The jobline lists jobs in all fields, including nursing, engineering, education and account-

ing. Even unusual jobs have been

Even unusual jobs have been listed, such as production jobs for "Late Night With David Letterman," "The Late, Late Show with Tom Snyder," and positions with the Buena Vista movie companies.

Don't rely on the classifieds

For seniors, the end of the school year can be a scary time. Knowing that that ever dreaded job search must begin can be frightening for students, but Diane Kohler, the associate director of the University Career Center, can help.

"The major thing for students to realize is that they need to be focused and avoid the TII do anything for anyone attitude," Kohler said.

Kohler said employers say they are "up to their ears" in people who say they'll do any-thing. What employers are really

looking for is someone who is focused and know what they want to do. Kohler said that it is impor-

tant for students to realize they are only looking for their first job and they probably won't hold their first job for the rest of

"Most college students change jobs within their first three years of being out of school," Kohler said.

Kohler strongly suggests that students network in order to find a job.

"It's not necessarily who you Tt's not necessarily who you know, but how many people you know," Kohler said, "and if you aren't focused, you can't tell people what you are looking for and they can't help you."

The one mistake that Kohler

said students make is relying on the classified ads in order to find

a job.
"Only 15 percent of available jobs appear in the classified ads," Kohler said that approximately 99 percent of people looking for jobs look in the classified ads,

which don't often pan out.

Basically, you're job searching skills say a lot about what kind of worker you will be, she
