Season ticket costs increase for public

The price just went up: Season ticket prices for each game have been raised \$2 by UK Athletics to combat inflation

Starting in November, season ticket holders will have to pay a few more dollars to see Tayshaun Prince, Keith Bogans and the rest of the baskethall Wildcats claw their way through the Southeastern Conference.

Season ticket prices for each game have been raised \$2 by UK Athletics.

Kathy DeBoer, senior associate athletics director, said the ticket increase will affect UK Athletics' operating budget.

"What the impact of this will be for us (UK Athletics) financially... is a little under \$700,000," DeBoer said.

The UK Athletics accounting office estimated the increase to be \$896,600. There are 6,500 season ticket holders in Rupp Arena.

to be \$898,600. There are \$6,500 season ticket holders in Rupp Arena.

DeBoer said the reason for the ticket increase was to raise extra funds to keep the UK Athletics' budget up with inflation.

"Our budget goes up about \$\$\tilde{s}\$ million each year just to stay up," DeBoer said. "And this year we decided that's where we had to make an increase."

DeBoer said the UKAA also doubled the donation required of Blue and White fund members for priority seating in Rupp Arena.

Barbara Osborne, UK ticket manager, said student ticket prices will not be raised. Student tickets cost \$5 per game. Guest tickets for basketball games will remain at \$22.

While the ticket increase may affect some people, most are rabid Wildcat fans willing to pay any price to see the Cats.

One fan, Jesse Gardner, has seen the price increase a great deal since he and his wife first purchased season tickets around 50 years ago, Still, Gardner said the increase will not keep him from seeing the action.

"We are fans, all right," he said.

Franklin said he did not file the suit for monetary compensation.

"(My feeling is) there was an attempt to defame me, to smear my name and my reputation, and to do it of a continual basis," Franklin said, "I don't think you're supposed to be able to do this or to hurt somebody and their livelihood or

CINCINNATI — A judge on Tuesday rejected a defense request to move the trial of a white police officer charged in the death of a black man while in police custody. The judge said he first wants to try and seat a jury to hear the trial of officer Robert Jorg. 29, accused in the Nov. 7 death of Roger Owensby Jr. of Cincinnati. Jorg is scheduled for trial Oct. 22 in Hamilton County Constitution of the constance of involuntary manisaughter and misc charges of involuntary cited, he could get up to five-and-one-half years in prison. Judge Thomas Nurre said he would be willing to consider moving the trial to another Ohio city if an impartial jury cannot be seated in Cincinnati. Defense lawyer Scott Croswell said he is concerned that Jorg cannot be fairly tried in Cincinnati after the April riots that followed the fatal shooting by another white officer of a black man fleenip police. Since January, the city has suspended Jorg's pay until the charges against him are resolved. He joined Cincinnati's police force in 1996.

SACRAMENTO, Calif. — The Ukrainian immigrant arrested in the stabbing deaths of his pregnant wife and five other relatives will be charged with seven counts of murder, including one for his unborn child, prosecutors said Tuesday. District Attorney Jan Scully said Tuesday she has not decided whether to seek the death penalty against Nikolay Soltys. Soltys. 27, told police the victims had been "poisoning" him — perhaps meaning they were runing his reputation, authorities said. The district attorney said she could file charges in the murder of a fetus as long as the fetus was at least 7 to 8 weeks old. Soltys wife was three months pregnant. Authorities say the killings began the morning of Aug. 20, when Soltys slashed the throat of his 23-year-old wife. Lyubov. Police say he then drove to the home of his aunt and uncle and killed them along with

DURBAN, South Africa — Desperate to save the U.N. racism conference, the European Union and South Africa joined forces Tuesday to try resolving the language dispute that prompted a walkout by the United States and Israel. References to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict were temporarily removed from a draft declaration while the South Africans formulated substitute language, said Mary Robinson, the U.N. High Conday that the dispute has not derailed the World Conference Against Racism. The South Africans, the European Union and the Arab League met throughout the day Tuesday and were expected to continue talks until a late as Friday, the last day of the conference. The United States and Israel, which beycotted racism conferences in 1978 and 1983 — had warned they would pull out if language in the proposed final declaration singled out Israel for criticism. The Europeans sought swift drafting of a brief text that voiced sought swift drafting of a brief text that voiced to current plans to leave the conference. But if it did, it would do so as a bloc, along with the union's 13 candidate states, Alsteens said.

Mideast peace efforts forge ahead

JERUSALEM — Mideast truce efforts accelerated Tuesday despite a Palestinian suicide attack, and negotiators said they are preparing a detailed agenda for several rounds of high-level negotiations that could begin this week on the sidelines of an economic conference in Italy.

European Union foreign policy chief Javier Solana was in the region trying to help arrange cases-fire talks. He brought Israeli Foreign Minister Shimon Peres and two senior Palestinian officials together Monday night —the first such contacts in weeks. The preparations came during one of the most intense spates of Palestinian bombings in more than 11 months of fighting bombings in more than 11 months of fighting this parameter. The bomb detonated by a suicide attacker outside a Prench school in Jerusalem on Tuesday was the sixth in the city in two days. Twenty people were injured.

Med school applications drop again

Med school applications drop again CHICAGO — Applications to the nation's medical schools fell 3.7 percent in 2000 in the fourth straight year of decline. Attractive jobs in det-coms and information technology, along with the complex of big medical school debts, may be appears to be feweling off. It was 6 percent in 1999. The applicant pool last year totaled 37,092. It in-cluded 17,274 women. a 0.9 percent drop from 1999, the report found. The number of minorities climbed 2 percent to 4.266. Despite the drop in applicants there are still more than twice as many applicants as there are places for students. The report, published in Wednesday's Journal of the American Medical Association, also found that the number of patients available to participate in clinical teaching during 2000-01 decreased in almost half the nation's 125 medical schools.

"When you know what you want to do and start looking forward to it, it makes school seem like it has more of a purpose," she said.



Harvey was pronounced dead by the coroner's office at approximately 2.30 p.m. Priday. Eric Bowles, deputy coroner, was called to the scene after the Lexington Fire Department, which first arrived in the area, contacted him. Bowles said the scene was nothing out of the ordinary and the autopsy confirmed their thoughts of suicide.

"There was no evidence supporting foul play," Bowles said. "It was a very typical sui-

The full-time management student was always smiling, say her co-workers. Danna Mosley, night manager at Bob Evans on Richmond Road where Johnson worked stated, "She had a spunky personality. I never saw her frown."

Investigators are trying to determine the cause of the blaze. It is uncertain whether the smoke detector was working since both the alarm and batteries melted from the heat. Johnson was found on the floor of her bedroom. With no windows or was found on the floor of her bedroom. With no windows or

doors open, the opportunity for outside air to enter was virtually impossible in the apartment.

We would like to extend our condolences to the family and friends of Shea Elizabeth Johnson. We also hope that some

good may come from this pain.

The tragic end to a life just beginning is a shock not only to the family but also to the student body at large. Regardless of whether or not we knew Ms. Johnson, the sorrow of this

tragedy is felt by the entire campus. We have lost one of our own.

Recent fires put student safety in the foreground

When an oven in the Sigma Chi house caught on fire Aug. 17, UK Fire Marshal Garry Beach said he hoped it would raise awareness that fires can and do happen. This Saturday, students were presented with a much more sobering reminder when we lost one of our own to smoke inhalation. Shea Elizabeth Johnson's death was in-deed tragic. However, it will be an even greater tragedy if no one learns anything from her death.

Fire safety is important and should not be overlooked, especially for students living off-campus. If you haven't checked your smoke alarms yet, check them. Don't assume your landlord has taken care of them. Also, post the number for the fire department in a highly visi-ble place such as the refrigera-tor or next to the phone. If you don't have a fire extinguisher yet, buy one. It's a small price to pay for a device that could save your property, or even your life. Make sure to read the directions on how to use it prop-

directions on how to use it properly and know what type of fires it can and cannot put out. Don't try to be a hero. If the blaze is out of control, get out and call the fire department.

Even with every precaution in place, death by fire is not always avoidable. It is entirely possible that Johnson could have been extremely careful about fire safety and still have died. They've taken me in, taught me the language, even let me participate in some local rituals, such as tobaccostripping and Pentecostalism." Noting the 55 percent adult illiteracy rate in the county in which he works, he remarked, "I guess it's a culture thing."

USAID believes nothing could be better for the people of Appalachia than cross-cultural communication. Student and other tour groups are now pouring into the area, drawn to its off-the-beaten-track allure, friendly natives and fascinating cultural history.

"Well, Europe's been so, you know, done," said Sarah van Beckinsale, 19, of Newport, R.I., in explaining why she's summering in Appalachia. "Plus, the dops le cheap."






