### -FROM THE DESK OF THE RABBI-

The most striking part of the ritual of Rosh Hashannah is the blowing of the Shofar. The Bible characterizes the first day of Tishri as the "day of blowing the Shofar." Through this ancient instrument, the ram's horn, three basic calls are sounded: "T'kiah" - a single sustained blast starting on a low note and rising nearly an octave on the musical scale, "Shevarim" - three very short "T'kios" strung together; and "T'rurah" - nine staccato soundings of the low note, concluded by a high note. Originally, each call must have had some specific message for the listener. "T'kiah" may have been the same as an army bugle call for "assembly". "Shevarim" may have been the equivalent of our "man your stations". "T'rurah" is reminiscent of the old cavalry bugle's "charge". The original meanings of these blasts are no longer remembered. Tradition, however, interprets the sounds of the Shofar as a summons to God's court of judgement. It strikes awe into our hearts and fills us with reverence and humility in the hour when our fate for the next year is being decided. The sound of the Shofar warns people to pause in their daily pursuits and heed the warning that is being conveyed to them. The prophet Amos expressed it as follows: "Shall the Shofar be blown in a city, and the people not tremble?"

In the Orthodox service, as many as one hundred notes are sounded on the Shofar, each one a signal to the slumbering conscience of men. Maimonides explained these calls thus:

"Awake ye sleepers and ponder your deeds;  
Look well into your souls and consider your acts;  
Forsake each of you his evil ways and thoughts;  
Return to God so that He may have mercy upon you."
