Attorney says Conner can't sue Kentucky

Arguments: Gov. Patton says he is confident he will be exonerated

FRANKFORT — The woman who was Gov. Paul Pation's paramour cannot sue the state for retaliation or harrasment because she was never a public employee, the state's attorney has argued.

Even if some of Tina Conner's allegations are true, the legal doctrine of sovereign immunity prohibits hersuif for damages against Patton in his official capacity or state government generally, according to the response: filed in Jefferson Circuit Court.

Anita Britton, a Lexington lawyer hired by the state to represent the official defendants in the case, said Conneries seeking damages under laws that are designed to protect employees.

None of the allegations in the complaint allege any specific acts of wrongdoing against the commonwealth," Britton's response said.

Conner, who operates a nursing home in Hickman. County, said Patton bestowed the state's favors on her during and for a time after their two-year sexual relationship and then turned regulators loose on her after she broke it off.

Patton has acknowledged he had a sexual relationship-

Patton has acknowledged he had a sexual relationship-with Conner but maintains he never gave her special treatment or trouble as a result.

Conner has sued Patton individually and in his position as governor and state government generally. She alleges that she was the victim of sexual harassment and retaliation, her business suffered and Patton wasted state resources to pursue their relationship.

Patton's personal attorney responded earlier this week that two of her claims should be dismissed and the case should be moved to Frankfort. 

Often referred to as morning-after pills, emergency contraception pills, are an increased dose of birth control that can be taken up to three days after unprotected intercourse to reduce the chance of getting pregnant by 75 percent.

"Cats for Christ is definitly against any type of

abortion. Bottom line, the morning after pill is not contraception, it is an abortive agent, "said Kevin Wooten, the student minister of Cats for Christ. The LIK Athletics Association officially announced this week that students will migrate to the floor of Rupp Arena for UK basketball games

Tired of elderly and complacent season ticket holders not making a ruckus behind the oppo-nent's basket, the students have pleaded to be moved closer to the court for several years. Be-cause of increased interest and attendance at basketball ticket lotteries, UK Athletics considered the move justified. After three years of research, students will make the move.

The new student area, located in sections 39 and 40, is closer to the action. The lower arena student attendants will be in the endzone closest to the UK bench. The view won't really be improved, but the student section will be nearer to the players, coaches and the opposing team's bench. Students will have a greater chance of making an impact on the game.

even if there will not be seats to sit in. The new student section will be standing room only, allowing UKAA to cram in more bodies.

Military might alone can't achieve U.S. goals

Simply put, we are making a grave mistake that could yield devastating repercussions if we believe that we can create a democratic government in Iraq under the power of the American flag.

Any regime that the United Any regime that the United States would set up would be viewed as a puppet — just another example of the United States propping up leaders to serve their interests, whether they would be petroleum or otherwise. Citizens of Iraq, Iran, Syria and other rogue states have been told repeatedly that America does not care shout them does not care about them.

We have a historic opportunity to reshape the world, but we must exercise restraint in some areas. This is not to say that we should go soft on the Iraqi leader — far from it. Therefore it is my belief that we would have greater impact if we challenged the infrastructure and engaged in a battle with extremist Islamic propaganda to alter the minds of the impressionable individuals with which we need to reason.

Yet, the United States must be cautious in how it handles a very volatile situation. We have a role to play, but it need not be the starring role to be an influential one. Our country needs to support the op-pressed people of these nations, not

disillusion the citizenry to an even greater degree by using American

muscle to further our own interests.

We can help tremendously, as long as we are not leading them by the hand. We can show them the

the hand. We can show them the path without dragging them kicking and screaming.

The United States has an internationally respected right to act when it feels that its national security is compromised. Saddam Hussein may have weapons of mass destruction, and he may be attempting to acquire the requisite material speeded for purplear comphilities. needed for nuclear capabilities. However, no nation on earth has evolved to the boiling point, and no nation on earth is ready to declare war on the United States regardless of its nuclear compilities.

of its nuclear capabilities.

We are not more popular than the regimes in Baghdad and Damascus at the moment, and their nationalistic peoples are not waiting for us with open arms.

America can help these people immeasurably and earn their trust,

provided we do not engage in perimperialistic

unilateral practices.

There is a substantial risk of American casualties if we become involved in urban warfare reminis-cent of Somalia nearly a decade ago, and there's an overwhelming risk of enflaming a region that possesses a deep and powerful mistrust

of our intentions.

Defeating the grassroots appeal
of Islamic extremism should be our preeminent objective, which we can accomplish by creating an environ-ment where a legitimate govern-ment can thrive. These are not pie-in-the-sky delusions, but practical and imperative measures that we must take — not only in the inter-ests of our neighbors abroad, but also our own personal interests at home.

America can assist the new form America can assist the new form of government greatly, not by marching into Baghdad with the American flag, but by laying the groundwork for something truly special, and something that can last.


