Overall, candidates stressed open communication lines between SGA, the Greek community, other campus organizations and students.

"Every student on this campus who pays tuttion is a part of SGA," said presidential candidate

Nic Wilson. "We don't want students to be left behind whenever decisions are being made."
Presidential candidate Alyshia Ochse agreed that the executive door should stay open to students. She said that, as president, she would be visible on campus.
Despite some candidates hopes of overcoming the GPAC vote, Alan DeSantis, College of Commications professor and moderator of Tuesday night's debate, stressed the influence the endorsement has carried in the past.
"This is Florida," he said.—"Whoever wins this traditionally wins the election."

Loss of hope: Suicide is the second leading cause of death among young people, it is preceded by car accidents; rates have doubled since the '50s



Why do we mourn the loss of lovers like Romeo and Juliet or pity the destruction of noblemen like Othello? Why do their stories seem so decent and heroic when their deaths solved nothing and even produced more serious consequences afterward?

consequences afterward?

The star-crossed lovers' end "naught could remove their parents' rage", and the feud continued after their death.

death.

Othello, who after his death was known as "great of heart", still died with a murderer's soul without redemption.

Studying certain Shakespear et ales introduces us to a glorified and agallant world of suicide. However, beneath those eloquent words and famous phrases lies the disastrous and nightmarish truth of an illness that never kills without leaving a trail of unanswered questions and grieving survivors.

trous and nightmarish truth of an illness that never kills without leaving a trail of unanswered questions and grieving survivors.

Suicide is the second leading cause of death, preceded only by car accidents, among college students in this country. Since the 1950s, college suicide has doubled its rate in women and tripled among men.

According to Dr. Charlie O'Neil, assistant director of the Counseling and Testing Center at UK, five-to-seven percent of his clients discuss thoughts on suicide in a serious manner. O'Neil also said that though it is not abnormal to think of suicide, it is a critical matter if the thought is not passing or briefly contemplated.

Fortunately, UK does not appear to have a high suicide rate. But O'Neil asys he does receive a fair number of suicide referrals from faculty, advisers, parents and resident advisers. Most of the calls come during advising weeks, when students feel pressures in deciding on the now many UK students seriously contemplate suicide. Since some attempts may be made off-campus, it is difficult to document each case if it is not publicized or

WSP important to all genders

Joan Callahan doesn't deny that our society is sexist. In fact, the professor of philosophy and director of the women's studies program will admit to it.

"Our society is still very, very sexist," Callahan said.

One way UK is attempting to educate students about the sexim that exists in our society is through the women's studies program, a program that pays special attention to the position of and contributions by women.

Callahan, who has been the director of the program since 1986, said it offers an undergraduate minor, a topical major and a graduate certificate. Each course requires coursework in feminist theory and cross-cultural studies as well as courses on women and gender in a variety of disciplines. Students can complete either the major or the minor in the same amount of time it takes to do any such program in the humanities or social sciences.

Callahan said students in the program study a variety of top

Callahan said students in the program study a variety of topics related to gender.

"Gender...is a thoroughly social-constructed category, having to do with the feminine and the masculine," she said.
Gender, Callahan said, affects many different areas like appearance, behaviors, tasks, characteristics, virtues and vices.
One of the main studies in the program relates to how this
gender-coding system works, she said.

"Who benefits from the gender codings we have and who is
harmed by the gender codings we have."
The course also pays careful attention to other categories,
like race or ethnicity, class, sexual orientation, ability and disability and ag.

"You can't just study 'women' because there are no 'women
as such'—women are in different social locations, and the studies attend to this," Callahan said.
The contributions of women, an aspect Callahan said is often
neglected in traditional history and literature courses, are also
studied.

neglected in traditional history and interature courses, are also studied. The interest in this field is growing, more so with women than men, Callahan said. She attributes this to the fact that women seem more committed to taking courses that reflect on issues relating to gender.

That's what the enrollment numbers reflect. But men are not excluded. Callahan said there have been several men in the graduate certificate curriculum and nearly one-third of the students in the current course, feminist philosophy, are men.

And it is both women and men who are affected by the study of women.

"Women's studies is important because sex and gender affect every aspect of our lives whether or not we're aware of it," Callahan said.

Diet guru shows students the way to Subway

Happy Gilmore isn't the only person with a fascination for Subway.
Students who enjoy Subway sand-wiches or are interested in learning more about the Subway diet will have the opportunity to hear the man who brought attention to Subway's healthy fast-food alternatives.

Jared Fogle, the college student made famous by losing 245 pounds by eating a Subway sandwich for lunch and dinner for nearly a year, will speak at 10 am. Friday at the UK Commons Area.

His talk is sponsored by Health Services, who are promoting a Five-A-Day

campaign for the month of March. The Five-A-Day campaign is designed to inform students of the importance of eating a proper diet that includes eating five servings of fruits and vegetables.

Fogle, who graduated from Indiana University in May 2000, started his diet in Subway advertising seven sandwiches with six grams of fat or less. For nearly a year, Jared at ea six-inch turkey sub for lunch and a foot-long veggie sub for dinner. With each meal, he consumed a bag of baked potato chips and a diet soft drink.
Fogle weighed 425 pounds when he began his diet in March 1998. A year later, he weighed 190. After he lost the first hundred pounds, he started walking instead of taking the bus. When he had been on the diet for a year, he began to eat other low

fat foods. He currently weighs 190 pounds.
The commercials began early last year and have inspired many to go on this diet. The latest advertisement includes testimonies of people inspired by Fogle to go on the diet. Fogle has given numerous talks since appearing in the commercials. Alex Beh, an undeclared freshman, said Fogle's weight loss was amazing.
"It's hard to believe that eating just Subway caused him to lose that much weight in only a year. It's amazing that he was able to do it. If I ate that much food from Subway, I'd probably do the opposite and gain weight."

Fed poised to cut rates a third time

Fed poised to cut rates a third time WASHINGTON — The Federal Reserve is poised to cut interest rates for a third time this year in an effort to keep the record U.S. economic expansion from ending, economists say. Another big rate cut is needed now, they believe, given the continued weak state of manufacturing and the cautious mood of consumers, whose spending accounts for two-thirds of all economic activity. Another reason: the huge sell-off that has been occurring on Wall Street, where the Dow Jones Industrial Average last week suffered its biggest weekly drop in 11 years. If paper losses make consumers feel a lot less wealthy and they stop spending, that could put an end to the 10-year streak of uninterrupted economic growth, analysts said.

UNITED NATIONS — The battle lines are clear. It's the Palestinians and dozens of supporters vs. Israel and the United States. As the Palestinians again pushed Monday for a U.N. observer force to help quell six months of violence, the differences between the two sides were again starkly clear. Since a previous request was defeated in December, the U.S. and Israeli administrations have changed — and so has the U.N. Security Council membership. But the Palestinian demand — argued during an open Security Council debate on Monday — still faces almost certain defeat. Since September, the violence has killed more than 425 people, including more than 350 Palestinians and dozens of Israeli Jews.

Finance debate begins with close vote

Finance debate begins with close vote WASHINGTON — Senate supporters of limiting political donations narrowly overcame their first challenge in their drive to bring about the most significant change in campaign spending law in a quarter-century. The Senate by a 51-48 vote Monday defeated a proposal to effectually eliminate direct party contribution limits for candidates running against wealthy opponents who put at least St million of their own money into a campaign. The vote opened two weeks of debate on legislation offered by Sens. John McCain, R-Artz, and Russell Fenigold, D-Wist, that would ban loosely regulated "soft money" donations that corporations, unions and wealthy individuals give political parties.

Tuesday set a final firm date for dumping the
Mir space station, saying it would be brought

twice during two consecutive orbits to lower the
station. Several hours later, it will fire one last
time to send the station hurdling into the South
Pacific between Australia and Chile at around
9:30 a.m. Moscow time Friday, said Russian
Aerospace Agency spokesman Konstantin
Kreidenko.

GEORGETOWN, Guyana — Opposition sup-porters angrily complained that many names were left of voter registration lists, with some al-leging a vote-rigging conspiracy in Guyana's racially charged election. The South American country's national elections on Monday followed a long-standing pattern by pitting those of African descent against those of East Indian ancestry. First results were expected Tuesday. Some supporters of the black-dominated opposition said they suspect a vote-rigging conspiracy by the governing party of President Bharrat Jagdeo, who like the majority of his supporters, is of Indian descent.

While AFSP claims that suicide factors can be very diverse and complex. Issues such as anxiety, stress, rage, hopelessness and alcohol are risk, easily to increase the risk, easily the college students.

Liver transplant performed on 9-year-old girl at UK

Kudos: Second pediatric liver transplant at UK

Elizabeth Henderson became the youngest patient to receive a liver transplant by an UK Hospital surgical team last week.

The eight-hour surgery was performed on the 9-year old central Kentucky girl last Thursday.

Dr. Dinesh Ranjan, director of UK's liver and pancreas transplant program, led the surgical team that consisted of Dr. Thomas Johnston, director of UK's pediatric and renal transplant program and Dr. K. Sudhakar Reddy, a liver transplant surgeon and associate professor of surgery. Two anesthesiologists and three nurses and/or operating room technicians were also a part of the surgical team.

Henderson was the second pediatric patient to receive a liver transplant at UK.

"This is the second pediatric liver transplant we have performed, and it is quite a milestone for our liver transplant program." Rajan said.

UK's first pediatric liver transplant was performed to the performed girl. Who continues to do well.

Henderson, who has alphal-antitrypsin deficiency, was listed in critical condition after Thursday's surgery, as is the case for all transplant patients immediately following surgery. She was moved to the pediatric intensive care unit to a regular room in the UK's Children's Hospital, Monday.

AlATD is a hereditary defect in body chemistry that fewer than 100,000 Americans have.

A protein that circulates in the blood, the liver produces

most of the protein in the blood. It protects the tissues of the body from being damaged from chemicals in white blood cells. White blood cells contain enzymes that help them move through tissues, clean up wounds and perform other functions.

The activities of these chemicals must be strictly controlled to keep them from attacking normal tissues of the body. Alphalantitrypsin normally provides one type of protection against the chemicals.

The most common genetic cause of liver disease in children, A1ATD occurs when the amount alphal-antitrypsin in the blood is very low

because of the lack of appnal-an-titrypsin means the tiny air sacs in the lungs aren't protected from the chemicals released from white blood cells.

Abuse of nuns a problem

VATICAN CITY — The Vatican on Tuesday denied a report in the National Catholic Ropes by Sirging sexual abuse of Rope by Sirging sexual abuse of Rope by Sirging sexual abuse of AIDS-ravaged Africa — Is a serious problem.

The magazine article is based on five reports compiled by senior members of women's religious orders and a priest and dating to 1994. The publication said the reports have been discussed at high levels in the Vatican.

Joaquin Navarro-Valls ac-Vatical Joaquin Navarro-Valls acknowledged there were isolated cases of priests sexually abus name in the problem is restricted to a limited geography of the protection of th

"In a few extreme instances, according to the documentation, priests have impregnated nuns, then encouraged them to have abortions," the magazine said.

In one case reported by Sister Maura O'Donohue, a physician and member of the Medical Missionary of Mary, a priest got a nun pregnant and then arranged for an abortion. She died during the procedure, imagazine said, and the priest officiated at her funeral Mass.

The reports cited by the National Catholic Reporter also say that nuns who become pregannt are often forced to leave their orders, while the priests involved are allowed to continue with their ministries.

The Vatican statement was issued Tuesday after the Italian media reported on the magazine article. The Vatican had refused comment to the National Catholic Reporter.

The National Catholic Reporter said there are no comprehensive statistics on the sexual abuse of nuns, but the "frequency and consistency of the reports ... point to a problem that needs to be addressed."

Two days later the Kentucky Cabinet for Health Services ordered the center closed, determining that "conditions exist which constitute an immediate threat to the children" there. It suspended the center's license, pending the outcome of an investigation.

The owner, Linda Tedford, appealed the cabinet's decision, which led to Varo's review.

Varo, who heard evidence in the case at a hearing last week, concluded that "under the circumstances presented and now known, the inadequa-

cy of this supervision must be viewed as having a direct nexus to the death of (the boy) unless or until determined otherwise."

The cause of the boy's death is still under investigation. Autopsy results were inconclusive, and the boy showed no signs of traumatic injury. 

LEXINGTON, Ky. — City officials are eager to take advantage of a bill that offers incentives for redeveloping old, contaminated industrial

Senate Bill 2, the so-called "brownfields bill" awaits only Gov. Paul Patton's signature.

Under the legislation, developers would not be required to clean old sites completely before reusing them. They would only have to demonstrate that they've contained the pollution so it's no longer at hreat.

Once the work is finished and the state Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Cabinet approves it, the property owner receives a written agreement shelding the site from environmental lawsuits by the government.

So what does this all mean?
Has parity finally bestowed itself between the power conferences and the mid-majors of college basketball? I believe so and
the reason is not a complicated
one. It is simply because of the
vast early departures of collegate or even high school players to the NBA.

Let us examine why this is

leading to the parity, but not the demise of college basketball, as I believe this has been the most exciting tournament I have witnessed thus far. Most of the time — young or old — their talent is unparalleled on the college level and the mid-majors just cannot compete. — Although for the mid-level programs of the major confer-ences it is a different story. As players leave for the NBA it tru-ly hurts those schools because the top schools steal the re-cruits that would usually be go-ing there.


