Seattle protests peaceful

SEATULE — Billed as a "festival of resistance." World Trade Organization protests. Thursday for the first time seemed more like a party than a pitched battle with police. After a Pike Place Market rally, at least 1,000 people marched to the King County Jail at the south end of downtown to express support for those arrest-ed this week, escorted by motorcycle police. Police were acting differently, said David Roman. 26, an organizer with the umbrella group Direct Action Network. Where Wednesday some were "out of control," they were cooperative Thursday, he said.

Labor treaty signed by Clinton

SEATTLE — President Clinton signed a treaty yesterday banning abusive child labor and suggested it could serve as a model for bridging differences between business and labor in international trade agreements. Clinton said it was not a matter of trying 'to impose one nation's values over another, but about shared values, the dignity of work, the decency of life, the fragility and importance of childhood." The administration played a leading role in negotiating the treaty, which was unanimously approved in June by delegates to the International Labor Organization, an arm of the United Nations.

Bush prepares for debate debut

BOSTON — As Texas Gov. George W. Bush prepared yesterday for his debate debut against his rivals for the Republican presidential brush-nation, he leads Sen. John McCain in one New Hampshire poll, while another one shows him in a statistical tie with his chief rival. A Boston Globe and WBZ-TV poll of 400 likely voters found 45 percent support Bush, compared with 31 percent for McCain. A Concord Monitor poll found Bush with a 41 percent to 36 percent egg over McCain with a margin of error of 5 points. Among Democrats, the Monitor poll found Vice President Al Gore leading former New Jersey Sen. Bill Bradley 45 percent to 43 percent.
