Celebration sets tone for upcoming holiday march

Uplifting, heart-wrenching, incredible.
Those words were used to describe UK's Dr.
Martin Luther King, Jr. celebration Thursday afternoon, commemorating his birthday.
About 100 people attended the "Celebrating the Dream and Evaluating Diversity" gathering, which included several high-profile speakers, the giving of a newly established award and several musical numbers with connections to King's civil rights movement for blacks.
The celebration was a tremendous success to begin UK's tribute to King, which will culminate in a Freedom March Monday morning at 10, said Anna Allen, director of Minority Affairs for the UK Medical Center.
"The celebration went incredibly well," Allen said. "It really sets the tone for our march, as well as for African-American, women and Asian historymonths."

Participants were given buttons depicting Dr.
King's keynote phrase, "I Have a Dream," than led through a series of inspirational songs and speakers for nearly an hour.
Steven Reed, a U.S. Attorney and UK Board of Trustees member, gave the main address to the

crowd. He told a story of how meaningful it was for him to be able to teach his grandchildren how to read, something his grandparents were not fortunate enough to do for him.

Reed then urged audience members to make the most of the opportunities they have and no waste time with the trivialities of today's society.

Juanita Betz Peterson, staff and extramural development director for the Minority Affairs Office, said Reed's speech provided a great picture of where blacks had to come from.

"The Honorable Mr. Reed gave a great chronology of the times and the situation with slavery and not being able to learn to read," Peterson said. "We were able to achieve a high level in reading within 13 years, which most people couldn't do in that time."

Peterson said Reed's message transcends society, making it meaningful for everyone in the world.

"These things are helpful for everyone to know, not just those who aren't familiar with the history of oppression based upon ethnicity," she said.

Although minorities have come a long way

Although minorities have come a long way since the days of slavery and segregation, a lot of work remains to be done, Peterson said.

"We have come a long way, but we are still



overcoming," she said. "It takes everyone to continue the process. It is very important to continue the program on an academic level."

Most involved with the program came away visually moved by the events, Peterson said.

"More than one person described the program as extremely uplifting," she said. "It seemed very well received by the audience and was the best it has been in the last eight years."

IU will observe holiday

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. — For the first time in Indiana University history, the administration will recognize Monday's Martin Luther King, Jr. Day as a University believed.

This acknowledgement comes 12 years after the United States celebrated King's birthday as a national holiday.

Classes will not meet, but the King Day Committee hopes to make its theme, "A Day On, Not a Day Off," a reality.

Since May, the committee, comprised of about 30 students and faculty members, has been carefully planning the events.

"It's good that we can have the whole day to elebrate King Day, but the day off creates a three-day weekend.

"That gave the committee a challenge of getting students to stay (on campus) and take part in the events," said Dean of African American Affairs Lawrence Hanks, who is co-chairing the committee along with IU Vice President and Bloomington Chancellor Kenneth Gros Louis.

The Student Coalition organized last year's King Day protest that ultimately led to the IU Board of Trustees' recognition of the holiday.

But Coalition members declined to comment on their plans for the day.

Senior Joon Park, Coalition member and Asian American Association president, said the recognition of the holiday allows students to concentrate on its meaning.

"This year, we don't have to go through all the process(es) of a protest in order to have a proper celebration," Park said. "The events bring attention to the purpose of this holiday, which is a celebration of endeavors for civil liberties."

In planning the events, committee members said they hope to educate students about King's legacy.

Committee member Derrick Williams, a graduate students, aid all students, not only blacks, should plan to attend.

But Johnson's move to Baton Rouge meant there was no room for Compton. Though a painful situation was avoided when Compton said she would not seek a post at LSU, Flory said coaching on the LSU sidelines without Compton will always be in her mind.
"It wouldn't have been fair to Tonya to have Frances there," Flory said. "Tonya took a big pay-cut to work with me at UK. Then not going to bail out on her now. But it sure has been hard on some friendships."
Though earning the LSU job is the height of achievement for Flory, taking over for ousted friends was not the rosy path to success she had envisioned. Luster, who had skippered the program since 1985 and boasted a 308-161

record in Baton Rouge, had not been able to win consistently since the last of the Final Four players left the program in 1995.

The Tigers finished last in the SEC this season with an 0-15 conference record and managed only nine wins all year. Sensing the pressure which was building to force Luster away from LSU, Flory made one last attempt to help the coach keep his job.

"When I heard he might be in trouble, I called on his behalf," she said. "I thought he had done a better job recruiting this season. It's unfortunate what happened.

"Getting the position because of their demise is tough," Flory added. "But I had to take advantage when it was there."

The UK players seem to agree with Flory's course of action.

"I was totally surprised, but I think it's a good move for her," middle blocker Jachyn Homan said. "I could teil that she was ad about leaving, but she said all along that she would leave for the LSU job."

"I'm happy that she's going where she wants to go," sophomore outside hitter Katie Eiser-

man said. "But she definitely has her work cut out for her." Johnson, who will team with Flory to do the Tigers' recruiting, knows the road ahead will be rocky. "To see LSU volleyball where it is today — it really saddens me," Johnson said. "Our goal is to get it where it was when we

me," Johnson said. "Our goal is to get it where it was when we were there. We'll have to build it from the very bottom."

Current UK assistant coach Ainsley Grimes won't be helping in the rebuilding effort. Flory extended Grimes an invitation to travel to Baton Rouge, but the decision wasn't nearly as clear cut for the Louiscille native.

Grimes, who played setter at UK from 1902-96, had always aspired to be an elementary school teacher. Going to LSU meant putting her dreams — which had nothing to do with college coaching — on hold.

After a period of indecision, Grimes decided to stay in Kentucky and pursue a master's degree in elementary education at Uvi L.

"For a little while, I was going to LSU." Grimes said. "But it's hard to go and rebuild another SEC school when I spent so much time at UK."

Though Flory wanted her young assistant to make the transition, Flory knew the odds were against it from the start.

"I'd love to have Ainsley come with us, but her heart and soul are at Kentucky," Flory said.

"When you find someone who is that loyal, it's hard to lose them. But I think she's making the right decision to get on with her life. She has important goals and she is going to make a big difference in a lot of young people's lives."

Grimes agreed to remain with the team on an interim basis to help the players with their off-season workouts, starting next week.

In the meantime, the team will meet today to say their final good-byes before Flory and Johnson move to Baton Rouge to begin fulfilling their dreams.

"The (UK) players fell in love with Kentucky and the other players, not Fran Flory," hes said, "I try to remind them that two-thirds of the equation is still here. They have a lot to look forward to."

UK Associate Athletics Director Kathy DeBoer, who coached the volleyball team from 1984-92 and is UK's all-time winningest volleyball coach, said she will serve in an advisory role in finding Flory's replacement.

"We're not going to cross anyone off the list." DeBoer said. "Maybe it's a little like when we hired Coach (Hal) Mumme — if you put parameters on it, you might rule someone out who deserves serious consideration."

However, the former NCAA Coach of the Year said she is not one of those candidates under serious consideration.

"The 13 years I coached were some of the best years of my life," DeBoer said. "But I really enjoy what I do now."

Hogs' resurgence heats rivalry

Richardson wary of UK's team balance

Once upon a time it was the highlight of the Southeastern Conference season.

Arkansas and UK, the best in the SEC West versus the best in

Arkansas and UK, the best in the SEC West versus the best in the SEC East.

While it's still a highlight in the season, it's not the premiere matchup of the year. UK has continued to be in the upper echelon of basketball but the Razorbacks haven't held up their end of the bargain.

As the Cats were marching through the NCAA Tournament, the Razorbacks were marching through the NTI.

But Arkansas may be on the way back. The Razorbacks (14-2 overall, 3-0 Southeastern Conference) are ranked 22nd in the nation and are undefeated in the SEC West.


