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



### INTRODUCTION

This Directory will help you enjoy using the Daniel Boone National Forest. It describes and directs you to campgrounds, picnic areas, points of interest and special interest areas and provides information on the facilities you will find at each area.

The Index (page 3) summarizes the information for each area listed in this Directory. It also lists the map coordinates for locating each area on the state map in the back of this Directory.

Recreation maps of the forest are available for purchase and other brochures are available free of charge. These will help add to your enjoyment of the Daniel Boone National Forest.

Most of the developed recreation areas are open during the heavy use season from mid-spring to late fall (April through September). However, a few selected areas remain open year-round to accommodate winter visitors. Contact the appropriate Ranger District Office (listed on the back cover of this Directory) prior to each season for specific information on opening dates.

Off-road vehicles and horses are permitted on roads and trails unless posted otherwise. Vehicles and operators must conform to all state laws. Trailer and motor homes are permitted in the general forest area and in developed recreation sites. Some recreation sites provide water and electrical hook-ups. Generally, National Forest recreation areas will accommodate trailers up to 22 feet long.

Primitive camping is allowed anywhere in the Daniel Boone National Forest unless posted otherwise. Permits are not needed for primitive camping.

A permit is not needed for a campfire. However, you are responsible for your fire and any wildfire that should result. Fires outside designated areas in the Red River Gorge Geological Area must be in stoves or other devices designed to contain the flame. Remember to keep your campfire small and leave your campfire “dead out.”

You will need state licenses to fish, hunt and trap in the Daniel Boone National Forest. For further information about seasons and limits, write: Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources, Frankfort, KY 40601.

A fee is charged for use of many forest recreation areas. This fee system was created through the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act passed by Congress in 1965.

The Golden Age Passport is valid on all Forest Service recreation areas. There is no charge for the Golden Age Passport, just proof of age, 62 years and older. This passport entitles the bearers, and all who accompany them, in a private, non-commercial vehicle, into a designated fee area for one-half the daily use fee. Camping fees usually include swimming privileges. The Golden Age Passport is available at the Forest Supervisor's Office in Winchester, Ky. and at the seven Ranger District offices.

We hope this Directory will increase your awareness of the opportunities awaiting you on the Daniel Boone National Forest, but we ask that you also be aware of your responsibilities. Please follow the regulations and always leave the forest cleaner than you found it.

It is the goal of every Forest Service employee to be a good "Host" and help all visitors to enjoy their visit to the National Forest. Please let us know how you feel about your visit and our management of the recreation opportunities on the Daniel Boone National Forest.

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## GENERAL RULES

1. In developed recreation areas, put tents and trailers only in places provided.
2. Occupy your campsite the first night you arrive; then don't leave it unoccupied for more than 24 hours at a time.
3. Camping is not permitted in day-use areas such as picnicking sites, swimming areas, scenic spots, etc.
4. Length of stay: 14 consecutive days.
5. Only campers permitted inside campgrounds during established night hours (usually posted).
6. Build fires only in stoves, grills, fireplaces and fire rings.
7. Help preserve all facilities and vegetation. Protect recreation areas for future generations.


### NOTE:

***You cannot reserve individual campsites. They are available to all on a first-come, first-served basis. However, if you stop by the local Ranger's office, you can find out where vacancies exist. Group-camp facilities can be reserved at the appropriate Ranger's office.***

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


A roadside picnic area, with horse-shoe courts, a shelter and playing field.

*Picnicking (7 units).*

Take U.S. 27 south 7 miles from Burnside (16 miles from Somerset).

### BEAVER CREEK WILDERNESS

4,791 acres below the clifflines of the Beaver Creek Drainage within the Daniel Boone National Forest. Vertical sandstone cliffs, rock-houses (cliff overhangs used as shelter by primitive peoples), rippling streams, waterfalls, mature eastern hardwood trees, a variety of game and nongame animals and many varieties of flowering tress, shrubs and plants contribute to make this Wilderness a true "Nature Lover's Paradise".

*Primitive camping (designated campsites by reservation only are located outside the Wilderness), trail and compass hiking, backpacking, scenic overlooks. Open year-round.*

Take U.S. 27 south from Alpine for 4 miles, 18 miles from Somerset. Use Forest Service Road 50 for access to the west side of the Wilderness; use KY 90 and Forest Service Road 820 for access to the east side.




### BELL FARM


A primitive campsite with overnight accommodations for horse and horse trailers. Access is provided to the Sheltowee Trace National Recreation Trail.

*Camping (5 units), corral, hiking, horseback riding.*

Take KY 92 from Stearns for 6 miles; turn left (south) on KY 1363 for 12 miles to Bell Farm. Turn left for 1/2 mile across bridge to Bell Farm Horse Camp.

**BIG DOUBLE CREEK**

Picnicking and fishing in a secluded forest setting. Access to the Redbird Crest Trail.

*Picnicking (14 units), fishing, hiking.*

Take KY 66 south from the Peabody interchange of the Daniel Boone Parkway for 3 miles. Take the first right-hand turn past the Redbird Ranger Station. Follow the signs for 2 miles up Big Double Creek.




**BON HOLLOW**


On the site of an old coal mining town. Playing field nearby.

*Picnicking (13 units), hiking trail (1/2 mile long).*

Take KY 92 southwest from Williamsburg for 2 miles; turn right (west) at directional sign.




**BILLY BRANCH**

A lakeshore picnic area with a scenic view of Cave Run Lake.

*Picnicking (23 units), fishing, hiking.*

From I-64 at the Salt Lick interchange, proceed 9 miles east on U.S. 60 to Farmers, turn right (south) on KY 801. The picnic area is 2 miles on the right.



**BOAT GUNNEL BRANCH**

A woodland picnic area along the shores of Cave Run Lake with opportunities for wildlife interpretation. Giant Canada Goose pond and interpretive trail.

*Picnicking (35 units), picnic shelter, fishing, hiking, interpretive trail.*

From I-64 at the Salt Lick interchange, proceed 9 miles east on U.S. 60 to Farmers, turn right (south) on KY 801. The picnic area is on the right, 3 miles.



**CLEAR CREEK**

Near the remains of an old iron furnace; adjacent to the Pioneer Weapons Hunting Area. Trails lead to points of scenic and geologic interest. Access to the Sheltoewe Trace National Recreation Trail.

*Trailer/tent camping (21 units), picnicking (14 units), hiking, nature interpretation, fishing, boating (boat launch, electric motors only). U.S. Fee Area.*

Take KY 211 south from Salt Lick for 4 miles; turn left (east) on Forest Service Road 129 for 2 miles.



**CLAYLICK BOAT-IN**

A remote lakeshore campground, accessible by boat only, offers opportunities for primitive lakeshore camping.

*Boat-in camping (20 units), fishing, boating, skiing, open year-round.*

From U.S. 60 at Salt Lick, proceed south on Ky 211 for 4 miles to Forest Service Road 129. Take 129 east for 5 miles to Leatherwood Boat Ramp, boat 3 miles northeast to Clay Lick.



**RAMEY CREEK**

An ideal place for picnicking on the waters of Cave Run Lake.

*Picnicking (7 units), fishing.*

Referring to the directions to Boat Gunnel Branch, continue east on KY 801 for 3 more miles to the picnic area on the left.



**SCOTT CREEK MARINA**

Open year-round. Provides fishing boats, houseboats, pontoon boats, fishing equipment, boating equipment, skiing equipment, bait, water safety equipment.


Referring to the directions to Billy Branch, continue east on KY 801 for ¼ mile on the right.



**TWIN KNOBS**

On Cave Run Lake. Scenic views and shoreline camping in woodland setting. Camping for RV's, trailer/tent and group use areas.

*Camping (277 units, trailer/tent spaces, hook-ups, electricity 1 loop, showers), group use areas (4 areas, reserva-*

tions required, camping and picnic areas with shelters), hiking (2.5 mile lakeshore trail), fishing (points along lakeshore trail), swimming (beach, bathhouse), boating (launch), dump station, handicapped access, interpretive programs. U.S. Fee Area.

Referring to the directions to Boat Gunnel Branch, continue east on KY 801 for 1 mile. Campground on right.



**ZILPO**

A peninsula on the south shores of Cave Run Lake offering lakeshore camping with scenic vistas.


*Camping (196 units, trailer/tent spaces), boating (launch), fishing, hiking, swimming (beach), handicapped access. U.S. Fee Area.*

Refer to the directions to Clear Creek, continue east on Forest Service Road 129 for ½ mile to Forest Service Road 918, follow 918 to campground.




Van Hook Falls, on the Sheltoewe Trace National Recreation Trail

### COTTAGE FURNACE

Picnic area on historical site with an old, well-preserved furnace where once native iron ore was converted to pig iron.

*Picnicking (10 units).*

Take KY 1057 south from Clay City for 6 miles. Turn right (southwest) on KY 213 for 2 miles to Forest Service Road 227, west for 3 miles to furnace.




### GREAT MEADOW


Remote woodland campground, large playing field, stream nearby. Access to the Sheltowee Trace National Recreation Trail.

*Camping (20 units, trailer/-tent spaces), hiking, fishing. Open year-round.*

Take KY 92 west from Stearns for 6 miles; turn left (south) on KY 1363 for 12 miles; turn left (southeast) on Forest Service Road 137 for 5 miles to campground.

### HEMLOCK GROVE

In a stand of large hemlocks and hardwoods, on Rock Creek, an excellent trout stream. Access to Sheltowee Trace National Recreation Trail.

*Picnicking (6 units), hiking.*

Referring to the directions to Great Meadow, follow Forest Service Road 137 for 3 miles.

## BALD ROCK

Roadside picnic area in an open forest setting.

*Picnicking (18 units), hiking.*

Take KY 192 southwest from London for 11 miles.



## BEE ROCK

On Rockcastle River in the headwaters of Lake Cumberland. Scenic stream-side setting with large rocks. Trails lead to Clifftop Overlook and along Rockcastle River.

*Camping (15 units), fishing, boating (launch), hiking. U.S. Fee Area.*

Located at bridge over Rockcastle River between Somerset and London on KY 192.




## CRAIGS CREEK

On Laurel River Lake. A group use area for both camping and picnicking.

*Group camping and picnicking (reservations required), boating (launch), fishing, horseshoe courts, playing field, hiking. U.S. Fee Area.*

From I-75 at the London interchange, take KY 192 west for 12.2 miles. Turn left (south) on Forest Service Road 62 for 1.25 miles to the group area.

### FLATWOODS

A picnic area nestled in a lakeshore setting.

*Picnicking (17 units), fishing, boating (launch).*

From I-75 at the Corbin interchange (exit 29), take KY 770 west for 1 mile. Turn right (north) on KY 312 for 2.5 miles. Turn left (west) on Forest Service Road 758 for 1.5 miles to picnic area.



### GROVE BOAT-IN

A remote lakeshore campground, accessible by boat only, offers opportunities for lakeshore tent camping

*Boat-in camping (31 units), fishing, boating (moorings), skiing, open year-round.*

Refer to the directions to Grove, then ½ mile to Grove boat launch and boat one mile north to the campground.



### GROVE

Scenic views and woodland settings on Laurel River Lake to be enjoyed by RV's and trailer/tent campers.

*Camping (52 units, 4 tent units, trailer/tent spaces, individual electric and water hook-ups, showers), picnicking (8 units), boating (launch), hiking, handicapped access, fishing, dump station. U.S. Fee Area.*

From I-75 at the Corbin interchange, take U.S. 25W west for 5 miles, turn right (north) on KY 1277 for 2 miles. Turn right (northeast) on Forest Service Road 558 for 3 miles to Grove.



### HOLLY BAY

Offering a variety of outdoor recreation opportunities, including access to the Sheltowee Trace National Recreation Trail and adjacent to Holly Bay Marina.

*Camping (75 units, 19 tent units, trailer/tent spaces, individual electric and water hook-ups, showers), hiking, boating (launch), fishing, dump station, handicapped access. U.S. Fee Area.*

From I-75 at the London interchange, take KY 192 west for 14.2 miles, turn left (south) on KY 1193 for 1 mile, turn left on Forest Service Road 770 and then left again on Forest Service Road 611 for 2 miles.



### HOLLY BAY MARINA

Open year-round. Provides fishing boats, houseboats, pontoon boats, fishing equipment, boating equipment, skiing equipment, bait, water safety equipment.

Refer to the directions to Holly Bay, then 1 mile to Marina.



### LAUREL BRIDGE

A picnic area at the head of Laurel River Lake at Highway 312 bridge. Scenic views of cliffs bordering the lake.

*Group picnicking (shelter), boating (launch), fishing.*

From I-75 at the Corbin interchange, take KY 770 for 1 mile, turn left (south) on KY 312 and cross the bridge for access to the picnic area.




### WHITE OAK BOAT-IN

Secluded tent camping in a remote, lakeshore setting.

*Boat-in camping (62 units), fishing boating (moorings), skiing, open year-round.*

From I-75 at the London interchange, take KY 192 west for 12 miles, turn left (south) on Forest Service Road 774 for 2 miles to Marsh Branch Boat Launch. Boat 1 mile south to campground.

### LITTLE LICK

Secluded woodland camping. Trails lead to Lake Cumberland. Trails and overnight accommodations for horses.

*Camping (7 units), corral, hiking, horseback riding. Open year-round.*

Take KY 192 east from Somerset for 21 miles, turn right (south) on Forest Service Road 122, follow signs on Forest Service Road 816B for 8 miles.




### NATURAL ARCH SCENIC AREA

A 945-acre scenic area featuring a magnificent sandstone arch in a setting of rimrock cliffs. Many scenic overlooks and trails to points of interest.

*Picnicking (16 units), hiking, shelter, scenic views.*


Take U.S. 27 south from Somerset for 21 miles, turn right (west) on KY 927 and follow the signs for 2 miles.

# RED RIVER GORGE

## STANTON RANGER DISTRICT



*Natural Arch, one of the many stone arches scattered across the forest.*



### GRAYS ARCH

Picnicking on a ridgetop in the Red River Gorge; featuring a hike to the breathtaking area around Grays Arch and access to the Red River Gorge National Recreation Trail.

*Picnicking (5 units), hiking, scenic views.*

From the Mountain Parkway at the Slade interchange, take KY 15 east for 3 miles, turn left (north) on Forest Service Road 39 for ½ mile to picnic area.



### KOOMER RIDGE

Just off the Mountain Parkway, near Red River Gorge, known for its rock bridges and other unusual geological formations. Trails lead to scenic attractions, Red River and the Red River Gorge National Recreation Trail.

*Camping (54 units, trailer/tent spaces), hiking, handicapped access. U.S. Fee Area.*

From the Mountain Parkway at the Slade interchange, take KY 15 east for 5 miles to the campground.




### ROCK BRIDGE

This unique stone arch spans Swift Camp Creek. A 1.5 mile nature trail loop passes a large variety of interesting vegetation and provides access to the Red River Gorge National Recreation Trail.

*Picnicking (15 units), hiking, nature interpretation. Open year-round.*

Referring to the directions to Koomer Ridge, continue on KY 15 for 3 miles, turn left (north) on KY 715 for ½ mile, turn right (east) on Forest Service Road 24 for 3.5 miles.



### SKY BRIDGE

A natural stone arch at the top of a ridge with a vista of Red River Gorge.

*Picnicking (10 units), hiking.  
Open year-round.*

From the Mountain Parkway at the Slade interchange, take KY 15 east for 8 miles, turn left (north) on KY 715 for 6 miles.



### TARR RIDGE

A ridgetop picnic area on the north end of the Red River Gorge.

*Picnicking (7 units). Open year-round.*

From the Mountain Parkway at the Slade interchange, take KY 15 west for 3 miles, turn right (north) on KY 77 to junction with KY 715, turn left and continue on 77 for 2 miles to picnic area.




### VISITOR INFORMATION


Seasonal information station offering information on recreation opportunities in the Red River Gorge area, as well as other parts of the Daniel Boone National Forest.

**ROCKCASTLE**

On Lake Cumberland, at the mouth of the Rockcastle River. Trails lead to scenic overlooks. Adjacent to Nolan Boat Dock.

*Camping (17 units, trailer/tent spaces), picnicking (17 units), fishing, boating (launch, rental boats and motors), hiking, U.S. Fee Area.*

Take KY 192 southwest from London for 16 miles, turn left (south) on KY 1193 for 5 miles to the end of the road.




**RODBURN HOLLOW**


A campground/picnic area located just outside Morehead, in a narrow, steep-sided valley. Access to the Sheltowee Trace National Recreation Trail.

*Camping (12 units, trailer/tent spaces), picnicking (35 units), shelter, hiking, playing field.*

Take U.S. 60 northeast from Morehead for 2 miles. Turn left (north) on Rodburn Hollow Road past District Office and follow the signs.




**SAWYER**

Campground on the shore of Lake Cumberland. Scenic views of the lake and surrounding cliff formations.

*Camping (19 units), boating (launch), fishing, hiking.*

From Cumberland Falls, take KY 90 west for 5 miles, turn right (north) on KY 896 for 7 miles and follow the signs.

### S-TREE

Campground/picnic area located in remote forest setting. Access to the Sheltoewe Trace National Recreation Trail.

*Camping (10 units, trailer/tent spaces), picnicking (6 units), fishing (stocked pond nearby), hiking.*

Take U.S. 421 west from McKee for ½ mile, turn left (south) on KY 89 for 3 miles, turn right (west) on Forest Service Road 43 for 1 mile, turn left (south) on Forest Service Road 20 and follow the signs.




### TURKEY FOOT

A campground/picnic area in a grove of oaks, along the bank of a mountain stream, which disappears into a limestone sinkhole during dry weather. Playing field nearby. Access to the Sheltoewe Trace National Recreation Trail.

*Camping (15 units, trailer/tent spaces), picnicking (5 units), hiking.*

Take KY 89 north from McKee for 3 miles, turn right (east) on Forest Service Road 4 and follow signs for 3 miles.

## CAMPING REGULATIONS

The purpose of the rules in effect in National Forest Recreation areas is to insure your protection and maximum pleasure.

By observing these regulations, you and your camping neighbors will be able to enjoy the peace and serenity of the forest environment.

### "GOOD NEIGHBOR" CAMPING

1. Use containers provided for garbage and unburnable trash.
2. Use grill or stove to burn paper and cardboard trash.
3. Clean up your campsite before you depart.
4. Keep pets on leash - and quiet!
5. Refrain from making noises that might disturb your neighbor's sleep during night hours (10 p.m.-6 a.m.).
6. Put nothing in toilets that might damage or clog them.
7. Boisterousness anytime is prohibited; this includes loud playing of radios, TV, amplifiers, musical instruments, etc.
8. Motorbikes and motorcycles are to be used only to enter or leave the area. Noisy vehicles (without mufflers) and "gunning" of engines are prohibited.

9. Observe speed limits. Drive carefully. Park only in areas provided.
10. Keep all vehicles on roads and spurs.
11. Shooting and fireworks are prohibited.
12. Camping is prohibited at Cave Run Lake, Laurel River Lake and the Red River Gorge Geological Area in the following situations:
  - a. Within 300 feet of the water's edge, except at sites designated by the Forest Supervisor.
  - b. Within 300 feet of any road or trail leading to the lakes except sites designated by the Forest Supervisor.
  - c. Within 300 feet of any developed road.
  - d. Within sight of any forest developed trails.
  - e. Within 200 yards of Grays Arch.
13. Using a campsite or picnic site by more than the designated number of users is prohibited.
14. All campsites must have camping equipment placed on them and be actively and continuously occupied immediately after registration. The placing of camping equipment or personal items merely to hold or reserve the sites is prohibited.

#### "GOOD NEIGHBOR" WATER SPORTS

1. Keep glass away from beach.
2. Keep pets away from beach and swimming area.
3. Motorboaters must observe 5 mph speed limit when within 150 feet of bathers, other boats and boat landings. Motors should have adequate devices to prevent unnecessary noise.

#### HIKING

Go prepared. Be sure you have: a good light-weight rain outfit, lightweight tent and fly, small first aid kit, down sleeping bags during the winter, a good topographic map and compass, plenty of dry matches, let someone know where you are going and when you will return - and last, but not least, a good weather report!

1. Do not underestimate the ruggedness of the terrain and the physical exertion it will require.
2. Anticipate very heavy rainstorms that periodically occur.
3. Sources of water along the ridges are often limited and can fail during dry periods.
4. You can't depend upon the purity of water in springs, creeks or rivers. Purify all water you intend to use for cooking or drinking by boiling it or adding purifying tablets.
5. Take along a snakebite kit. Rattlesnakes and copperheads do exist in forest areas.
6. Take special care with campfires and smoking materials to protect from the ever-present danger of wildfires.
7. Don't cut across switchbacks on trails. This causes erosion and destroys part of the natural environment.
8. Give a friend a description of your planned itinerary so someone will know where you are.
9. Be aware of the danger of hypothermia - hike with a friend.

#### CAMPFIRES

Forests are vital to our nation. Practice deliberate fire prevention - always!

1. Extinguish you match; break it in two before discarding.
2. Crush out your smoke; use the ashtray in your vehicle.
3. Stop to smoke. Find a safe place. Stamp out your smoke on mineral soil or rock - never in dry grasses, leaves or needles.
4. Never leave a campfire unattended - put it out before you leave.
5. Be especially careful with fire when the wind is blowing.
6. Never try to "smoke out" game. Look for game elsewhere. Give that squirrel (and the forest) another chance.
7. Drown your campfire; turn the sticks and drown them a second time. Make sure the fire is out - DEAD OUT!

**S-TREE**

Campground/picnic area located in remote forest setting. Access to the Sheltowee Trace National Recreation Trail.

Camping (10 units, trailer/tent spaces), picnicking (6 units), fishing (stocked pond nearby), hiking.

Take U.S. 421 west from McKee for 1/2 mile, turn left (south) on KY 89 for 3 miles, turn right (west) on Forest Service Road 43 for 1 mile, turn left (south) on Forest Service Road 20 and follow the signs.



**TURKEY FOOT**

A campground/picnic area in a grove of oaks, along the bank of a mountain stream, which disappears into a limestone sinkhole during dry weather. Playing field nearby. Access to the Sheltowee Trace National Recreation Trail.

Camping (15 units, trailer/tent spaces), picnicking (5 units), hiking.

Take KY 89 north from McKee for 3 miles, turn right (east) on Forest Service Road 4 and follow signs for 3 miles.


