The faculty met in special session April 20th., 1917, President Barker presiding.

President Barker stated that the purpose of the meeting was to hear a report from the Discipline Committee.

Professor Mathews, Chairman of the Discipline Committee, read the following report which was received and filed:

April 19, 1917

"The Committee on Discipline was called together on this date by order of President Barker to consider a report of the Committee on Entertainments non-athletic, relative to the student organizations known as the "Mystic 13" and "Keys".

It was charged that these organizations had given a dance at the Phoenix Hotel on Friday, April 13, in violation of the University rules, which require that all such dances shall be arranged only upon the authorization of the Committee on Entertainments.

Upon investigation the Committee on Discipline found the charges substantiated, and upon motion it was ordered that the Committee recommend to the Faculty that these societies be disbanded, and refused further recognition as University organizations."

By a unanimous vote of the faculty the following resolution was adopted:

"WHEREAS the Discipline Committee of the University of Kentucky have found the Keys and Mystic Thirteen, two student organizations of the University, in wilful violation of the faculty rule, and contrary to the direct orders of the Committee on Non-Athletic Entertainments, gave a dance at the Phoenix Hotel on the evening of the thirteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and seventeen.

And WHEREAS all of the members of said Fraternity were equally guilty,

Now, THEREFORE, upon the recommendation of the Discipline Committee, we the Faculty of the University of Kentucky, do recall the authority heretofore given said two organizations to operate as societies at the

University of Kentucky and hereby forbid any student or students from joining said societies or in any way holding themselves out as members of said societies."

Professor Miller asked that a ruling be made in regard to examinations to be given conditioned students next fall - whether they shall cover the whole semester work, or from the beginning of the semester up to the present time. President Barker recommended that a semester's work would be up to the time the student leaves, which was approved by the faculty.
