# Clary denied tenure once again

By Jennifer Smith

The controversial two-year-long tenure review case of Mark Clary, a former associate professor of architecture, ended with a denial letter from Chancellor for the Lexington Campus Robert Hemenway.

"I do not make this decision lightly or without extensive consideration," Hemenway said in a letter to Clary, dated Tuesday.

The chancellor, who left town yesterday and could not be reached for comment, wrote that he would stand behind his "two previous negative decisions" on Clary's tenure because he could find no "basis for sustaining (Clary's) appeal" and granting tenure.

Clary's first bid for tenure was denied in 1993. He appealed the denial, but that appeal resulted in a second denial in April 1994.

Students in the College of Architecture began their campaign of support for the former professor in April of this year, after the second denial.

They compiled more than 190 signatures on a petition and 87 individual student letters of support

Since the beginning of the fall semester, the students organized a coalition supporting Clary again.

Last Wednesday, nearly 300 students marched to Hemenway's office to voice their support.

As a result of the march, Hemenway agreed to meet with the students later that same н

ay.

The students requested, and were besteather that the students requested, and were absenced to the students as to why Clary was denied to the students.

"I am not here to discuss Mark Clary's tenure," Hemenway told the students. "University policy states that we do not discuss individual cases. I'm here to talk about the pro-

But the students persisted.
"I chose to come to the University of Kentucky. I chose to be in the school of architecture — I made all of these choices and now I see my education crum-bling before me. I'm scared. I'm reaching out to learn why, but you won't tell us," said Tara Kelley, a second-year architecture student, during the impromptu meeting.

Yesterday, the students lamented the decision.

"It was a devastating thing to hear. ### **WORLD 48 bodies found** in possible mass suicide

CHEIRY, Switzerland — Twenty-one bodies made a neat circle on the floor of a red, mirror-lined chapel hidden beneath the burning farm-house. Ten had plastic garbage bags tied around their necks with cords, and some had their hands bound. Twenty had bullets in their heads.

In three ski chalets 90 miles away, police discovered more bodies, bady burned by fires apparently set by remote control.

In all, authorities found 48 bodies yesterday, and indications of a mass murder-suicide by a cult they hadn't known existed.

Two bodies were found a day earlier in Canada in the charred wreckage of an unexplained arson fire. Police said the owner of the burned duplex, Luc Jouret, led apocalyptic cults in both Canada and Switzerland. Investigators said the fires in both countries were set off by remote-controlled electrical devices.

### NATION Ex-minister violated clinic law

PENACOLA, Fla. — A former minister was convicted yesterday of violating the nation's new abortion clinic access law for a shorgun attack that killed an abortion doctor and his bodyguand. A federal jury deliberated just more than two hours before finding Paul Hill guily of three counts of violating the new law and one separate frearms charge. He was the first person tried under the law adopted earlier this year.

He could get life in prison when he is sentenced Dec 9. He also is awaiting trial in state court Jan. 30 on murder and attempted murder charges that could get him the electric chair.



# **Gates to discuss** black renaissance at speech tonight

Author, poet and scholar Henry Louis Gates Jr. will discuss the Harlem Renaissance of the 1920s at Memorial Hall tonight at 7:30.

Gates' speech at UK coincides with the current Time cover story titled "Black Renaissance—African-American artists are truly free at last," which includes a story by Gates.

Gates said in the article, "the idea of a black American renaissance" has been declared three times during the 20th century.

In 1904, the "New Negro Literary Movement" was declared when write-er's like W.E.B. DuBois and Paulina Hopkins were at the height of their creative energy. Then in the 1920s, another renaissance was declared when Alain Locke became the first black Rhodes scholar cultural renaissance was inherently political; it was thought that the production of great art by sufficient mumbers of blacks would facilitate the Negro's demand for civil rights and for social and economic equality," Gates writes in Time.

John Dougherty, a junior physician assistant, said PAs have a strong primary care focus as well.







▼Pines for technical fouls will increase to \$500, up from \$100 for the first one and \$150 for the second.

▼The second or more of back-to-back timeouts when the ball is not inbounded can be no longer than 45 seconds.







# Panel moves 'Beyond O.J.'

The pressure was on a panel of scholars to go "Beyond O.J." And they did.

The panel, composed of state and national journalism professionals and scholars, met yesterday in Recital Hall of the Otis A. Singletary Center for the Arts to discuss a controversial movement in the media industry called public journalism with their central focus on the issue of domestic violence.

The forum, "Beyond O.J.," was designed by Leland "Buck" Ryan, director of the School of Journalism and Telecommunications, to examine the media's changing role in society.

It urges newspapers to become more active within their communities and less reactive.

"Right now, every community feels poorly represented by the media," said Frank Denton, editor of the Wisconsin State Journal.

He said representatives of the media are perceived as "drive-by journalists," which means the pub-

ne tranks the media enters a community, summarizes the story briefly and then leaves.

Davis "Buzz" Merritt, editor and senior vice president of the Wichite Eagle, cited a survey that said 71 percent of the people in this country feel ill-represented by the media.

"The media's role in public discover who needs to talk to who and how they can get involved," Rosen said.

Denton has been experimenting with public journalism in his hometown of Madison, Wis.

He said there has been a recent flood of people from major cities, like Chicago, moving into the Madison area and bringing people like "Uncle Charlie" with them. Denton said this fictional "Uncle Charlie" character sells

"Uncle Charlie" character sells drugs and starts gangs.

In this experiment, Denton and his newspaper, in cooperation with other media and the community, have started neighborhood programs that have helped decrease the crime rate in the area. Denton said it is important to do more than just report the news. "Just putting the information out there occasionally is not onough," he said. "You need to stay focused... until you've made a difference."

Tim Kelly, editor of the Lexington Herald-Leader, said it has been his experience that just reporting the news is not enough.

"Once the bright light is off, things go back to the way they were," he said. "We don't feel like (the Herald-Leader) can do a series and then just stop reporting on it."
