

Cannon said his mother believes every boxer will, like Muhammad Ali, suffer from life-altering side effects. The former heavyweight champion of the world now has Parkinson's disease, a neurological syndrome that causes tremors, stowness in speech and a decline in motor skills. Doctors have said Ali's condition is likely caused by his boxing career.

Panel: View of Mid East must change

A panel of academics gathered last night to answer the question: Is political Islam destabilizing the world?

The answer seemed to have more to do with Americans as panelists of the event agreed that the United States needed to vastly change its policies in the Middle East for relations between Islamic states and the West to improve.

The event, titled "Does Islamic Revivalism Challenge a Stable World Order?" was one of several academic presentations that will be featured during the College of Arts and Sciences "Geek Week." The panel consisted of professor of Islamic studies Insan Bagby, history professor Robert Olson and professor John Stempel of the Patterson School of Diplomacy and International Commerce.

"The anger in the Muslim world is at all levels, but the masses are not violent," Bagby said. "It's not a hothed of terrorism."

Bagby said Western influence has

Bagpy said Western influence has bred Islami: "Political Islam has been opposed very vigorously by the West." Bagby: "Political Islam has been opposed very vigorously by the West." Bagby said. "The repression and opposition of the West has, I think, radicalized Islami-ly goods, a moderation of views. The repression of these organizations has retarded that movement."

Most of the panelists agreed that the war in Iraq has given momentum to Islamic revivalism, which Olson said began in the 1960s.

"There were no suicide bombers in Iraq before 2003." Olson said. "You displace that many people from their homes, people are going to be upset."

"The biggest disadvantage is cost," said James Kipp, associate director of the Kentucky Water Resources Research Institute. "If you calculate the cost per gallon, buying single bottles of water costs more per gallon at this point than gasoline does." A 20-ounce Dasani bottled water costs 51.30 at campus dinnig facilities, equal to \$8.32 per gallon.

But the negative effects bottled water has on the environment should also be considered, kipp said. Making plastic bottles requires oil, enough to fuel 100,000 cars a year, according to the news release, and more fuel is used to transport the bottles.

"Bottled water requires the production

of plastic for the bottles and packaging using hydrocarbons that could be used for fusion and other products," he said.

Even though plastic can be recycled, 86 percent of the empty plastic water bottles in the nation land in the trashcans instead of recycling bins, according to a Take Back the Tap report.

The Food and Drug Administration regulates bottled water as a food under the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act. I am writing in response to David Rempfer's letter supporting pro-life in Wednesday's Kernel. Rempfer's argument is mostly irrelevant and presents one-sided facts that dispel his reasoning.

Rempfer states that "an enduring principle of America has been the sanctity of life," then cites historical events such as the ruling for women's suffrage and the outlawing of slavery. These examples are completely irrelevant to the subject of abortion because they deal with the rights of living beings. The abortion argument lies in deciding when the child is considered a separate living being from the mother, which is the point when the child gains rights.

Rempfer claims, "Studies have shown that women post-abortion are 4.7 percent more likely to surfler breast cancer, 90 percent are likely to report they feel they took a human life and seven times more likely to commit suicide than women post-birth." He does not present any facts from the other side of the fence.

The American Psychological Association did an extensive study and concluded that severe negative reactions after abortions are rare, and that while some women may experience sensations of regret, address or guilt after an abortion, the overwhelming responses are relief and happiness. There are other studies that also support this notion.

Rempfer also aided to account for the potential harm of unprepared, or out-right and the studies of the pro-life arguments, any logical person would agree that government assistance is not sufficient for properly risking a child and can be misused; poverty has also repeatedly been linked to high crime rates and low education levels.

I do respect Rempfer's opinion, but the reasoning he gave for it was very one-sided. The "psychological problems" argument does not stand, and that leaves us with a question. It is twose to have a 4.7 percent increased risk in breast cancer for women with abortions or to have increased crime and poverty rates coupled with lower education levels?






