 before the close of the session, was granted.

Mr. J. S. Moon's request for an honorable discharge
 was not granted on account of his connection
 with this recent trouble.

April 26th

The Faculty met as usual.

 From this communication and from some statements made by

 or anyone else to have his name taken off.

A resolution was then offered and passed by which
 Mr. Molllyneaux's dismission was rescinded.

The requests of Messrs. Lord and T. J. Cooper for
 honorable discharges were laid on the table for

consideration at the next meeting.

Mr. Frumbo was present and stated that he had not authorized any one to ask that his name be signed to the petition, and that he did not want his name there. The action of the Faculty, at their last meeting, to restore him to his former position was rescinded. The Faculty then adjourned.
