Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Tuesday, December 13, 1983.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met at 9 a.m. (Eastern Standard Time) on Tuesday, December 13, 1983 in the Board Room on the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington Campus.

A. Meeting Opened and Roll Called

Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 9 a.m., and the invocation was pronounced by Mr. Thomas P. Bell.

The following members of the Board of Trustees answered the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill (Chairman), Mr. Thomas P. Bell, Mr. William R. Black, Mr. David T. Bradford, Professor Timothy A. Cantrell, Mr. Tracy Farmer, Mr. George W. Griffin, Jr., Mrs. Edythe Jones Hayes, Mr. Brereton C. Jones, Mr. R. Larry Jones, Professor James D. Kemp, Mr. T. A. Lassetter, Mr. W. Bruce Lunsford, Mr. Robert T. McCowan, Mr. A. Stevens Miles, Mr. Frank Ramsey, Jr. and Professor Constance P. Wilson. Absent from the meeting were Governor Albert Benjamin Chandler, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. Ronald G. Geary, and Mr. Bobby Watson. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Mr. James O. King, Vice President for Administration; Chancellors Peter P. Bosomworth, Art Gallaher, and Charles T. Wethington; Dr. Raymond R. Hornback, Vice President for University Relations; Mr. David I. Carter, Special Assistant for Business and Financial Affairs; Mr. John C. Darsie, General Counsel; Mr. Henry Clay Owen, Controller and Treasurer; Dr. Paul G. Sears, Special Assistant for Academic Affairs; Dr. Wimberly C. Royster, Vice Chancellor for Research and Dean of the Graduate School; and Dr. Jack C. Blanton, Vice Chancellor for Administration, Lexington Campus.

Members of the various news media were also in attendance. The Secretary reported a quorum present, and the Chairman declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 9:02 a.m.

B. Minutes Approved

The Minutes of the October 18, 1983 meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees were approved as written.

C. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

In order to permit Board members to attend the inauguration of Governor Martha Layne Collins in Frankfort, President Singletary did not review the items in his monthly report, copies of which were distributed earlier. He suggested that the Trustees might wish to read it at a later date and recommended that the report be accepted. Without objection, it was so ordered.

D. Personnel Actions (PR 2)

After noting that the personnel actions in PR 2 were routine in nature, President Singletary recommended its approval. Without discussion, on motion made by Mr. Ramsey, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed, the appointments and staff changes recommended in PR 2 were approved. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

E. Recommendation on Central Administration (PR 3A)

With President Singletary so recommending, Mr. Larry Jones moved that the Board authorize the following changes in Central Administration: (1) change in title from Special Assistant for Business and Financial Affairs to Associate Vice President for Business Services, and (2) change in title from Director of Budget to Associate Vice President for Planning and Budget. Mr. Jones' motion was seconded by Mr. Lunsford and passed without dissent. (See PR 3A at the end of the Minutes.)

F. 1983-84 Budget Revisions (PR 3B)

On motion duly made, seconded, and carried, the budget revisions as recommended in PR 3B were authorized and approved. (See PR 3B at the end of the Minutes.)

G. Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations (PR 3C)

President Singletary recommended that the proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky as presented in PR 3C be received for consideration and placed on the agenda for action at the April 3, 1984 meeting of the Board of Trustees. On motion made by Mr. Miles, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed, it was so ordered. (See PR 3C at the end of the Minutes.)

H. <u>Candidates for Degrees - Lexington Campus and Medical</u> <u>Center (PR 3D)</u>

Without discussion, Mr. Griffin moved that the President be authorized to confer upon each individual whose name was listed in PR 3D the correct degree to which he or she is entitled. His motion was seconded by Mr. Farmer and passed unanimously. (See PR 3D at the end of the Minutes.)

I. Report on Gifts and/or Grants (PR 3E)

The report on gifts and/or grants covering the period from July 1, 1983 through September 30, 1983 was accepted and ordered made a matter of record as recommended in PR 3E. (See PR 3E at the end of the Minutes.)

J. Candidates for Degrees - Community College System (PR 4A)

Professor Cantrell moved that the degrees and certificates specified in PR 4A be awarded to the persons named, upon certification that the requirements for those degrees or certificates have been satisfactorily completed. His motion was seconded by Mrs. Hayes and passed without dissent. (See PR 4A at the end of the Minutes.)

K. Change of Name-The Lexington Technical Institute (PR 4B)

Change in Division Structure-The Lexington Technical Institute (PR 4C)

Establishment of an Advisory Board at the Lexington Technical Institute (PR 4D)

President Singletary recommended that PR's 4B, 4C, and 4D be considered together. On motion made by Mrs. Hayes, seconded by Professor Kemp, and passed without dissent, the Board approved the following: (1) the change in name of the Lexington Technical Institute to Lexington Community College, effective July 1, 1984, (2) the change in Division structure for the Lexington Technical Institute, and (3) the establishment of a nine-member Advisory Board for the Lexington Technical Institute. (See PR's 4B, 4C, and 4D at the end of the Minutes.)

L. H. Wendell Cherry and William T. Lafferty Professorships (PR 5A)

President Singletary recommended that the Board of Trustees establish in the College of Law the H. Wendell Cherry Professorship and the William T. Lafferty Professorship as presented in PR 5A. Mr. Larry Jones so moved. His motion was seconded by Mr. Bell and passed without dissent. (See PR 5A at the end of the Minutes.)

M. Approval of Agreement Between University of Kentucky and Kentucky Medical Services Foundation. Incorporated (PR 6A)

President Singletary recommended approval of the agreement between the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky and Kentucky Medical Services Foundation, Incorporated as presented in PR 6A.

Chancellor Bosomworth explained that the terms of the document in PR 6A are essentially the same as those in the agreement approved by the Board on June 21, 1983. However, the January 1, 1984 activation of the University Medical Plaza Building has necessitated certain changes in that contract which are reflected in the agreement attached to PR 6A. Mr. Black moved approval. His motion was seconded by Mr. Larry Jones and passed without dissent. (See PR 6A at the end of the Minutes.)

N. <u>Interim Financial Report (FCR 1)</u>

Mr. Farmer, reporting for Mr. Clay, Chairman of the Finance Committee, said the committee had met on the afternoon of December 12, 1983 and considered four items to be presented for action, the first of which was the Interim Financial Report for the period ended October 31, 1983. He then moved that the report be accepted. His motion was seconded by Mr. Griffin and passed without dissent. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes.)

0. <u>Disposal of Personal Property (FCR 2)</u>

With the concurrence of the Finance Committee, Mr. Farmer moved that the Board approve the disposal of personal property as recommended in FCR 2. His motion was seconded by Mr. Griffin and passed without dissent. (See FCR 2 at the end of the Minutes.)

P. Delegation Authorizing the President to Enter Into Leases and Easements not Exceeding \$20,000 in Value (FCR 3)

The Finance Committee so recommending, Mr. Farmer moved that the President or his designated representative be authorized to enter into leases and easements not exceeding \$20,000 in value as recommended in FCR 3. Mr. Farmer's motion was seconded by Mr. Miles and passed without dissent. (See FCR 3 at the end of the Minutes.)

Q. University of Kentucky Arboretum (FCR 4)

Acting on the recommendation of the Finance Committee, Mr. Farmer moved that the Board reserve an area of the Lexington Campus of some 94 acres south of Alumni Drive and east of Commonwealth Drive as an arboretum for use in the educational programs of the University. Vice Chancellor Blanton explained that the use of land proposed is consistent with the current land use plan and that no monies are required at this time for the development of the arboretum. Mr. Farmer's motion was seconded by Mr. Griffin and passed unanimously. (See FCR 4 at the end of the Minutes.)

R. Meeting Adjourned

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:18 a.m.

Recommendation on Central Administration

Recommendation: that the Board authorize the following changes in Central Administration: (1) change in title from Special Assistant for Business and Financial Affairs to Associate Vice President for Business Services, and (2) change in title from Director of Budget to Associate Vice President for Planning and Budget.

Background: After more than a year of experience with the new Central Administration organization, an evaluation indicates the need to separate the planning and budget functions from the other functions of the Special Assistant for Business and Financial Affairs to better coordinate business services University-wide. The responsibilities of the Special Assistant for Business and Financial Affairs fall into two major functional areas - coordination and policy for University-wide business services and the direction of University planning and budget administration. The division in responsibilities between two positions will better assure the fulfillment of all business and financial responsibilities assigned to Central Administration.

The Associate Vice President for Planning and Budget will be responsible for preparation of University-wide planning activities and budget administration, including direct responsibility for the offices of Planning and Policy Analysis, and of Budget; this person will also serve as Director of Budget. The title being recommended existed prior to reorganization.

The Associate Vice President for Business Affairs will be directly responsible for the Office of Organization and Management Analysis and the development of University-wide policy and coordination of computing, construction and renovation, communications, personnel and business services.

Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations

Recommendation: that the following proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky (March 1983) be received at this time for preliminary consideration and, at the next statutory meeting of the Board of Trustees, be included on the agenda for action.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined; proposed deletions are bracketed.)

First Amendment - Change Part IV, ninth paragraph, to read:

The President shall be the chairman of the Senate and shall be the presiding officer except as the President may delegate this function. The Dean of Admissions and Registrar shall serve as ex officio secretary. A member of the [voting] University faculty (not necessarily a member of the Senate), appointed by the Senate Council, shall serve as parliamentarian. The two sergeants—at—arms appointed by the Senate Council, shall be [2] members of the [voting] University faculty [who is not a member of the Senate] and/or staff.

Rationale: This amendment has been recommended by the University Senate to provide more flexibility in appointing the parliamentarian and the two sergeants-at-arms of the University Senate.

Second Amendment - Change Part X.A, second paragraph, to read:

Members of the Board of Trustees, except those elected to the Board as faculty representatives or as a student representative, and relatives by blood or marriage of any member of the Board of Trustees are ineligible for appointment to any position in the University. No relative by blood or marriage of the President. Zor the 7 a vice president, or other officer of the Central Administration exercising University-wide jurisdiction shall be employed in a position \mathcal{L} which carries responsibility for a part of the academic program of at the University. Similarly, no relative of a chancellor, vice chancellor, special assistant to a chancellor, or other administrative officer in a sector exercising sector-wide jurisdiction shall be employed in a position in that Waiver of the above regulation may be permitted by the sector. Board of Trustees on a stated temporary basis, not to exceed two years, when it is otherwise impossible practicably to fill a position with a fully qualified person. The same individual shall not be eligible for reappointment under the terms of this exception unless approval is given by the Board of Trustees. No relative by blood or marriage of any administrative officer of the University. or of any member of the University faculty \mathcal{L} holding the rank of associate professor or higher, may be appointed to any position in the University over which the related officer or staff member exercises supervisory or line authority. Employment of persons related by blood or marriage in the same department or division shall be approved specifically by the President chancellor in a sector or the Vice President for Administration in the Central Administration, as appropriate. "Relatives by blood or marriage," as used above, includes parents and children, husbands and wives, brothers and sisters, brothers- and sisters-in-law, mothers- and fathers-in-law, uncles, aunts, nieces and nephews, and steprelatives in the same relationships. The employment of relatives by blood or marriage whose relationship was not a violation of this section of the Governing Regulations prior to its amendment on April 3, 1984, does not constitute a violation of the amended policy provided the relatives are regular employees of the University and remain in the University employment positions which they held on April 3, 1984. However, the transfer of any such employees (whose employment relationship was not a violation of policy prior to its amendment on April 3, 1984) to any other regular University position shall require approval of the President.

Rationale: This amendment, which has been recommended by the University's Personnel Council, incorporates needed changes in policy on appointments related to modifications in University organization and administrative titles implemented on or after July 1. 1982. For clarification, the term "other officer of the Central Administration exercising University-wide jurisdiction" includes the following positions/titles: Associate Vice President, Assistant Vice President, Controller and Treasurer, Special Assistant for Academic Affairs, Special Assistant for Government Relations, Director of Planning and Policy Analysis, Director of Management and Organization Analysis, Administrator for Personnel Policy and Procedures, and Legal Counsel. Similarly, the term "other administrative officer in a sector exercising sector-wide jurisdiction" includes the following positions/titles: Associate Vice Chancellor and Assistant Vice Chancellor. The principle that no relative by blood or marriage of any faculty member may be appointed to any position in the University over which the faculty member has supervisory or line authority should be independent of the academic rank held by the faculty member. The specific approval of employment of persons related by blood or marriage in the same department or division by a chancellor or the Vice President for Administration rather than by the President is consistent with the decentralization of certain authorities and responsibilities which was a major objective of the recent reorganization of the University. The last two new sentences in this paragraph are designed to provide a reasonable transition from previous policy to the amended policy.

Third Amendment - Add a new Part XII.B to read as follows:

It is the policy of the University of Kentucky that sexual harassment of students, faculty, and staff is prohibited. Complaints of sexual harassment will be treated and investigated with full regard for the University's due process requirements. Definitions and procedures relative to handling complaints of sexual harassment are provided in the Administrative Regulations (AR II-1.1-9).

Rationale: This policy on sexual harassment was approved by the Board of Trustees on March 1, 1983. At that time, in the background material for the recommendation to adopt the policy statement, it was stated that steps would be taken to include this umbrella policy statement in the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky.

CHANGE OF NAME, THE LEXINGTON TECHNICAL INSTITUTE

Recommendation: that the name of the Lexington Technical Institute be changed to Lexington Community College effective July 1, 1984.

Background: In January 1965, the U.K. Board of Trustees authorized the President of the University of Kentucky to establish the Lexington Technical Institute as a part of the Community College System. The Institute was established on August 30, 1965 to offer two-year technical and semi-professional programs to help meet employment needs in the Lexington area. Since 1965 LTI has offered an increasingly broad array of technical programs, growing from three programs and an enrollment of less than 100 in 1965 to 15 programs and a fall 1983 enrollment of 2532.

The University of Kentucky Board of Trustees in May 1983 took action to effect a selective admissions policy for the Lexington Campus effective fall semester 1984. With selective admissions for the Lexington Campus, access to public higher education at the lower division undergraduate level will no longer be available to all residents of Lexington and surrounding areas. The conversion of LTI to comprehensive community college status will add the transfer or college parallel component to the existing technical and continuing education offerings and provide for programs of a community college nature comparable to those offered at the other community colleges in the System.

This change in the mission of LTI was recommended by the Prichard Committee. The University of Kentucky Board of Trustees has authority by KRS 164.125..."to provide programs of a community college nature in its own community comparable to those listed for the Community College System, as provided by KRS 164."

ESTABLISHMENT OF AN ADVISORY BOARD AT THE LEXINGTON TECHNICAL INSTITUTE

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve the establishment of a nine-member Advisory Board for the Lexington Technical Institute.

Background: Each of the other twelve community colleges have an Advisory Board. Eleven of the colleges have nine-member advisory boards with seven lay members appointed by the Governor, one faculty and one student representative elected by faculty and students respectively. These Boards serve in an advisory capacity to the Director of the college and act as a liaison between the community and the college to assist the college in meeting the needs of the area. It is proposed that the Lexington Technical Institute be served by such a nine-member Board with seven lay members appointed for staggered four-year terms by the University of Kentucky Board of Trustees, upon the recommendation of the President of the University. One faculty representative would be elected by the faculty for a four-year term; one student representative would be elected by the students for a one-year term.

H. WENDELL CHERRY AND WILLIAM T. LAFFERTY PROFESSORSHIPS

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees establish in the College of Law the H. Wendell Cherry Professorship at a sum of \$100,000 which shall be funded by a challenge gift from Mr. Cherry, and the William T. Lafferty Professorship at a sum of no less than \$100,000 which shall be funded from miscellaneous gifts to the College specifically for this professorship, or from gifts designated for general use by the College which this resolution authorizes the dean to quasi-endow as funds are received.

Background: Mr. H. Wendell Cherry, a distinguished graduate of the UK College of Law and a prominent Louisville attorney and businessman, has provided a \$100,000 challenge gift to the College for the establishment of a professorship. Chancellor Gallaher and Dean Lawson are recommending that this professorship bear the name of the donor. The University has from now until July 1, 1984, to raise the \$100,000 required to match Mr. Cherry's gift. Judge William T. Lafferty was the first dean of the UK College of Law and instrumental in its founding. He served as dean from 1908 to 1922 with high distinction. In his memory, Dean Lawson has asked that a named professorship with a minimum funding level of \$100,000 be established. Inasmuch as the dean receives a number of private gifts for the College that are designated for general use, he is asking that he be permitted to direct at his discretion certain of these gifts into a fund for the Lafferty Professorship as quasi-endowed monies. Interest on all monies in this fund would accrue until such time as it achieves a level of \$100,000. This level of funding for each of these professorships has been approved by the President as required by the Governing Regulations.

APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY AND KENTUCKY MEDICAL SERVICES FOUNDATION, INC.

Recommendation: that the Board approve and authorize execution of the attached agreement between the University and Kentucky Medical Services Foundation, Inc. for the six-month period beginning January 1, 1984 and ending June 30, 1984.

<u>Background</u>: The action of this Board on June 20, 1978 which adopted the Medical Practice Plan provided for the negotiation and execution of annual contracts between the University and KMSF.

This Board approved, on June 21, 1983, a contract between the University and KMSF, for the period beginning July 1, 1983 and ending June 30, 1984.

However, the January 1, 1984 activation of the University Medical Plaza Building has necessitated certain changes in that contract which are reflected in the attached document.

The terms of this contract are essentially the same as those contained in the agreement approved on June 21, 1983 with the following exceptions:

Section 4 has been altered due to changes in the Federal law which now prohibits the Hospital from billing and collecting the professional component of combined charges for institutional (hospital and clinical) and professional services.

Section 5.C has been revised to reflect an increase in the amount due the University from KMSF and Section 5.D has been reworded. The amount due the University for expenses attendant to the production of clinical income has been increased from \$1,931,251 to \$2,081,397.

Section 6 has been changed to increase by \$2,000 the annualized amount to be paid by the University to the Foundation on behalf of members of the Department of Diagnostic Radiology for provision of X-ray interpretation services to the University Student Health Service.

In Section 11, the University Medical Plaza has been substituted for the ambulatory floors in University Hospital as the site for the conduct of the clinic patient care operation.

Section 13.C has been added to provide information sufficient for the Foundation to verify the nature and detail of expenditure of funds paid to the University under Section 5.C.

Section 18 has been changed to reflect the six (6) month period of the current agreement.

Section 22 has been changed to reflect the dates of the agreement as January 1, 1984 - June 30, 1984.

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this _______ day of ________,

1983 by and between the BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY, a

statutory body corporate existing pursuant to Section 164.100 et seq of the

Kentucky Revised Statutes (hereinafter referred to as the University) and

KENTUCKY MEDICAL SERVICES FOUNDATION, INC., a non-stock, non-profit

corporation formed pursuant to Chapter 273 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes

(hereinafter referred to as the Foundation).

WITNESSETH:

Section 1. RECITALS

- A. Foundation is organized for the purposes stated in its Articles of Incorporation as a non-stock, non-profit corporation and will use and apply the whole or any part of its income and principal exclusively for charitable, scientific, or educational purposes at or for the benefit of, the University of Kentucky Medical Center.
- B. A substantial number of University's faculty in its College of Medicine have heretofore executed agreements with Foundation, known as "Practice Agreements and Assignments" whereby said faculty have assigned to Foundation their professionally generated clinical income.
- C. The recruitment and retention of the members of the medical faculty of the University will be improved by permitting the said members to supplement, by income from the practice of medicine, the salaries provided by the University.

- D. The University recognizes that the medical practice activities of its faculty members can be conducted in a more efficient and economical manner if those faculty members who produce income are permitted, through the medium of the Foundation, to exercise a larger voice in the expenditure of the funds so produced.
- E. The University has heretofore established, in addition to its previously adopted Physicians Service Plan, a "geographic full-time medical service plan", the said geographic full-time plan having been adopted on June 20, 1978; said action is hereby incorporated by reference as is set out in full herein.
- F. The aforementioned action of University's Board of Trustees authorized the University's President to negotiate and execute a contract, subject to the approval of said Board, with an appropriately qualified entity for carrying out necessary functions and assuming the responsibilities involved in the administration of income for professional services under the plan.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Section 2. DEFINITIONS

A. "The Plan" means the geographic full-time medical service plan for the University of Kentucky College of Medicine established by action of the Board of Trustees of said University dated June 20, 1978.

- B. "Clinical Income" means (1) all payments for professional services rendered to or with respect to patients whether denominated as diagnosis, treatment, evaluation, or consultation and whether said payments be characterized as fees, retainers, or otherwise, and (2) all payments whether direct or in kind, (excluding actual travel costs) for oversight or administration of, or consultation with, facilities, programs, or other operations providing care, services or evaluation relating to patients, and (3) witness fees or other payments relating to depositions or other evaluations in the capacity of an expert witness. Provided, however, that nothing contained herein shall be deemed to include in the term "clinical income" any item excluded therefrom by paragraph II. B of the plan.
- C. "Practice Agreements" means those documents, denominated Practice Agreements and Assignments heretofore executed by certain members of University's faculty, the University, The Fund for Advancement of Education and Research in the University of Kentucky Medical Center and the Foundation.

Section 3. NATURE OF THE AGREEMENT

Pursuant to Paragraph III, A. of the aforementioned action of University's Board of Trustees dated June 20, 1978, University hereby recognizes Foundation as an "appropriately qualified organizational entity" as described therein for carrying out necessary functions and assuming the responsibilities involved in the administration of income for professional services under University's "geographic full-time medical services plan".

Section 4. BILLING AND COLLECTION

Foundation agrees that it will accept, pursuant to practice agreements, the assignment of all clinical income by participants in the plan and, in accordance with such assignment, agrees to bill the amount of duly established charges for professional services to parties determined to be responsible for payment of such charges.

Section 5. REIMBURSEMENT OF UNIVERSITY

- A. In accord with paragraph II, D. 2 of the plan, the parties recognize that Foundation must reimburse University for actual expenses incurred by it which are attendant to the production of clinical income.
- B. To provide for said reimbursement, Foundation agrees that it will, on or before the first working day of each month in which reimbursable expenses are due as provided hereinafter, deposit the funds necessary to make such payments in a separate account maintained by it and that funds held in the said account will be invested only in accord with the provisions of Section 17 hereof.
- C. Foundation agrees to pay to University, from said account, as reimbursement for the remainder of the expenses attendant to the production of clinical income, University's actual annual costs, as determined by joint evaluation of Foundation and University, the sum of Two Million Eighty-One Thousand Three Hundred Ninety-Seven (\$2,081,397.00) Dollars, composed of \$1,944,765 as reimbursement of personnel expenses and other current expenses, with the remainder as reimbursement for occupancy charges, maintenance and other indirect costs less the sum of \$769,832 attributable to operational inefficiences

caused by the presence of students in the clinical setting. Payments hereunder shall be in the following manner:

- 1. Six (6) monthly installments of One Hundred Seventy-Three
 Thousand Four Hundred Forty-Nine Dollars and 75 Cents (\$173,449.75) each on the
 last calendar day of each month beginning January 31, 1984.
- 2. Any increase in direct costs of personnel and current expenses will be additive to the \$1,944,765.00 annual amount and will be borne by the Foundation. Likewise, direct cost savings in personnel and current expenses experienced through mutual management efforts of University and Foundation, will be deducted from the \$1,944,765.00 yearly reimbursement as adjusted and the monthly payments to University will be adjusted accordingly. Within 30 days of the end of each quarter, University and Foundation officials will reconcile the direct cost expenditures for clinic operations to determine if direct cost expenditures exceed the \$1,944,765.00 yearly amount or if direct cost savings have been experienced. If it is determined that direct cost savings will be experienced during the last quarter of the 1983-84 fiscal year, Foundation will hold an estimated amount in escrow from the last monthly (June 1984) payment until the final quarter reconciliation is made.
- D. In addition to the above, Foundation agrees that it will reimburse University for all "plan income", as that term is defined in paragraph II, C., 2 of the plan, paid to faculty by University.

Section 6. REIMBURSEMENT OF FOUNDATION

A. The parties recognized that University receives certain services from

Foundation, for which it is due reimbursement as specified hereinbelow.

- B. University agrees to pay to Foundation on behalf of members of the Department of Diagnostic Radiology for the provision of x-ray interpretation services to the University Student Health Service during the period January I, 1984 June 30, 1984 a sum not to exceed Seven Thousand Five Hundred (\$7,500.00) Dollars (\$15,000.00 annually).
- C. University agrees to pay to Foundation on behalf of members of the Department of Surgery, for the harvesting of transplantable kidneys from appropriate cadavers, for University Hospital, the sum of One Thousand-Two Hundred (\$1,200.00) dollars for each kidney harvest. In addition the University also agrees to pay for appropriate professional fees as defined by Medicare, Part A reimbursement regulations for live donor kidney acquisitions and cadaver kidney acquisitions.

In the event Medicare reduces Hospital reimbursement for professional fees paid as outlined above, the Foundation agrees to refund said amounts.

- D. In consideration of the furnishing of a computer prepared listing of Outpatient Diagnosis by Foundation to the Department of Patient Accounts of University Hospital on a monthly basis, University agrees to pay Foundation a fee of \$50.00 per listing, plus \$.03 per transaction.
- E. University agrees to pay to Foundation on behalf of members of the Department of Neurology, for provision of EEG interpretation services to the University Student Health Service, a fee of Forty Five (\$45.00) dollars for each such service rendered.

F. University will make payment to Foundation monthly, on the last calendar day of each month beginning January 31, 1984, for services as described in paragraphs B, C and D hereinabove.

Section 7. ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT FUND

- A. Consonant with Section II, D. 3 of the plan adopted by University's Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978, Foundation agrees that it will pay to The Fund for Advancement of Education and Research in the University of Kentucky Medical Center (hereinafter Fund), an amount equal to three (3%) percent of the actual clinical income collected by said Foundation. The Fund will deposit said payments in an account maintained for the purpose of providing an academic enrichment fund to be used by the Dean of the College of Medicine in support of the programs of said College and for related purposes. Amounts due hereunder will be computed by Foundation on a monthly basis as income is received and remitted to the Fund within twenty-five (25) days after the close of each monthly accounting period.
- B. Foundation further agrees that it will deposit, in an account maintained by Foundation, on the same basis as provided in subsection A. hereinabove, an additional amount equal to seven (7%) percent of the actual clinical income collected by said Foundation, said funds to be used by the Dean of the College of Medicine for the enrichment of the programs of the College and for related purposes in his sole discretion.

Section 8. PARTICULAR CONVENANTS OF THE FOUNDATION

- A. Foundation's Articles of Incorporation, as filed with the Secretary of State of the Commonwealth of Kentucky on June 19, 1978, have been inspected by the University as a condition precedent to University's entry into this agreement. Foundation convenants that it will not, absent the written agreement of the University, amend or otherwise alter said Articles or adopt any by-law or other operating practice which would effectively alter the character of said Foundation.
- B. Foundation convenants that it will not engage in the practice of medicine, nor will it solicit, administer, receive, perform or accept any gift, grant, devise, bequest, contract or other arrangement with or from any governmental unit, entity, or subdivision or any person, corporation, partnership, association or other entity whatsoever except as specifically permitted herein. Provided, however, that nothing contained herein shall be construed to prohibit the Foundation (subject to the approval of the Dean of the College of Medicine) from negotiating and executing contracts providing exclusively for professional services by faculty who have executed practice agreements,
- C. Foundation convenants that it will not merge with any other corporation or convey any substantial portion of its assets to any other corporation, partnership, or other entity except as specifically provided herein and that, in the event of its dissolution its Board of Directors shall cause its assets to be applied and distributed as follows: (a) all liabilities and obligations of the corporation shall be paid, satisfied and

discharged, or adequate provisions shall be made therefore; (b) assets held by the corporation upon a condition which occurs by reason of the dissolution, shall be returned, transferred or conveyed in accordance with such requirements; and (c) all of the remaining assets of the corporation shall be transferred or conveyed to the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, or its successor, to be used for medical education and research, if said University or its successor, shall qualify as a public corporation and an instrumentality of the State of Kentucky or as an exempt organization under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended; and if said University or its successor shall not so qualify, then to some other organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, or scientific purposes in the field of medicine as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended.

Section 9. MEMBERSHIP AND BENEFITS

A. University agrees that it will assist the Foundation to enforce the terms of the practice agreements entered into by members of University's clinical departments of its College of Medicine by requiring adherence to said agreements as a condition of continued employment as a member of University's faculty.

- B. University agrees that it will require, as a condition of employment as a member of University's faculty in a clinical department in which a majority of the faculty members have executed practice agreements, that new members of its faculty execute said practice agreement in form identical to said agreements heretofore executed or as the form of same may be modified by mutual agreement of the parties hereto from time to time.
- C. Foundation agrees that it will not, absent the written consent of University, bill for, collect or administer any item of income for any person or entity not holding membership in the plan, nor will it permit persons not members to serve on its Board of Directors, nor will it provide any benefit or other thing of value to any person or entity not a member of the plan except for (1) termination benefits to former members as provided by action of Foundation's Board of Directors, (2) incidental benefits indirectly accruing to employees of the Medical Center by virtue of Foundation's activities, (3) students and House Staff of University, (4) payment to nurses incident to their recruitment to the University Medical Center or (5) education and technical training costs of persons involved in patient care activities.
- D. Foundation agrees that it will strictly enforce the terms of its practice agreements, report promptly to University in the event any individual fails or refuses to abide thereby and join with University in any appropriate action, in law or equity, necessary to secure compliance therewith.

Section 10. PERSONNEL

The parties recognize the Foundation must employ various individuals to carry out its functions hereunder; however, the parties also recognize, and hereby declare their intention to adhere to, those provisions of the plan adopted by University's Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978, particularly those portions which provide that University must retain responsibilty and authority for the appointment of faculty and house staff, the determination of institutional staffing patterns and the maintenance of balance among programs and their component activities.

Accordingly, with respect to employment of personnel by Foundation, the parties agree as follows:

A. Foundation staff

The Foundation may employ an executive director and such assistants, including secretarial and clerical personnel as may be determined by its Board of Directors to be necessary to permit said Foundation to bill and collect professional fee income and to administer its funds in accord with the terms of the geographic full-time plan. Such personnel will not be provided office space at the University Medical Center.

B. Other personnel

During the term of this contract Foundation agrees that it will not employ persons to perform services in University's patient care or college programs. Provided, however, that this provision shall not be construed to prohibit specific agreements between the parties whereby University will employ personnel for such service and/or research duties with reimbursement of salary, fringe benefits and other direct costs by Foundation. Where such personnel are employed for service in a specific department or unit, employment will not occur unless (1) the department or unit where service is to be performed has consented in writing to said appointment, (2) the Dean of the College of Medicine has approved the employment and the job description related thereto and (3) funds for the salary, fringe benefits, and other costs related to said employee are either on hand or reasonably anticipated in the departmental or unit budget.

C. Equal opportunity-affirmative action

Foundation agrees that it will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age or handicap. The Foundation agrees that it will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age or handicap. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other

compensation; and selection for training. The Foundation agrees that it will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age or handicap. The Foundation agrees that it will indemnify and save harmless the University, the Board of Trustees of the University including the individual members thereof, officers, agents and employees of the University by reason of any action at law or equity or by reason of any administrative proceeding initiated by any person arising out of any such employment action or practice of Foundation, including the payment of attorney fees and other costs of such action or proceeding.

Section 11. USE OF UNIVERSITY FACILITIES

The parties recognize that paragraphs III, B. 4, b, d, g and i of the "geographic full-time plan" adopted by University's Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978 require that institutional control be maintained with respect to direction and supervision of institutional activities and programs, assignment and use of space in institutional facilities, determination of goals, objectives and priorities and the maintenance of balance among programs and their component activities.

Accordingly, Foundation and University agree that University will provide space for the Ophthalmology Clinic, the Chambers Building, appropriate assigned space in the University Medical Plaza and the Emergency Room (exclusive of faculty offices and classroom space contained therein) and other space officially designated for the conduct of the patient care operation.

With respect to any other facilities which University may from time to time provide to Foundation, Foundation shall be deemed a licensee without any property right whatsoever in said premises or facilities and shall, upon demand of University, vacate same.

Section 12. MEDICAL RECORDS

The parties agree that all medical records relating to the care of patients in University facilities or as a part of University programs, are and shall remain the property of University and that Foundation has no right or property interest therein. Provided, however, that nothing herein shall be construed to limit access to said records by members of University's faculty, staff, and students pursuant to existing University procedures. Provided, further, that University agrees to provide or make available to Foundation such information and data from patient records and program data maintained by University as may be necessary for Foundation to perform its billing and collection functions herein provided, including such information and data as may be necessary to meet the requirements of third-party or other payors as the basis for payment for services.

Section 13. INSPECTION AND AUDIT

- A. Foundation agrees that, in accord with paragraph II, B. 1, of the action of University's Board of Trustees dated June 20, 1978, its books, records and accounts are open at all reasonable times to inspection and audit by appropriately designated University representatives.
- B. The parties agree that the University's Internal Auditors will conduct an audit of Foundation's operations and accounts for the period ending June 30, 1983 and such other audits, including audits to determine compliance with this agreement, the terms of the action of University's Board of Trustees on June 20, 1978, and the terms of the departmental agreements referred to in Section 19 hereof, as may be specified by the University of Kentucky Controller and Treasurer, and that Foundation's agents and employees will cooperate to the fullest extent possible with University's auditors designated to conduct same. Further, the parties agree that a firm of Certified Public Accountants, mutually agreeable to the parties, will be employed by the Foundation to perform an independent audit of the Foundation's books, records and accounts for the year ended June 30, 1984.
- C. The Parties agree that Foundation will be furnished information by University sufficient for Foundation to verify the nature and detail of expenditure of funds paid to University under the provisions of Section 5.c.2. hereinabove.

Section 14. DEFAULT

- A. In the event of any failure of Foundation to pay any sum due to University hereunder within thirty (30) days after written notice of such default shall have been mailed to Foundation, or any failure to perform any other of the terms, conditions or convenants of this agreement to be observed or performed by Foundation for more than thirty (30) days after written notice of such default shall have been mailed to Foundation, or if Foundation shall become bankrupt or insolvent, or file any debtor proceedings, or take or have taken against Foundation in any court pursuant to any statute either of the United States or of any State a petition in bankruptcy or insolvency or for reorganization or for the appointment of a receiver or trustee of all or a portion of Foundation's property, or if Foundation makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or petitions for or enters into an arrangement therewith, then University may terminate this agreement. Provided however, that should any default occur which cannot reasonably be corrected within such thirty (30) day period then Foundation shall have such additional time to correct said default as may be reasonably necessary if Foundation promptly initiates, and expeditiously carries out, appropriate action to correct such default.
- B. University may at its election terminate this agreement with respect to any department without termination of the entire agreement for the same reasons and in the same manner as provided hereinabove.

Section 15. PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY

Nothing contained herein shall be construed to provide that any member of University's clinical faculty, house staff or student is acting as an agent of Foundation when providing care to patients in University facilities or as a part of an approved University program. University agrees that, when so acting, said faculty, house staff and students shall be considered agents of said University and that payment of claims or judgments may be made on their behalf from the fund provided pursuant to KRS 164.941 or other University funds or funds provided through any policy or policies of insurance maintained for said purpose.

Section 16. APPLICATION OF INCOME

University agrees that it will not, during the operation of this contract, cause charges for services rendered after July 1, 1978 by members of the faculty who have executed Practice Agreements and Assignments to be deposited in the accounts of the Fund for Advancement of Education and Research in the University of Kentucky pursuant to the provisions of University of Kentucky Administrative Regulation AR II-4.0-1; deposits of such charges attributable to faculty who have not executed said Practice Agreements and Assignments shall continue pursuant to said regulation.

Section 17. MANAGEMENT AND INVESTMENT POLICIES

- A. The parties recognize and agree that the reimbursement of University costs incurred attendant to the production of professional income and the provision of a sum equal to ten (10%) percent of Foundation's gross income for the purpose of providing an academic enrichment fund for University's College of Medicine constitute the second and third charges, respectively, upon Foundation's gross income, the first charge being Foundation's ordinary and necessary expenses incurred in billing and collecting said income and providing for the central administration of Foundation.
- B. Accordingly, Foundation agrees that it will deposit the funds necessary to meet its obligations for reimbursement of the University and the provision of the aforementioned academic enrichment fund in a separate account as received and that the funds in said account shall be invested only in the following: (1) direct obligations of the United States Treasury; (2) other appropriate securities issued by federal agencies (including the Federal National Mortgage Association, the Export Import Bank, Federal Intermediate Credit Bank, Federal Home Loan Banks, Federal Land Banks); and (3) certificates of deposit collateralized by direct obligations of the federal government, federal agency obligations which qualify for direct investment under this recommendation, general obligations of the Commonwealth of Kentucky or obligations of the University of Kentucky.

Foundation shall be entitled to the investment income derived from said account, provided however investment income derived from balances attributed to the academic enrichment fund identified in subparagraph A. and Section 7, paragraph B. hereinabove shall be credited to said account.

Section 18. PROVISION OF PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE

- A. Foundation agrees that it will pay to University, as reimbursement to University for its pro-rata portion of costs attendant to (i) payments required pursuant to KRS 164.941, (ii) premiums to be paid for excess aggregate professional liability insurance and (iii) costs of claims administration, the sum of Sixty-Seven Thousand (\$67,000) Dollars in six (6) equal installments, the first said installment being due and payable on January 31, 1984 and monthly thereafter until June 30, 1984.
- B. In addition, Foundation has agreed that between July 1, 1983 and June 30, 1984, it will cause to be deposited in a separate account the sum of One Hundred Thirty-Seven Thousand (\$137,000) Dollars, said account together with interest accruing thereto to be held solely for the purpose of payment of claims or judgments arising for liabilities defined in KRS 164.941 (3). No monies in said account shall be expended for any other purpose than as provided in this Section without the written agreement of University, nor shall such monies be encumbered, pledged or otherwise hypothecated. The monies in said account shall be invested only as provided in Section 17 hereof. Payment to the separate account may be in equal installments, provided that the full \$137,000.00 is deposited by June 30, 1984.

Section 19. ADMINISTRATION OF DEPARTMENTAL FUNDS

A. Foundation agrees that it will, after making provision for: (1) the costs of its administration and costs relating to billing and collection, (2) reimbursement of University expenses pursuant to Section 5 hereof and (3) the College of Medicine Academic Enrichment Fund pursuant to Section 7 hereof, maintain its accounts in such a manner that income attributable to the professional clinical activities of each of the following departments or divisions shall be shown separately on books maintained by the Foundation from any other fund or funds held by said Foundation:

Anesthesiology

Diagnostic Radiology

Emergency Medicine

Family Practice

Medicine

Neurology

Ob/Gyn

Ophthalmology

Pathology

Pediatrics

Preventive Medicine & Environmental Health

Psychiatry

Radiation Medicine

Rehabilitation Medicine

Surgery

B. Thereafter, Foundation agrees that it will expend the funds maintained by it in the aforementioned accounts only in accord with the departmental or divisional agreement relating to each department or division. Said departmental agreements are recognized as a material portion of this agreement. Therefore the parties agree that University shall retain custody of all funds accruing to the account of departments for which an approved departmental agreement has not been executed. Said departmental or divisional agreements may be amended from time to time, as provided in said agreements, with the approval of the Dean of the College of Medicine.

Section 20. NOTICES

All notices, demands and requests hereunder shall be in writing and shall be given by United States Registered or Certified Mail or by messenger delivery, in the case of University to:

Each party may from time to time change its address for purposes of notice by giving to the other party notice of such change of address. Any notice, demand or request given by United States Registered or Certified Mail, as provided herein, shall be deemed served on the date it is deposited in the United States mails properly addressed and with postage fully prepaid.

Section 21. RECORDS ACCESS

Pursuant to Public Law 96-499, Section 952, the Foundation agrees to make available upon written request from the Secretary of Health and Human Resources, the Comptroller General, or the Department of Human Services of the State of Kentucky or any of their duly authorized representatives, access to this contract and all other service agreements written or oral entered into or renewed since December 5, 1980, and access to books, documents, and records necessary to verify costs of services provided by such arrangements exceeding \$10,000 in a 12-month period. Access will be permitted until four years have expired after completion of services furnished, and in accordance with the applicable federal regulations.

If the Foundation carries out any of the duties under this contract through a sub-contract with a related organization, with a value or cost of \$10,000 or more over a 12-month period, such sub-contract shall contain a clause to the effect that until the expiration of four years after the furnishing of such services pursuant to the sub-contract, the related organization shall make available, upon written request from the Secretary or Comptroller General, or any of their duly authorized representatives, the sub-contract, books, documents and records of such organization that are necessary to verify the nature and extent of such costs.

Section 22. TERM

The term of this agreement shall begin on January 1, 1984 and end on June 30, 1984.

ENTER INTO LEASES AND EASEMENTS NOT EXCEEDING \$20,000 IN VALUE

Recommendation: that the President or his designated representative be authorized and directed to negotiate and finalize, on behalf of the University of Kentucky any and all leases and easements affecting real property owned by or for the benefit of the University of Kentucky; further, that the President or his designated representative be authorized and directed to negotiate and finalize such leases and easements upon such terms and conditions as the President or his designated representative deems to be in the best interests of the University of Kentucky; provided, however, this authorization shall not include any transactions involving leases and easements the value of which exceeds \$20,000; and that all leases and easements covered by this Resolution shall be reported to the Board of Trustees.

Background: Frequently it is necessary for the University of Kentucky to act with short notice on leases and easements with third parties including utility companies. The procedures for handling these transactions are established under the University Management Bill, House Bill 622, and are very detailed. This authorization will enable the University to handle such matters in a more efficient manner and at the same time protect the interest of the University. This authorization will place the University in compliance with the provisions of House Bill 622. Upon the enactment of this Resolution, the University will conclude a Memorandum of Agreement between the University of Kentucky and the Department of Finance and Administration as it pertains to leases and easements.

UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY ARBORETUM

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees reserve an area of the Lexington Campus of some 94 acres south of Alumni Drive and east of Commonwealth Drive as an arboretum for use in the educational programs of the University.

Background: The Departments of Biological Sciences, Landscape Architecture, and Forestry have asked that the area south of University Drive and east of Commonwealth Drive (see attached map) be used as an arboretum which can serve as a field laboratory over time for their students, for other University students, and for persons in the community and state at large. Walkways and plantings of various kinds including all of the known varieties of trees indigenous to the Commonwealth eventually will be established in this area. The land use plan adopted by the Board of Trustees identifies the acreage specified for the arboretum as an area for "sport and recreation" and for "open space." The use of land proposed for the arboretum is consistent with the current land use plan. The development of the arboretum will take place over future decades, and will proceed as funds become available to the departments and the University for its use. Its development will proceed on a multidisciplinary basis. The concept has been discussed with the adjacent neighborhood association and has its endorsement. No monies are required at this time for the development of the arboretum. In fact, development in the immediate future will be virtually dependent on the contribution of private monies for such a program.
